#### IMPORTANT NOTICE

BE IT RESOLVED that paragraph "3." of ARTICLE III of the Constitution and By-Laws of NATHANIEL ADAMS BLANCHARD POST No. 1040 OF THE AMERICAN LEGION, DEPARTMENT OF NEW YORK, INC., which presently reads as follows:

"3. Any officers of the Post may be removed from office for disability, neglect of duty, or for conduct unbecoming a member upon two-thirds vote of the members of the Post Affairs Committee and ratification of their action by two-thirds of the members present at the next regular meeting of the Post held after such action of the Post Affairs Committee. The vacancy created by such action shall be filled by the Post Affairs Committee for the unexpired term of the office so vacated."

be amended to read as follows

"3." Any officer of the Post may be removed from office for disability, neglect of duty, or for conduct unbecoming a member upon two-thirds vote of the members of the Post Affairs Committee and ratification of their action by two-thirds of the members present at the next regular meeting of the Post held after such action of the Post Affairs Committee. The vacancy created by such action or by the death or resignation of any officer shall be filled by the Post Affairs Committee for the unexpired term of the office so vacated.",

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that paragraph "2." of ARTICLE IV of said Constitution and By-Laws which presently reads as follows:

"2. The Commander, and in his absence, the First, Second or Third Vice Commander, in the order named, shall preside at all meetings of the Post and of the Post Affairs Committee. In the event of their absence, such meeting may

elect their presiding officer.", be amended to read as follows

"2. The Commander, and in his absence any Vice Commander, shall preside at all meetings of the Post and of the Post Affairs Committee. In the event of their absence, such meeting may elect their presiding officer."

This resolution will be presented at the first Post meeting in December and voted on at the second monthly meeting of December, 1970.

#### QUORUM


