A REMINDER

We would like to remind our members, who have not done so, to look up their serial number and have it in an available place for their next of kin. Upon their death the undertaker may need it for the following reasons:

1. American Flag to drape casket of veteran, after which it may be given to next of kin or close friend or associate of the deceased.
2. Burial in National Cemeteries: the grave site and actual interment, including opening, closing, and marking the grave, provided without charge.
3. Reimbursement of Burial Expense: payment, not to exceed \$250.00 toward veteran's burial expenses.
4. Headstone or Grave Marker: the headstone or grave marker is provided without charge. If interment is in a National Cemetery, eligibility for a headstone or grave marker is automatically established.
