ADVISORY GROUP FOR NEW COMMANDER

As one of his last official acts in office. Past Commander Charles O'Hara named an Advisory Committee, consisting of himself as chairman, with Past Commanders George Butman, Rodger Fryer and Al Woehrle, to review current Post programs and activities and make recommendations to the new commander. Charlie felt that, as a result of the experiences of his term in office, there was a very definite need to establish such a standing committee to assist successive commanders, and to provide a greater degree of continuity and direction to continuing programs. In addition, he believes that some basic Legion programs are not being promoted while others need strengthening.

Commander Ed Costigan has expressed complete agreement that such a review is needed and welcomed the opportunity to inaugurate his term by continuing the

committee.

The first project to come up for preview is the suggestion made by Al Woehrle that some thought and action be given to providing recognition by Blanchard Legionnaires for the men and women of the armed forces serving in Viet Nam and other areas where combat occurs.

We hope to have more to report on this in our next issue of the 1040 TIMES (in September). *Note:* The Committee is not an inner sanctum. It welcomes suggestions from the membership.

SYMBOL OF POPPIES

Disabled war veterans working in hospitals and convalescent workrooms in many parts of the country made the millions of memorial poppies which were worn in honor of the war dead last month according to Mrs. Given S. Hynds, our Poppy Chairman of Blanchard Unit No. 1040, of the American Legion Auxiliary in Delmar.

More than 6,000 veterans of three wars have been given employment by the Auxiliary in its poppy-making work this year. The number of the little red flowers made is expected to exceed 20,000,000. Earnings of the veterans making poppies who are the only paid workers in the poppy program, were about at \$300,000.

The poppies are shaped from crepe paper with wire stems, and resemble closely the European wild poppy which bloomed in the battle fields and cemeteries of the first World War in France and Belgium.

"Our Auxiliary Unit had a corps of volunteer workers distributing these memorial flowers on the streets and shopping centers all day on Poppy Day — May 12. These workers carried coin boxes to receive contributions for the Auxiliary's work with the disabled vet-

erans and needy children of veterans. We are grateful to everyone who wore a poppy to honor the war dead and contributed to help these living victims of war," Mrs. Hynds said.

Mrs. Hynds organized her corps of volunteer Poppy Day workers among whom were wives of World War II veterans able to give from an hour or two to all day to the work. Some were older women from World War I families who have been Poppy Day volunteers for many years.
