EATING-OUTS TO AID POST

What is expected to serve as a money-raiser for the Post and to bring fruitful returns to the purchasers is a Diners' Guide program which has been o.k.'d by the Post Affairs Committee. The originator of the idea for the Post is Harold Barkhuff. Ken Jopp has been named Chairman of the program by Post Commander Rodger Fryer. "This program has served well for Jay Cees and other similar groups in other communities and I am sure it will work for us", Rodger said when telling of the idea.

The operation of the program is simple enough. It calls for the participation by a selected half-dozen eating establishments which will formally allow the use of their restaurants in the program. Securing these participating restaurants' acceptances will be the heaviest burden of the program. This organizing work rests with Ken. When the selected restaurants have been chosen and have agreed to participate, their names, with appropriate advertising notes, will be printed in booklets of which it is planned to make up a thousand for the initial issue.

These booklets, each containing a half-dozen tickets naming the six selected restaurants, will be sold at \$3.00 each. The purchaser will then be entitled to patronize each of these restaurants with a guest and order one meal to a maximum cost of \$4.00 and will be served two meals but will be only required to pay the \$4.00 for the single meal. The ticket in the booklet covers the payment for the second meal.

The \$3.00 which the purchaser pays for the booklet goes to the Post Building Fund. The advertising value given the restaurants for their participation by allowing use of their names and for the matching dinners is their return in this program.

Instructions in the booklet will advise: "Each coupon in the book entitles the guest of the purchaser to a free meal equal in value (but not to exceed \$4.00) to the meal purchased by the holder of the book. This amount, \$4.00 maximum, may also be applied toward the cost of a more expensive meal.

- 1. \$3.00 per book, one book per person.
- 2. This book and coupons are not transferable.

- At the time the coupon is used the purchaser shall sign it on the reverse side.
- 4. Alcoholic beverages and gratuities are not included in this agreement.
- 5. Unless otherwise specified the coupons are valid from (date) to (date).

A three-months period for the sale and use of the Diners Guide will be scheduled after the restaurants' participation has been received. A thank you note to the participating restaurants will be printed on the inside back cover of the books when they are printed. It will read: "Deepest appreciation is extended to the restaurants who have cooperated with us to make this Guide possible. Funds from this book sale will be used for our Building Fund."

Working with Ken Jopp on this program will be Ed Costigan who will arrange for the printing and distribution of the booklets. Ed looks forward to forming a committee of Post members through whom the booklets will be made available for purchase by members of the Post and to non-members who would wish to take advantage of this fundraising and money-saving program — (for where else can one get \$24.00 worth of dinners for \$3.00?).



Commander Fryer joins with Chairman O'Hara in saying: "This meeting on March 4 will be a very important one. To some extent the future of Blanchard Post will be affected by the determinations which come as a result of the views expressed at this meeting. I urge every Blanchard Legionnaire who can do so to come to the Post at 8:30 on Monday night, March 4th."
