The situation resulting from the lack of pure water in villages and communities in rural Ecuador is deplorable, bringing disaster to human beings, livestock and crops alike. Diseases caused by contaminated water claim many lives each year. "Pennies for Pumps for Pan America" is the slogan adopted by the Auxiliary for this worthy program.

With spring just around the corner, Ruth Jorgensen, Poppy chairman, will be ordering the 2,600 Poppies voted for in January. Many volunteers are needed in order to make this annual project the grand success we want it to be.
