POST COMMANDER ASKS REVAMP OF BYLAWS TO IMPROVE POST'S ADMINISTRATION

In a sudden and surprise action at the mid-November meeting, Commander Al Greenwood announced the appointment of a 12-man committee headed by Bill Hazel to overhaul the Post's Constitution and Bylaws for the purpose of bringing about better organizational programs for the business and administrative affairs of Blanchard Post. Al read a statement in which he said:

"It has long been recognized that the Post has experienced a tremendous growth in the business aspects of its activities. For the most part the income from that source has been welcomed as an easy means of underwriting the normal Legion programs. But the growth of our business functions has created a number of problems, among which two are of prime importance:

First, it has tended to overshadow and o diminish interest in normal Legion unctions and programs, if for no other eason than the demands it has made on the time and attention of the Commanders and the Post Administrations.

Second, the business functions have been managed with varying degrees of skills and without consistency from one regime to the next. It has become a big business.

To overcome these problems, and to bring the diverse functions into proper perspective, will require a change in our organizational set-up that can only be achieved through drastic changes in our Constitution and Bylaws.

I feel that the time has come to give the membership of the Post the opportunity to decide whether it wants to continue on the present unsatisfactory hit or miss basis or, recognizing the changes that have taken place, to make necessary revisions in our organizational structure that will enable the Post to cope with the problems I have mentioned.

For this purpose, I wish to appoint a Resolutions Committee to undertake a study of the problem and to draft whatever constitutional changes that may be necessary."

The following are named to this committee to work with Chairman Hazel: Judge Advocate George Wenger, Harold Barkhuff, Ralph Butler, George Butman, Otto de Heus, Herbert Drew, Edward Condon, William Johnston, Arnold F. Mosmen, Bill Segur, Joseph Von Ronne.
