





Spend a Minute with a Member

Joe Grovenger was born and raised in Lansingburg, NY. He was a star pitcher at Catholic Central High School and went on to play fast pitch softball with teams like the Delmar Merchants and Brockley's Tavern until he was 53.

In 1943, Joe enlisted in the U.S. Army and headed to Camp Bonnieville, WA, along the Canadian border. From there Joe went on to Camp Stoneman in Pittsburgh, CA. Camp Stoneman was a Port of Embarkation for troops returning to the U.S. After a year at Stoneman, Joe left for Europe in August 1944. Headed for Liverpool, England, Joe was hoping to meet up with his brother Bart who was in the Air Corps. Unfortunately, he blew through Liverpool and hopped a train to France with his unit, C Company of the 873rd Quartermaster Battalion.



Charlie Company was a 40 man unit with a very unique morale boosting mission. Charlie Company brought portable showers to the front lines which allowed our soldiers to shower and refresh. Joe's unit would position themselves about a mile from the front line units they were assigned to support. The unit would set up two tents for changing and one text with portable showers. PFC Joe Grovenger was a 50 caliber machine gunner with Charlie Company. He would sit atop a high perch offering cover as the infantrymen showered. You could say he covered their a\$\$es as they showered. Joe's tour brought him through three battles in France and Germany, including the Battle of the Bulge. He protected and supported Patton's Army, the 3rd Army. While General Patton never used one of Charlie Company's showers, Joe did see the General drive by in a Jeep one day. When the war in Europe ended in August 1945 Joe was about 10 miles from the Chez border. He returned to the U.S. through Fort Dix and after a two month furlough, he was discharged on Thanksgiving Day, November 22, 1945.

Joe went on to Siena College on the G.I. Bill and then went to work for the NYS Thruway Authority where he worked as an accountant for 30 years, retiring in 1980. Joe has four children, Donna, Debbie, Joe and Trisha. When asked about his most memorable experience while serving, Joe recalled an eight-hour pass to Paris but refused to elaborate. I guess "What happened in Paris, stays in Paris."
