Taps more than a bugle in the distance

If any of you have ever been to a military funeral in which taps was played; this brings out a new meaning of it. Here is something Every American should know.

We in the United States have all heard the haunting song, 'Taps...' It's the song that gives us the lump in our throats and usually tears in our eyes. But, do you know the story behind the song? If not, I think you will be interested to find out about its humble beginnings.

Reportedly, it all began in 1862 during the Civil War, when Union Army Captain Robert Elli was with his men near Harrison's Landing in Virginia. The Confederate Army was on the other side of the narrow strip of land. During the night, Captain Elli heard the moans of a soldier who lay severely wounded on the field. Not knowing if it was a Union or Confederate soldier, the Captain decided to risk his life and bring the stricken man back for medical attention. Crawling on his stomach through the gunfire, the Captain reached the stricken soldier and began pulling him toward his encampment.

When the Captain finally reached his own lines, he discovered it was actually a Confederate soldier, but the soldier was dead. The Captain lit a lantern and suddenly caught his breath and went numb with shock. In the dim light, he saw the face of the soldier. It was his own son. The boy had been studying music in the South when the war broke out. Without telling his father, the boy enlisted in the Confederate Army. The following morning, heartbroken, the father asked permission of his superiors to give his son a full military burial, despite his enemy status.

His request was only partially granted. The Captain had asked if he could have a group of Army band members play a funeral dirge for his son at the funeral. The request was turned down since the soldier was a Confederate. But, out of respect for the father, they did say they could give him only one musician. The Captain chose a bugler. He asked the bugler to play a series of musical notes he had found on a piece of paper in the pocket of the dead youth's uniform. This wish was granted. The melody, we now know as 'Taps' used at military funerals was born.

The words are:

*Day is done. Gone the sun. From the lakes. From the hills.
From the sky. All is well. Safely rest. God is nigh.
Fading light. Dims the sight. And a star. Gems the sky.
Gleaming bright. From afar. Drawing nigh. Falls the night.
Thanks and praise. For our days. Neath the sun.
Neath the stars. Neath the sky. As we go. This we know.
God is nigh.*

I too have felt the chills while listening to 'Taps' but I have never seen all the words to the song until now. I didn't even know there was more than one verse. I also never knew the story behind the song and I didn't know if you had either so I thought I'd pass it along.

I now have an even deeper respect for the song than I did before. Remember those lost and harmed while serving their country. Also remember those who have served and returned; and for those presently serving in the Armed Forces.

Merle Oliver has been an active member of the N.A. Blanchard Post for over 47 years. Currently serving as Post Chaplain, Merle has also served as Vice Commander and ran the 20-Week Club. He was born in Albany, educated in the Albany Public Schools and graduated with a degree in Accounting from the Albany Business College. After college Merle served 3½ years in the Army.

He attended basic training at Ft. Dix where he received training as a medical technician. He entered the Army Medical Corps. and served his tour of duty in Australia, New Guinea and Manila. With his degree in accounting Merle was assigned administrative management duties of running an Army hospital. He recalls how poor the people of New Guinea were and how grateful the children were when U.S. soldiers would hand out candy to them. While in New Guinea, Merle and his comrades were deployed to find a missing G.I. in the jungle. While searching for the G.I. they encountered a tribe of natives who assisted them by cutting down trees and bushes and built them a raised hut to take shelter in. It was amazing to what them wield their machetes to slash vines and brush.

Merle returned to Albany in December 1945 and went to work at the family business, Oliver's Filling Station. His dad operated the Mobil Station on Second Avenue in Albany and Merle worked there for over 20 years with his brothers Norman and Clarence. (See old-time photos inside this issue) At 47 he semi-retired and then began driving a school bus in Bethlehem for 15 years.

Merle met his wife Miriam on a blind date. They moved to Bethlehem in 1951. They were married for 63 years when she passed away in September 2010. They have three children; Bruce, a retired police officer, Nancy, the current Received of Taxes in Bethlehem and Gary, a business entrepreneur.

Some of Merle's best memories are of the German Nights at the post. The Bavarian Bands that came up from the Catskill's were just wonderful. He also recalls Gus Williams' Italian Nights that required firm reservations because they often sold out. Merle enjoys bicycling and swimming, talk radio, politics, high school sports, his family and the Blanchard Post. He sings in the Bethlehem Senior Chorus.
