

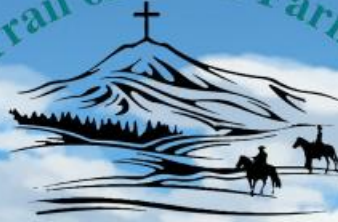

Julianne is the owner of JA Media Connections, LLC and the Producer/Director of A Mustang Story, the documentary/docuseries covering The Mustang Discovery Ride and other Mustang-related stories. She works in partnership with Bruce Anderson to provide Equine Assisted Services through Nature's View, Inc. and The Marley Project, Inc, a non-profit 501(c)(3) providing equine education and public service. The Marley Project is a member of the EQUUS Foundation Equine Welfare Network and has been a charity partner with Horses for Mental Health since 2023. The organization works to connect horses with individuals, educational groups, law enforcement officers and management training professionals. The recent work involving Mustangs led to a K-12 curriculum and arts integration component in the non-profit's Wellness Through Mustangs® program. Julianne is a designated professional with Arenas for Change, holding a dual certification in Education and Horses.

Julianne retired in 2022 after a 35-year career in Arts Education and K-12 Administration. A life-long horse lover, she owns and operates Thornfield LLC, a boarding and training facility in South Carolina. She combines her love of all things equine, educational experience and arts focus to bring clients and projects together through the boutique creative production company, JA Media Connections. Julianne completed the Director's Program through the Manhattan Film Institute in 2016 and began working with film production through a partnership with The Art of Storytelling (AOS), an international agency specializing in transformational stories. Their first collaborative project, "THE EDGE: Bruce Anderson - Natural Humanship™" is an award-winning documentary providing insight into Anderson's work

JA Media Connections LLC produces a catalogue of podcasts. The initial podcast, "Whinny Tales: Horse Stories, Pony Legends and Unicorn Yarns" has featured such organizations as the EQUUS Film and Arts Fest, Equitana USA, Horses and Humans Research Foundation and Creative Spirits UnLeashed. As a member of the EQUUS Film and Arts Fest Team, she serves as Director of Production and Education, producing and directing the Spotlight Rescue Series and the documentary film, A Pony and His Boy, as well as hosting the festival podcast. Other shows in the JA Media catalogue include a bi-weekly podcast for Brooke USA: On The Road, Tiny Horse Talk and the Mustang Discovery Ride. JA Media produces LIVESTREAM content during festival events, with programming for the panel discussions, training demos and on the scene interviews. Bruce Anderson is a passionate and enthusiastic trainer and clinician who firmly believes not only in the power of the horse, but also in our responsibility to help horses acclimate into our modern world. Bruce grew up on the West Indian islands of Trinidad and Tobago and it was there on the family cocoa and coffee estate that he began his relationship with horses. He learned to ride on the estate and then

represented his country on the National Show Jumping Team. From there he moved on to breeding farms at home, in the U.K. and in the U.S. While in England, he earned an agricultural degree at Merristwood College and in the U.S. where he worked in the Thoroughbred racing industry. He eventually moved into the hunter/jumper "A" show circuit, working in Camden, SC where he is now established as a trainer.

Bruce is certified through the Mustang Heritage Foundation's Trainer Incentive Program and enjoys working with Mustangs, but also appreciates working with owners and their horses to assist them in building better relationships. Bruce's gift is centered in his unique system of Natural Humanship™ developed over a lifetime of work with all types of horses. His recent experience working with feral horses has taken the system to another level. One of Bruce's most powerful and influential work settings took place in 2015 when he was called to the Bahamas to work with Nunki, the last feral mare in the line of Abaco Island Wild Horses, now extinct. That experience was the catalyst for a documentary featuring Bruce's life and work, "The Edge: Bruce Anderson's Natural Humanship™." A selected presenter for the 2018 World Equestrian Games and 2020 EQUITANA USA, Bruce works with counselors and mental health professionals, law enforcement agencies, school and church groups across the southeastern US to provide Equine Assisted Services with partner Julianne Neal through Nature's View, Inc. and The Marley Project 501(c)(3).

Julianne is an educator with 35 years of experience in Arts Administration and is currently holds a Professional Designation in Education through Arenas for Change. The Marley Project is one of the 65 nonprofit organizations selected for support in the SEEN Through Horses 2023 National Campaign.

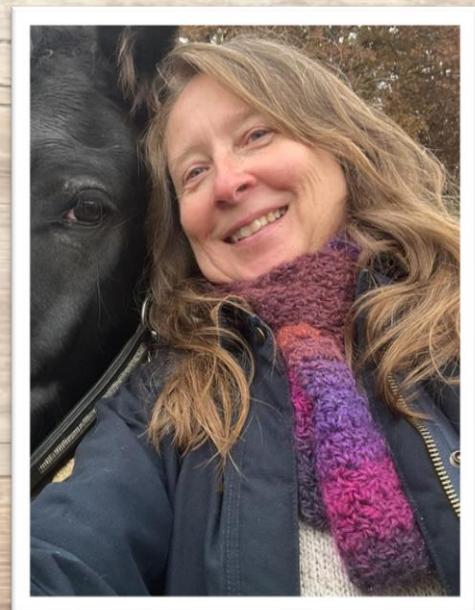

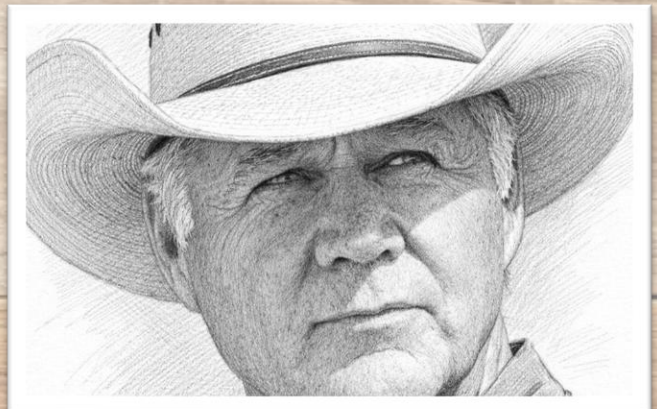

Mary was rocked to sleep on the backs of her grandfather's gentle Tennessee Walking horses as a baby. The horse has always been her safest place: that space where she feels most at home with her truest self.

As a young adult Mary entered the Inaugural Supreme Extreme Mustang Makeover--a 100-day wild horse gentling challenge to help older, previously unadoptable wild Mustangs find forever homes. Mary's success with the wild Mustangs led to over \$70,000 in lifetime earnings, her wild horse gentling methods being featured on National Geographic television, and her first Mustang partner being immortalized as a Breyer Model Horse.

Together with her heart-herd of formerly wild Mustang partners, Mary founded I AM HERD Mustang Sanctuary. A non-profit with the mission to provide a safe space for more wild horses in need and those drawn to the magic of their inner peace.

Raised by her grandpa, he enrolled her in a horseback riding program at the age of 6 and she never stopped feeding the passion of horses. She has over 25 years of experience in th industry from teaching, training and showing. Jessica enjoys a challenge when it comes to training and that's how she ended up getting involved with mustangs. Other professionals in the industry started recommending her, due to her knack for the 'tough ones' whether drafts, donkeys, and of course mustangs. This lead to her getting directly involved with BLM, 'repo-ing mustangs from neglectful situations, rehabbing, retraining, and in some cases rescuing. 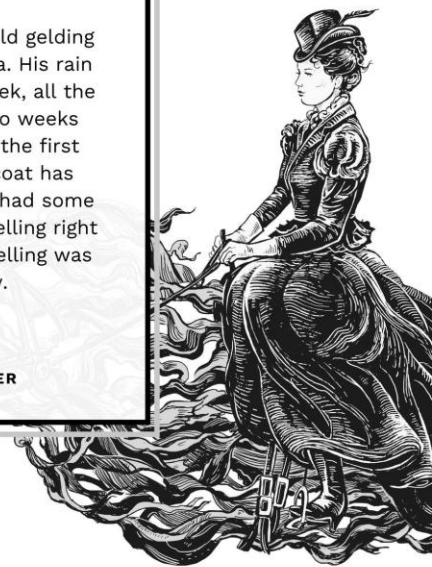

The BLM has placed more than 300,000 wild horses and burros into private care since 1971. Many of those animals have become excellent pleasure, show, or work horses.

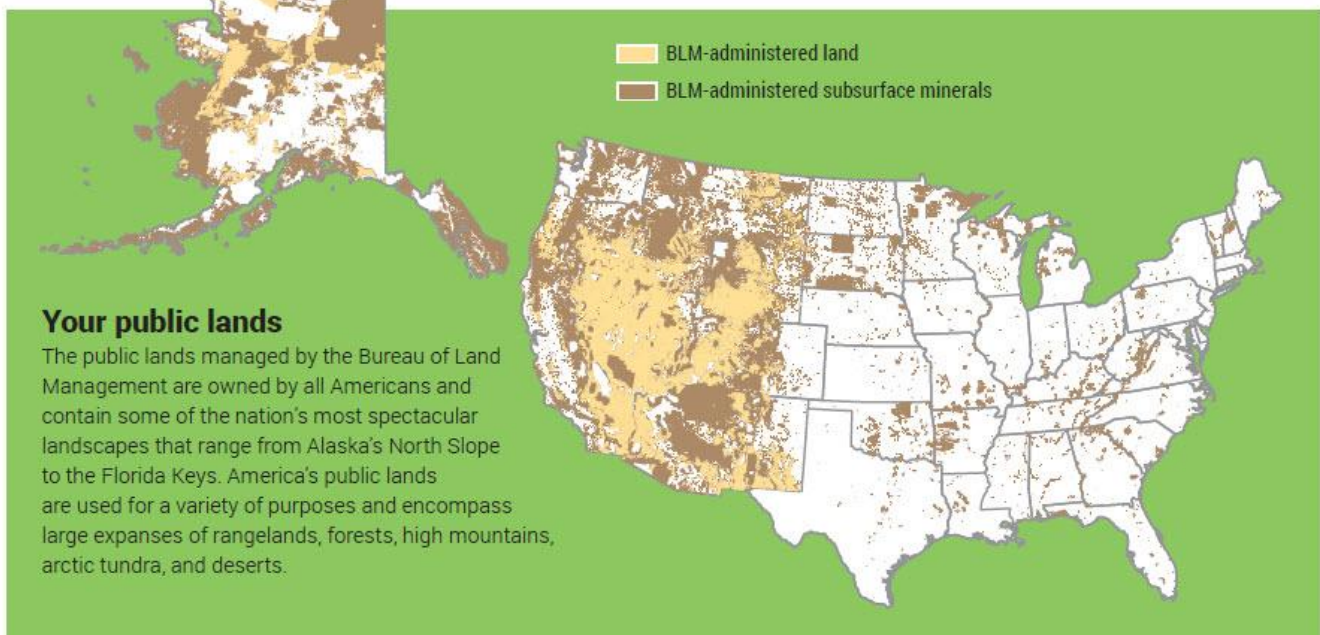

The Wild Horse Refuge is a private sanctuary that was created entirely for rescued Wild Mustangs that were taken from BLM Herd Management Areas (HMA) located within Colorado. The Wild Horses living on this special property are now protected and have regained the freedom and independence they had prior to government interference.

With more than 29 square miles of contiguous land to run free, their wild and free spirit has been restored. With the Refuge being located just 30 miles from the Sand Wash Basin, the horses feel right at home as they roam freely across the vast open spaces of the Refuge!

There are no paddocks, stock pens, fenced pastures, or other smaller and more restrictive spaces in use here. Instead of being relegated to pens or smaller pastures where they might have an occasional opportunity to run one or two hundred yards - or possibly even a few thousand feet... the wild horses living at the Refuge continue to run until they choose to stop.

It is truly a beautiful sight to see when these wild horses are able to regain control of where they go and what they do completely on their own!

The Wild Horse Refuge is a completely new facility that was acquired in order to create a special home for Colorado's native Wild Horses.

Wild horses (Mustangs) are allowed to roam freely within the Refuge - which has more than 22,500 acres of land for the horses to roam freely.

Takhin Equine Integration

The training of the horse as it's own human therapeutic intervention.

If a horse is going to transmit well-being to a human, it must have well-being to give. This applies to both horses in therapy settings as well as horses in riding schools, and sport.

Takhin is the Mongolian word for the wild horse – it means “honored one” or “revered one”. The Takhin program honors the horse’s need for play, herd socialization, purpose, and bodily and mental development.

It also honors the equine professional who is trying to do their best for their horse and clients, but often lack the time to address both.

Takhin is a program that will enable you to teach your clients with trauma, depression and related conditions to work with equine play, lunging, in hand work and long reins, to not only ensure the horses’s well-being but to also empower themselves.
