### **SALUTE TO TROOP 58**

At the March 2nd Post Meeting the formal presentment of the Charter for the current year of Boy Scout Troop 58, which is sponsored by Blanchard Post, was made to Commander Dick Dalton.

Serving as master-of-ceremonies for the program was our Post Scout Chairman Larry McArthur. He outlined the programs in which the Troop participates in the Fort Orange-Uncle Sam Area Council. The emphasis, he pointed out, is on physical fitness of the young lads and the training of them for better citizens in both the woods and in the community.

Troop 58 had its initial charter on November 8, 1920. Blanchard Post has been its sponsor for most, if not all, of the time our Post has been in existence. Blanchard Post was founded in 1931.

Larry introduced Ken Bauer who told of the recent re-organization of the troop which happens every so often because its members grow out of it. Making the presentation of the Charter to Commander Dalton was George Simmons an ex-Scoutmaster of Troop 58 who is now a Neighborhood Commissioner for the Boy Scouts of America.

Our Troop 58 now has 21 Scouts. The Scoutmaster is Francis G. Denson with Assistant Scoutmasters Russell E. Johnson and Allen G. LaPierre. The Troop Committee Chairman is Allan Raymond.
