MEMORIAL DAY PARADE

Town of Bethlehem's annual Memorial Day Parade and ceremonies this year is under the direction of Robert E. Mulligan, recently retired as a colonel from the U. S. Army Reserve. He is now continuing his military career by contributing his time and effort, without pay, in the New York State Guard which is being placed in readiness in the event the New York Army National Guard is summoned to active federal service.

Chairman Mulligan has appointed Bethlehem Central School Board Member Whitman Daniels the Grand Marshall for the parade. Whit's aides will be Bill Hazell and Bob Roth. Whitman is a Lieut-Comdr. in the USNR-R (R for ready) and is the 3rd Naval District's local representative for the Naval Reserve. His war-years was with the Bureau of Aeronautics during which time he was in charge of the Naval aviation publication "Wings". He is a past vice-commander and membership chairman of Blanchard Post. He was the former commanding officer of the Albany USNR Public Relations Company in which Bill Hazell is currently a Lieut-Comdr. Bill was also a former vice-commander of our Post. Aide Bob Roth, an insurance-man, is relatively new in the Post. He is a Major in the Air Force Reserve and was formerly a Deputy Director of Selective Service for New York State.

First Division in the Parade formation will be headed by Post Commander Alexander J. Woehrle as Marshall and his aides will be Vice Comdr. Rodger Fryer and Charles J. O'Hara. They will be followed by Post Members and the Auxiliary.

The second division of the Parade will have the military. The Marshall will be Capt. Francis Cullen of Company A, 1st Medium Tank Battalion, 210th Armored Regiment of the New York Army National Guard. With his company of Guardsmen it was hoped that Army Tanks could be in the line of march. However, it was reported that N. Y. State Dept. of Public Works restrictions of oversized vehicles on the highway on the holiday prevents this feature of the parade.

The VFW and Service clubs will form the 3rd Division with Comdr. Ralph Sherman as the Marshall and his aides will be Vice Comdrs. Joseph Cozz and Joseph Grieco.

The Boy Scouts, Girls Scouts, Brownies, Cubs, and 4-H will make up the Fourth Division. Division Marshall will be Larry McArthur, a leader of the Boy Scouts program in our Town. Larry, a colonel in the Air Force Reserve is a brother officer of Bob Roth in the Albany Selective Service Section of the Reserves.

Mrs. Fred Muchelot will be Marshall for the Girl Scouts and Brownies in the Division. Mrs. John Zitko will lead the 4-H.

Fire Chief Richard Smith of Elsmere is slated for Marshall of Division 5 which has the Town's Fire Departments with their vehicles and fire-fighters. Aides to Chief Smith will be Chiefs Robert Collins of Slingerlands and Henry Kleinke of Delmar. Walt Waterbury will lead a detachment of the Cyprus Temple Motor Patrol.

Marching airs for the parade will be furnished by the Fort Crailo Legion Band, Delmar Fire Fifers, Bethlehem Central High School Band among others.

Present plans for this year's Parade call for a halt at the Bethlehem Cemetery graveside of our Post's namesake, Nathaniel Adams Blanchard for appropriate Memorial Services. These will include prayers by Chaplain Charles Kaulfuss, placing of wreaths by Post Commander Al Woehrle and Auxiliary President Christine Barkhuff, a volley of fire by the Post Firing Squad headed by Dick Lenseth and bugler's taps.

Finalizing of the Memorial Day Parade and Services will take place at a meeting of the parademarshall Chairman Mulligan has called for Monday, May 14 at 9 p.m.

Chairman Mulligan has two urgent appeals to make to all Blanchard Legionnaires: first, make it your effort to participate in the parade by being among the marchers. If you have your active-duty uniform wear it. If not, wear your Legion cap and if you have no Legion cap, order it in time for the parade. Secondly, remember to encourage respect for the Stars and Stripes by saluting or, if you prefer, remove your hat as the Flag passes.
