At the National Convention of the American Legion last year it was determined that the per capita dues for each American Legion member was to be increased. For Blanchard Post this means that of the \$5 dues each member pays only \$1.50 remains with the Post. The major portion, or \$3.50, has to go forward to help support the upper echelons — County, State and National — of the American Legion and its programs. This program includes the AMERICAN LEGION MAGAZINE, maintenance of the Department and National Headquarters, legislative work in Washington; services for veterans, youth and civic advances; Americanism; Mountain Camp and the

myrias of other "Good of the Legion" activities.

To make a determination as to what action Blanchard Post should follow in this rise-of-living trend, Comdr. Fryer has named a five-man committee to make a study of the situation. Chairman for the committee is Vice Comdr. and Membership Chairman Charles J. O'Hara. Serving on the committee with him are: Ed Costigan, Al Greenwood, Hank Voorhees and George Wenger.

This committee is charged with the responsibility of preparing a report on this subject to be submitted to the Post in March.

RANDOM THOUGHTS ON MEMBERSHIP

We have been extremely heartened by the response to this years membership renewal campaign. However we cannot make this years, or any years quota, without a sizable number of new members. This, of course, is occasioned by the annual loss of members who do not renew because they may have relocated, or for other reasons. What we have been leading up to is that, as of now, we need some new members. And don't forget that a reinstatement of a former member is just as good.

There is now, as you know, a sizable financial obligation outstanding as a result of our recent remodeling program. In what better, and least painful way, can each of us cooperate in the effort to meet this debt than by sustaining, and even increasing our present membership level?
