NEWS FROM NATIONAL HEADQUARTERS

★ National Commander Wm. J. Rogers has urged the 2.7 million members of The American Legion to contact their elected representatives in Washington concerning the status of current negotiations on the Panama Canal and Canal Zone. The Legion chief returned to the United States on March 8, from an inspection of the Canal Zone area.

★ The National Commander has also sent a telegram to Congressman William Chappell, Jr. (Fla.), a member of the House Appropriations Committee, indicating the Legion's support of "accelerated construction of nuclear powered vessels to replace those ships which are now obsolete." The Florida congressman led the fight for the Nimitz carrier. ★ In an article in the March 6, 1977, edition of the New York Times, James M. Naughton comments on the extraordinary effectiveness of legislative action

by The American Legion and other veterans groups, especially with regard to such matters as "pensions, education grants and medical treatment—and the structure of federal agencies providing them."

★ Crime is a problem — everybody's problem — and because it is everybody's problem, all Americans have a responsibility to do something about crime by resisting it, the FBI told The Legion, through its Crime Resistance Tips.

* National Commander Rogers has sent the following telegram to the President: "The American Legion continues to oppose any blanket pardon, blanket amnesty or blanket upgrading of discharges for convicted military offenders and military deserters. We strongly urge that the military services conduct reviews on a case-by-case basis using existing administrative and judicial procedures."
