1973 DEPARTMENT OF NEW YORK CONVENTION REPORT

It has been four decades since the last Department Convention was held in Binghamton. For bringing the 55th annual session to that city this year the response of the Binghamtonians was tremendously displayed at the Friday night parade for which thousands stood for five hours on the sidelines to watch it pass by. Marching with Albany County contingent it was heart-warming to hear the applause as we trekked the two-mile stretch. Blanchard Post colors was there with four other Albany County posts that followed the County colors in the sixth of the ten-division parade. Albany County was fifth in the seven county Third District line-up. Position in the parade, to county level, is determined by membership strength.

The meetings met at the nearly completed Broome County Veterans Arena. The yet-to-be installed public address system combined with the acoustical problems left some of the major speeches unheard by many of us. We did hear well N.Y. State Lieutenant-Governor and Legionnaire Malcolm Wilson who lauded the Legion for its legislative efforts. However, from Legislative Committee Chairman John H. Cogan Jr., who regretted certain Legion-backed legislation was vetoed by Gov. Rockefeller, we heard no explanation as to why it was vetoed. A telegram from U.S. Sen. William Buckley, stating his opposition to any general amnesty for draft-dodgers, was read and roundly applauded.

Of the 45 resolutions, generally initiated at post level, given to the Resolutions Committee about three-fourths were presented to the delegates who unanimously voted their approval. The contents of the approved resolutions will be given to the posts later this year. (None came from Blanchard.) Only a single issue arose at the convention. It was a repeat of what occurred last year. The Amityville, L. I., Post objected to the Resolutions Committee not releasing to convention body its recommendations to set aside a portion of the American Legion magazine for special treatment of Americanism items. Your delegates voted with the majority in supporting the Resolutions Committee after it was explained to give special treatment to the Americanism Committee would then cause other committees to seek similar attention.

The Bowling Committee reported the 1976 bid for hosting the 1976 tournament is open; Membership Committee reported a slightly lower figure over last year in the Department; the Historian, not customary, made a report in which awards were cited for those posts that submitted reports. (Blanchard was not among them.)

Of local interest, for the first time in the history of the Department, a chaplain from Albany County was elected. He is the Rev. Everett E. Gardner of Albany (Scully Post), pastor of the Madison Avenue Baptist Church.

The new Department Commander is William H. Kelly of Cornwall-on-Hudson (Orange County). His theme for the year is "Community Service." Henry Gurney is new Department Vice Commander for our area; George Bragg of Ulster County is now the Third District Commander.

Next year's convention is set for Niagara Falls.

A happy ending story occurred to your Delegate Woehrle who, after the parade, lost his Legion cap on the highway at a ramp leading to Interstate 81. It was returned to him the next morning at the final session of the convention.

For the privilege and honor of representing the officers and members of our Post at this convention we are deeply appreciative.
