May 19 will be "Poppy Day" for the Blanchard Legion Auxiliary members. On this day the members will be selling poppies for the veterans in the veterans hospitals. The Vietnam veterans are coming into our VA Hospitals, in addition to World War I, World War II, and Korean veterans in need of assistance. The poppies have been made by the veterans and offered to the men, women, and children of America to be worn in

honor of the Nation's war dead since 1918. The poppy program begins each year in the summer or fall when disabled veterans start making the flowers in government hospitals and special convalescent workshops maintained by the Auxiliary. In the following months these men are given profitable employment shaping the red memorial flowers.

Manufacturing poppies aids the veteran both financially and psychologically. They are paid for the work they do regardless of any government compensation they might be receiving, and the job itself is a relief from long hours spent in a hospital ward. For many, it is the only opportunity to earn money during the year.


