We continue by noting that the efforts of the Commission are educational in nature and embrace specific objectives as follows:

- (1) To promote understanding of the principles of democratic government.
- (2) To give sound, practical service in our communities.
 - (3) To emphasize religion.
 - (4) To encourage education.
- (5) To work for the youth of America by sponsoring baseball, oratorical contests, Boys State, Boys Nation and Boy Scouts.

- (6) To work for the assimilation of aliens.
- (7) To combat subversion and all un-American groups and activities having as their aim the destruction of democracy in America.

The characteristic which distinguishes our form of government from others is the recognition of the truth that the inherent and fundamental rights of men are derived from God and not from governments, dictators or majorities. These inalienable rights are: Freedom of Worship, Freedom of Speech and Press, Freedom of Assemblage, Freedom to Work, Freedom to Enjoy the Fruits of One's Labor. Upon these basic principles the whole structure of our form of government was established by our foreto be continued fathers.


