AN EDITORIAL:

FOR GOD AND COUNTRY

The continuing and persistent attack directed against our government's Viet Nam policy has droned on belaboring our senses cluttering our news media to where it is now at the boring stage. The attempt to confuse the American people has been discredited to the tune of about 99-44/100%, by any honest estimate. The people have demonstrated once again that they will not be deluded by charlatans, montebanks and clowns, whether masquerading as newsmen or clergymen. They have shown themselves much more knowledgable, intelligent and analytical than the Fulbrights, Morses, Lippmans, Restons, Severeids, Childs, fuzzy-speaking college professors and assorted kooks, would have us believe.

We now have the same animals in different garments. No further comment!
