



REHAB CORNER

PENSION LEGISLATION: The American Legion Legislative staff has been assured by the Committees in both Houses of the Congress concerned with pension that legislation will be considered this year in time to provide relief for VA pensioners who otherwise might suffer reduction in their pensions next January because of the 15 percent increase in Social Security benefits already approved. One reason for waiting until later this year to perfect a pension bill is that further amendments to the Social Security law are presently under study which could result in an additional increase this year in SS benefits ranging up to 5 percent for many veterans and widows. When these problems are resolved the Congress will proceed to deal with the pension question.

NATIONAL SERVICE LIFE INSUR-ANCE: The Veterans Administration urged some 667,000 veterans to take a close look at their term life insurance policies when they become due for renewal this year. Administrator Johnson said veterans with five-year level premium term policies should check their insurance needs to determine whether to convert to a permanent plan policy. He added that an additional 932,000 fiveyear level premium term policies will reach their renewal dates next year. He said five-year term insurance serves well the purpose for which it was intendedto provide adequate, low-cost life insurance for a specified period of time. He pointed out, however, that since term insurance premiums are based on age, they go up every five years and become very costly in later years. "For example" the VA Administrator explained, "the premium for a \$10,000 term life insurance policy for a 20-year-old serviceman or veteran would be \$6.50 a month. At age 60 the same premium would rise to \$26.00 a month, and at age 70, the cost would be \$61.80 a month." On the other hand, the veteran who converts his term insurance to a permanent plan enjoys the advantage of paying a fixed premium on a policy which has a cash and loan value, and paid up and extended insurance values. Term insurance has no cash or loan value, and the longer a veteran delays in converting to a permanent plan, the higher the premiums will be. The VA Chief stressed that each veteran must make his own decision as to which insurance plan best fits his needs during specific periods in his life. It is well to bear in mind that most veterans must adjust to reduced income during the later stages of life, whole premiums for term insurance continue to rise.

DISABILITY COMPENSATION: S 3341 was introduced early in the year by Senators Talmadge (Ga.), Cranston (Cal.) and Yarborough (Tex.). This bill would increase the monthly payment to the totally disabled from \$400 to \$450 effective in July. Ratings ranging from 10 to 90 percent would be raised about 11 percent. The proposed legislation would also increase the family dependency allowance payable to veterans rated 50 percent or more disabled, and, under limited circumstances, would presume disabilities of former POW's to be service-connected unless VA can show otherwise by clear and convincing evidence. In documenting the bill, the portion pertaining to increased family allowance was inadvertently left out, so a new Senate bill (S 3348) covering all the above items was introduced. On March 18, National Rehabilitation Director, Edward H. Golembieski, accompanied by Assistant National Legislative Director, Charles E. Mattingly, testified in vigorous support of this bill and two House Bills (10106 and 10912) dealing with this and related subjects. VA requested deferment until it completes its own study on rate increases.
