Sense and Nonsense

The increase in the number of pedalpushers is bringing with it a greater number of bicycle injuries. Last year, more than 10 million bikes were soldand more than one million cyclists were injured. According to the National Safety Council, collisions between bicycles and motor vehicles caused about 34,000 injuries in 1972. The National Transportation Safety Board estimates that deaths from these mishaps are now topping 800 annually. Other surveys attribute another 45 to 80 deaths a year to bicycle accidents not involving a motor vehicle. Most of the injuries or deaths occur in the 5- to 14-year-old group, but with more and more adults joining the cycling brigade (4 million adults bought bikes for themselves last year), there is likely to be an increase in their death toll as well. The NTSB says one important safety factor that may help to stop injury is to fit "the bicycle to the operator, especially his or her ability to touch the ground while seated."

MEMORIAL DAY PARADE SLATED AT BETHLEHEM

Plans for the 1973 Bethlehem Memorial Day Parade, being held on Monday, May 28, have been completed.

The parade which begins at 10 a.m. sharp from Blanchard Legion Post home at Elsmere Avenue and Poplar Drive, will include civic groups, Bethlehem's six fire companies, and Bethlehem Tomboy Girl's Softball League, which was New York State's Champions last year.

The parade chairman will be Oliver Palmer. William Johnston will act as grand marshal. Aides will be Vietnam veterans William Blanchard, Jr. and Bill Vogel. Bethlehem Supervisor Bertram E. Kohinke will serve as honorary grand marshal.

All paraders are invited back to the Post Rooms following the parade for refreshments of which William Blanchard, Sr. will be the chairman.
