LETTER TO THE EDITOR:

THUNDER ON THE RIGHT

In our monthly discourse on matters of concern to all thinking Americans we have included quotations from articles that we think will be interesting to our members, and in most instances express "the other side of the picture", something that we may not always get from the daily press. The following is from just such an article. While we don't expect everyone to agree with it, we know that no one could deny that it is a tremendously powerful summation in capsule form.

"There is a wise old saying that the smartest trick of the Devil is in convincing people that he doesn't exist. That saying has a first cousin that says the Devil can always find willing helpers.

"Those who are so terrified by what they call Thunder on the Right are not as old as the Devil or as wise. In their compulsive need for a cordial togetherness with all men everywhere they naively assume that there is no difference between the hunters and the hunted, between arsonists and the cremated.

"The smartest trick of our Red Fifth Column is in convincing the public that it doesn't exist. And like Old Nick they are finding it easy to enlist willing helpers. But the amazing thing is that while the auxiliary know that this particular devil exists all over the world today, they deny that he exists here. Terrified by the thunder they ignore the lightning.

"They must think our judiciary is hallucinating in bringing to trial on twelve charges in a Federal Court a non-existent organization. They must think the Ben Davises, the Gus Halls and all the rest of the Communist leaders who now claim to be merely 'spokesmen for the Communist Party' are disembodied mouths, voices without bodies.

"But, of course, the substance of this situation is not as it is represented. Thunder on the Right is not at all what the protesting brethren are afraid of. What they fear is that this is not thunder at all, but a gathering lightning mounting to strike. And what we are hearing is their loud announcement in the form of Thunder on the Left.

"Some of the rumbling comes from merchants who deplore their inability to trade with the Communist bloc and who openly envy their Canadian and English companions - in - currency. Some of it comes from hairbrained Hollywood artists who have a hunch that pink will come back into fashion next season. Some of it comes from pharisaical legal Samaritans who can't tell a party from a

plot and who, with Voltaire, will defend the right of anybody but Moise Tshombe to speak his piece in Madison Square Garden. Some of it comes from that strange breed of humble clergymen who are always quietly backing into the limelight and who must always be, like grapefruit, in the public eye. The hot air components of our Thunder on the Left have a complication of causes and origins.

"The psychiatrists have not yet met with their lexicographers to coin the Greek derivative that means 'a morbid fear of conservatives'. But surely this is one phobia curable by eye-surgery quicker than by couching. Let the afflicted really see what is actually going on in a world where the boundaries of freedom are shrinking daily, and in a nation that must annually spend three-quarters of its tax-revenue for military defense, and the noise on the Right which they interpreted as thunder will be recognized for what it is, the sound of concern.

"When they have shed their phobia, they will understand that the Red propaganda machine is re-tooling the word Right for its own uses. And when their memory returns, they will realize that the trick is nothing new for it was successfully turned with other good words like: colonies, liberation, self-determination, peace, negotiation, and freedom."



CHILD WELFARE

In cooperation with the Albany office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Blanchard Post has initiated a program aimed at alerting the elementary school children in the Bethlehem School District against child molesters.

The F.B.I., through Blanchard Legionnaire Bob Margison, sought to have its coloring-contest put into action. This activity calls for the distribution among the students of black on white drawings of situations which the young people are reminded to avoid, such as being stopped by strangers on foot or in automobiles.

To make an impression on youngsters they are to color the pictures. On the merits of the work by the young artists, it was expected prizes might be awarded. Because this program might interfere with their school work, it was decided that the drawings would not be used. Instead, Supervising Principal Hamilton H. Bookhout issued this memorandum to the Elementary School Principals:

The F.B.I. in cooperation with the local American Legion Post is continu-

ing its campaign against child molesters. One very simple educational activity is to impress upon pupils these rules of conduct:

- 1. Turn down gifts from strangers
- 2. Refuse rides offered by strangers
- 3. Avoid dark and lonely streets
- 4. Know your local policeman

I am recommending that all primary teachers develop a teaching unit around these rules in the interest of the safety and welfare of pupils.

Commander Dalton received the following letter from Mr. Bookhout:

"As a follow-up of the conversation with you and Rodger Fryer, I have sent to each elementary principal a copy of the enclosed memorandum. You will observe that it asks teachers to use the four rules suggested by the F.B.I. as the basis for a unit of instruction in our elementary grades. Thank you both for bringing to me the materials and for giving us the opportunity to promote this most worthy activity."
