KOREA VET HERO TO BE GRAND MARSHAL

To do honor to the Veterans of the Korean War, Blanchard Post this year selected a holder of two Bronze Stars to be the Grand Marshal for the annual Town of Bethlehem Memorial Day Parade. Named to this distinctive assignment is Hugh W. Stowers of Wellington Road in Elsmere.

"As far as we know," said Commander O'Hara in announcing the Stowers appointment, "this is the first time a Korean Vet has had this honor in our Town Parade. Legionnaire Stowers at the head of this parade focuses the reverence with which we remember not only the memory of the Veterans who died in the great wars of our Nation but also in those

terrible so-called conflicts such as Korea—and now Viet Nam. Whether war, or so-called conflict or police action the cause is the same. The cause of peace."

It was 14 years ago on April 30 that Hugh Stowers became a G.I. in the U.S. Army. A native of Centralia, Missouri, he found himself an Army mechanic with the Third Infantry Division. In the fall of 1952 near Heartbreak Ridge in Korea he was with the Second Battalion of the Seventh Regiment. For holding the line for three cruel and battle-weary days his outfit won the Distinguished Unit Citation.

Hugh, like most honored men of war, is reluctant to tell you about his two Bronze Stars. Of his Purple Heart decoration, he remembers it was near Yon Chon, Korea. He was towing a G.I. truck back to the motor pool when the Gooks zeroed in on him. Next he recalls regaining consciousness several days later in an Army Hospital. His other medals include the Combat Infantry Badge, the Korean Service Medal and the United Nations Service Medal.

His wife is the former Joan Schmitz of Albany. Hugh met her in Missouri and they came East to make their home in our town. They have an eight-year-old daughter, Lynn. Hugh is employed by the Armory Garage in Albany.

This past year Stowers was the Post Sergeant-at-Arms, an elective office. He also served as chairman of the Sick Call and Relief Committee. He has also been active in many other of the Post's working committees.

Chairman Ballantine

Making the arrangements for the parade this year is Bob Ballantine, recently retired from the U.S. Army. Bob reports that the program for this year's march will generally be the same as other years.

When Grand Marshal Stowers steps off at 10:00 a.m., he will have as his aides, Blanchard Post Vice Commander, Ed Costigan, and a representative of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, Earle B. Williams.

There will be five or more divisions. The division commanders are being instructed to have their units commence forming at 9:30 a.m. in the vicinity of Blanchard Post headquarters.

YOU AND YOUR VOTE

Article XII of the By-Laws of our Post states:

"1. The Post officers and members of the Board of Directors shall be elected at each annual meeting of the Post.

"2. The candidates for election shall be nominated in the following manner: At the regular monthly meeting preceding the annual election the nominating committee appointed by the Commander shall present one or more names for each office and for members of the Board of Directors and Delegates and Alternates to the County Committee. Other names may be placed in nomination from the floor after the nominating committee's report is received.

"3. These names shall be presented for election by ballot at the annual meeting.

"4. The candidate receiving the highest vote for any office shall be declared elected to that office.

"5. Should a tie vote be cast for any office, a new vote shall be taken until the election is decided."

The Nominating Committee will make its report at the first monthly meeting in May. The Annual Meeting with election of the officers will be at the mid-May meeting. As an interested Legionnaire, you are urged to attend this meeting to cast your vote or let your thoughts be known.

The First Division will have Blanchard Post Colors and the Color Guard, Post Commander, Charles J. O'Hara, and the marching members of Blanchard Post. For his aides, Commander O'Hara will have Vice Commander George Reeber and Adjutant Joseph L. Cannizarro. The Post Auxiliary is in the First Division.

A New York Army National Guard section will be the Second Division. The Bethlehem Memorial Post of the V.F.W. and its Auxiliary is the Third Division. In the Fourth Division this year it is expected the Bethlehem Lodge of Elks will have a marching unit.

Another division will have the Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts and 4-H Clubs of the community. The last division will be the motorized elements consisting of the Fire Department vehicles while the Volunteers and their Auxiliaries will "foot it".

Bethlehem Police Chief Peter Fish and his department are working closely with Chairman Ballantine in the preparation of traffic controls, police escort and the patrolling the line of march.

Graveside Ceremony

After Grand Marshal Stowers moves out at 10 a.m. from Poplar Drive and the Post Headquarters, the parade will proceed east on Elsmere Avenue. About five minutes later the head of the parade will pause at it turns south on Kenwood Avenue for the graveside ceremony honoring Nathaniel Adams Blanchard, for whom our Post is named. Marchers in the First Division usually have a good view of this ceremony. This is the third year the parade has stopped for the ceremony. It is expected a larger group of spectators will be on hand to watch these proceedings. Blanchard Post Chaplain, Charles H. Kaulfuss will conduct the ceremony. At his side will be Post Commander O'Hara, Adjutant Cannizarro,

Auxiliary President Irene White and the Post's Firing Squad, directed by Past Commander Dick Lenseth. The Post's Color Guard will also leave the parade formation to stand at the graveside. A bugler will sound the ceremonial taps.

Continuing the parade it will go to the Four Corners and then turn north on Delaware Avenue to Memorial Park. Here the Grand Marshal, with Honorary Grand Marshal, Town Supervisor, and a Past Post Commander, Bert Kohinke, and the Division Commanders will review the parade as it comes to a close.

When the parade is over, a memorial ceremony will be conducted by Post Commander O'Hara at Memorial Park. Participating in the program will be the V.F.W. and the Elks. Floral pieces will be formally placed at the flag pole in the park, the Flag will be raised and lowered to half-mast and taps will be sounded after a volley is fired by the Post's Firing Squad. Prayers will be spoken by Father Kaulfuss of St. Stephen's and by Father Bondi of St. Thomas.

Salute the Flag

Parade Chairman Ballantine calls on all Blanchard Legionnaires in the Post area who are not in some other division of the parade, to march with their Posts in the First Division. If you have a Legion cap, wear it. If you need a Legion cap and don't know where to buy it, contact Adjutant Cannizarro. "Most important," says Bob Ballantine, "if you are watching this parade or *any* parade, and the American Flag is paraded by, come to attention and give a salute."
