MAD ABOUT MAUD

Mrs. Herbert E. Hafley, 12 Dumbarton Drive, Elsmere, will be honored by Nathaniel Adams Blanchard, Unit #1040, American Legion Auxiliary, at a testimonial dinner on Saturday, June 16, at the Post Rooms at 7:00 p.m.

Mrs. Hafley has been a member of Blanchard Unit thirty years, has served twice as Unit president, the first time in 1933-34 and again in 1957-58, as Albany County Chairman 1934-35, Third District Chairman 1935-37, Department Vice President 1937-39 and Department President 1939-40.

In the Unit she has been active on many committees and for the past several years has been the Rehabilitation Chairman. In Rehabilitation, she has stressed service in the Veterans' hospitals by donating cigarettes to an adopted ward at Sunmount Hospital, Tupper Lake; by presenting gifts at Christmas of \$1.00 or canteen books to hospitalized veterans, and cooperating in the Christmas Gift Shop.

She was the Gift Shop chairman at the Albany VA Hospital in 1951 and has served again as the chairman in recent years. This is a shop set up by the Auxiliary units from seven counties in the Third District, and every patient may choose gifts for members of his family. If veterans are unable to come to the Gift Shop, carts are taken to their bedside so that they, too, may make a choice of gifts. All gifts are wrapped by Auxiliary members in beautiful Christmas wrappings, and sent out by parcel post, all free of charge to the patients. In a hospital, such as the Albany VA, which has a 1,000-bed capacity, this is one of the largest programs of the American Legion Auxiliary, and here, as always, Maud has done a tremendous job!

At the present time, Maud is giving many hours at the hospital as a volunteer worker and in March of this year was presented an award for having served 1,000 hours.

She has served, too, as Veterans' Administration Voluntary Service Alternate and this year was appointed V.A.V.S. Representative. In this capacity, she arranges for bingo parties, birthdays, 10th floor dances and distribution of cigarettes, by posts from out of state.

Maud has also been Empire Girls' State Chairman, which is a program designed to give to selected New York State high school girls intensive training in democratic leadership. Girls chosen must be high school juniors and are selected for outstanding work in leadership and sportsmanship. In 1941, Maud's daughter Ruth, was the first girl chosen to represent Blanchard Auxiliary at Empire Girls' State at Russell Sage College.

Maud was the Department Convention Chairman at Troy in 1937 and last July, in Albany, was again Department Convention Chairman and was commended for an outstanding convention, when every detail was carefully thought through, making it a most enjoyable convention.

This year, at Department Convention, to be held at New York City, in August, she will serve as Convention Chairman of Resolutions.

Maud is the mother of four children: three daughters — Mrs. D. W. Kesler (Jane), Mrs. Lee R. Stoner (Ruth), Mrs. Charles Hinds (Lois), and a son, Herbert E. Hafley.

She is a Past Matron, Onesquethaw Chapter, Order of the Eastern Star; is active in the First Methodist Church of Delmar; and is a full-time employee in the Division of Military and Naval Affairs, Executive Department, State of New York.
