



EXPRESS YOURSELF

At our request the Bethlehem Central School Board has deferred until their May 8 meeting their action on adopting the "Discipline Policy" statement to wit:

"Standards of discipline are to be established to assist in securing appropriate levels of control for the maintenance of the most effective learning environment, free of unwarranted distraction; it is the responsibility of all who interact (including parents) in the schooling process to assist in providing and maintaining this environment.

"Self-discipline is the ideal, and the development of it shall be an integral part of the school experience. However, when a student loses self-control to the extent that his/her actions or inactions are detrimental to the learning or welfare of others in the school, a means of

control must be utilized. Such means should be well thought out so that the discipline is of benefit to those involved and provides an additional learning experience.

"Disciplinary efforts in the form of punishment must always relate to the magnitude of the offense except that corporal punishment is prohibited. This does not preclude the use of minimal force when a staff member can reasonably conclude that force is necessary to maintain control or to protect self, others or property."

To show our appreciation of their recognition of our concern about our school system, Blanchard Post Legionnaires in this School District are urged to make their sentiments known to the School Board directly.
