MEET CHARLES BUTLER

With so many of our veterans in VA Hospitals having no relatives and few friends, the American Legion Auxiliary has started a new program this year entitled "Adopt a Veteran." Under this program the Unit is given the name of a veteran who needs more friendships to brighten his life. They want people to stop in and say "Hi" whenever possible, send cards on special occasions and do whatever else they can to make the veteran a little happier. Each Unit is asked to participate in this and as usual our Blanchard Auxiliary has complied.

Our "Adopted Veteran" is Charles Butler. "Charlie," as he is known to all in the VA, is 82 years old and a native of Troy where he worked in a printing plant. He likes baseball but is unable to read or write. Charlie has no relatives and is very depressed. He just sits in his room day after day by himself unless he goes down the hall to the dining room to eat. He never talks to the other patients or watches the tv. Charlie is in a wheelchair crippled with arthritis and is in constant pain. He cannot walk and has to be lifted into his bed. He never sleeps the entire night through but keeps waking up from the pain.

Blanchard Auxiliary adopted Charlie in November. At our Christmas Party, \$46.48 was collected and we purchased 3 shirts, 3 pairs of socks, slippers and a

lap robe. Diane Grasser took these to him on Christmas Day with a box of fresh fruit. There were tears of joy and "what wonderful ladies" was his reply.

At the Auxiliary's January meeting, Isabelle Greenwood had a delicious cake for refreshments and sold the recipe for 15¢ each and \$2.35 was realized for our Charlie. Cards have been sent by members on Valentine Day and we hope on all the coming holidays. Charlie's birthday is December 9. He is visited each week by a member but anyone who is in or near the VA and has a few spare minutes, please stop in Room 419A and say "Hi." When the picture was taken he was asked to smile for all the nice ladies at Blanchard Post (as you can see, our Charlie loves women). We have a very lonesome veteran, so how about us all doing a little something to cheer him up.
