DELEGATES REPORT OF 44th CONVENTION

The 44th annual convention of the American Legion, Department of New York met at the Hotel Commodore, New York City on Aug. 9, 10 and 11. Your delegates were Harold G. Barkhuff and Wayne M. Davis.

Business sessions commenced promptly at 9 a.m. and concluded by lunch time. The American Legion Auxiliary met simultaneously at the Hotel Astor.

The convention was addressed, on the first day, by Lt. Gov. Malcolm, Mayor Robert Wagner and by Stephen J. Bergman, 1962 winner of the Department Oratorical contest.

Report by Department officers, presentation of citations and the annual meeting of the Mountain Camp Corporation was held.

Further reports and addresses by E. A. Blackman, National Adjutant and Allen Russell Bentley, 1962 Governor of Boy's State were heard on Friday.

Resolutions passed included one to give assistance to chronically ill and aged veterans and one to reopen veterans' homes, now closed, to accommodate veterans discharged from VA hospitals. It is also noteworthy that the convention unanimously opposed a resolution to urge a \$100.00 (or more) per month pension for WW I veterans.

Albany County's Dr. F. Conners was unanimously elected Department Commander at the conclusion of the convention. Dr. Conners is a member of Ruane Post, Cohoes and the brother of Richard Conners, chairman for the state of the baseball committee.
