NEW COMMANDER

JOHN ENNIS NAMED

As a result of Lewis Kindberg's unexpected resignation the Post Affairs Committee met with the Judge Advocate and the Board of Directors to determine the proper method of selecting a successor. A review of the By-laws disclosed that no provision has been made for filling a vacancy under these circumstances. However, Article IV, Section II of the By-laws provides that a vice commander shall preside at meetings of the Post in the absence of the commander.

The two groups, with the Judge Advocate, have assumed that the intent, therefore, was succession to the position of commander by one of the vice commanders. It was agreed that the Post Affairs Committee would elect the new commander from among the three vice commanders, thereupon the committee unanimously elected John V. Ennis to fill the vacancy.

John expressed his regrets that Lewis (Hank) Kindberg had found it necessary to resign and his appreciation to the committee for "the high honor you have bestowed on me."

Commander Ennis will be formally installed at the regular September meeting by Past Commander Hugh Stowers.



He worked in a carpenter shop until He was 30, and then for three years He was an itinerant preacher. He never wrote a book. He never held an office. He never owned a home. He never had a family. He never went to college. He never put His foot inside a big city. He never traveled 200 miles from the place where He was born. He never did one of the things that usually accompany greatness. He had no credentials but Himself. He had nothing to do with the world except the naked power of His divine manhood.

While still a young man, the tide of popular opinion turned against Him. His friends ran away. One of them denied Him. He was turned over to His enemies. He went through the mockery of a trial. He was nailed to a cross between two thieves. His executioners gambled for the only piece of property He had on earth while He was dying—and that was His coat. When He was dead He was taken down and laid in a borrowed grave through the pity of a friend.

Nineteen wide centuries have come and gone and today He is the centerpiece of the human race and the leader of the column of progress. I am far within the mark when I say that all the armies that ever marched, and all the navies that ever were built, and all the parliaments that ever sat, and all the kings that ever reigned, put together have not affected the life of man upon this earth as powerfully as has that One Solitary Life.


