AN OPEN LETTER

To All BLANCHARD LEGIONNAIRES and AUXILIARY MEMBERS:

It is realized that by the time our 1040 Times is published, the information contained in this letter will have reached the majority of you who live within a fairly large radius of the Post's locale because of an overlapping of membership in clubs and organizations of the area.

A community endeavor, prompted by the inquiries and suggestions of so many friends, townspeople and fellow club members, has been started in the Town and is now well underway. It concerns a project to benefit the son of one of the most dedicated and respected couples of our Legion family, Charlotte and Bill Johnston. Their son, Johnny—now 17 years old, has not regained consciousness since the date of a boating accident last August 3. The medical prognosis indicates the probability of months, and possibly years, of around-the-clock nursing and medical attention in a hospital or similar facility where arrangements can be made for his proper care. Needless to say, the total costs of this for his parents reach staggering proportions.

Their request, in answer to the offers of help extended them, continues to be only for the fervent prayers of all for Johnny's welfare. However, for those of you who wish to help in a material way also, and did not have a previous opportunity, this open letter is to convey the information that an account named "Johnny's Fund" has been opened at the Delmar Branch of the National Commercial Bank and Trust Company.

Voluntary gifts from anonymous donors can be deposited at the bank personally or, if you wish, turned in through your Legion Post or Auxiliary Unit. Through the Legion, cash or checks, made payable to "Johnny's Fund", may be handed or mailed to Dr. Stanley L. Klett, 4 Bradford Place, Slingerlands, N. LEGION AUXILIARY HAS LONG CHRISTMAS SHOPPING LIST

A vast Christmas shopping project is being completed this month by the women of the American Legion Auxiliary at work throughout the state in behalf of disabled war veterans according to Mrs. Herbert Hafley, Rehabilita-tion Chairman of Nathaniel Adams Blanchard Unit No. 1040 of the Delmar Auxiliary.

"Plans for the Gift Shop at Albany Veterans "Plans for the Gift Shop at Albany Veterans Hospital, Monday and Tuesday, December 7 and 8, are now being finalized" Mrs. Hafley continued. "Auxiliary women have long experience in operating these shops. At this hospital, the shop will be set up in the third floor recreation room, with gift articles attractively displayed amid Christmas decorations. The clerks are Auxiliary volunteers, from the Third District, which includes seven counties—Albany, Rensselaer, Columbia, Schocounties—Albany, Rensselaer, Columbia, Scho-harie, Greene, Ulster and Sullivan. Ambulant patients and those in wheel chairs come to the shop to make selections for their families, while hospital carts loaded with gift articles are wheeled to the bedsides of the bedfast.

"There are no cash registers in the Auxiliary shop. Everything is *free* for the sick and the disabled veterans, including gift wrapping and mailing to their homes, and this requires the work of a large staff of Auxiliary volunteers.

"Many of the gift items in the shop are donated by Auxiliary Units, either made or purchased by the Unit. Experience has shown what items are most eagerly sought by veter-ans as gifts for their families.

"While the Auxiliary give Christmas gifts while the Auxiliary give Christmas gifts to the hospitalized veterans themselves, the gift shops are the most appreciated Christmas activity for they give the veterans the joy of Christmas giving."

The public is invited to attend the Gift Shop Open House at the Albany Veterans' Hospital on Sunday, December 6 from 2 to 4 p.m. on the third floor.


