JUNE: THE MONTH OF THE AMERICAN FLAG

Flag Day, June 14, commemorates the date on which the Continental Congress in 1777 passed a resolution adopting the Stars and Stripes as the official FLAG OF THE UNITED STATES. The origins of Flag Day go back to 1877, when the government requested that the Flag be flown from all public buildings to celebrate the 100th anniversary of its adoption. The National Flag Day Bill, officially designating June 14 as Flag Day, was signed by President Harry S. Truman on August 3, 1949. Although Flag Day is observed nationally by presidential proclamation and is celebrated by the display of the Flag and by patriotic programs, it is officially a legal holiday only in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

If you don't have a Flag now, get one and be prepared for Flag Day and that great 200th anniversary of our nation, July 4. A DAY OF PRAYER

President Gerald Ford, in a Presidential proclamation, designated May 14 as a National Day of Prayer. Pursuant to this proclamation, Blanchard Post was instrumental in having the Town of Bethlehem issue a resolution recognizing May 14 as a National Day of Prayer in our town. The resolution, reprinted below, was distributed by Father Kaulfuss to all the clergy of the town and also appeared in the Spotlight of May 13.

RESOLUTION

Whereas, the President of the United States of America has issued a proclamation establishing Friday, May 14, 1976, as a National Day of Prayer, and

Whereas, the President "calls upon all Americans to pray that day, each after his or her own manner and convictions, for unity and the blessings of Freedom throughout our land and for peace on earth" and

Whereas, the officials of the Town of Bethlehem, along with the officers and members of Nathaniel Adams Blanchard Post 1040, American Legion, will join in this National Day of Prayer and urge all residents of the town to also pray on this particular day that the many rights and liberties established by our founding fathers, so often taken for granted, be carefully preserved,

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, that Friday, May 14, 1976, be recognized by all residents of the Town of Bethlehem as a National Day of Prayer.
