You all continue to do amazing things across this State for our communities and fellow Veterans. I have seen so many different Posts involved in civic events or being the catalyst of hosting them. Continue the amazing work as it is paying dividends in Veterans' lives, public relations and membership across the Family. On the topic of events, I have created an event and am being assisted by SAL Detachment Commander Chris Sherbourne to be held in Grove "22 A Day Vigil" that the details are posted on the Department Facebook. In basic we will be standing guard over a Flag draped casket for 22 hours in 22-minute shifts starting at 2:00 PM November 22nd through noon on the 23rd. With these being the year of our semiquincentennial as a country I encourage you to create events based around this celebration. We just Chartered Post 1776 in West Tulsa as of October 29th and look forward to building on that with hopefully many other great 1776 or 250 themed events across the Department.

As part of the November schedule, National Vice Commander Landkamer(NE) will be joining us here in Oklahoma from November 21st-24th where the plan is to have a Charter Presentation and reception in Tulsa, details to be announced. He will then travel to Grove for the aforementioned 22 A Day Vigil where he will participate at his request.

The Four Pillars of Hope Inc 501(c)3 was finally approved and recognized officially as of October 6 th and I extend a round of applause to every member that had a hand in this long process. Our newly formed VSO Committee and Department Leadership has a great meeting with ODVA Director James "Jay" Bynum earlier this week. It was a great meeting with a lot of positive coming out of it very soon. Stay tuned. Your newly formed Fundraising Committee will be meeting next week to discuss our next directions with working to put us in a much stronger financial situation for years to come.

Our membership drive continues to be doing phenomenal as we successfully surpassed the 65% membership goal about three weeks ahead of the November goal date which puts us 10% ahead of this same time the last couple years. As I write this, we sit over 7800 at 66.61%. Oklahoma as of now still sits in the 12th place Nationally but less than .8% (8/10 of a percent) or half a member per Post from jumping all the way up to 8th place. Our Mighty Midwest is the only Region to have every Department hit every goal thus far and NVC Landkamer has sent a

rousing round of kudos. We need to stay ahead of target as a little slip puts us playing catch up. If every post in the Department added just one new or renewal a week through June 30th, we would finish the admin year over well over 100% for the first time in quite some time. If we can take time to make genuine buddy checks, past members will naturally begin to return to the organization that they once strongly believed in.

Let's keep the momentum rolling!

- 2. The National Commander's motto this year is <u>BETTER TOGETHER</u>. The American Legion Family, Posts, Units, Squadrons and Chapters do better working together as a family. We got your back/We got your six are lessons all of us learned during our time in military service
- 3. Legislative Agenda is how we get things done in the Legion to help veterans and hold the VA accountable. Every day go to legion.org/action and sign up to send an email to our national senators and representatives to support pending congressional bills backed by the Legion. Also go to legion.org/advocacy/legislative to sign up for grassroots notifications you can respond to help veterans.
- 4. The 3 C's: <u>Communication</u>: What method do you use? Communicating with Vietnam, Cold War, Desert Storm and Iraq/Afghanistan vets are all a little bit different.

<u>Community</u>: What is your Post known for? Should be more than just a bar with Post attached. How do you help the community?

<u>Camaraderie</u>: Buddy Checks especially on week of Veterans Day and week of Legion's Birthday March 15.

- 5. Veteran and Children Foundation. Donating to the VCF helps fund accredited VSO Training [now available on-line] and Temporary Financial Assistance for veterans and Posts in need.

Adjutant's Corner

I have enjoyed attending the District Conferences in October and have just two left in November. From my perspective, the District Conferences give me an opportunity to pass along information useful to Post and our Members.

The programs I highlighted at the District Conferences follow and reach out to Department for assistance with these programs.

Temporary Financial Assistance (from legion.org)

Since its establishment in 1925, The American Legion Temporary Financial Assistance (TFA) program has awarded cash grants to minor children of current active duty or American Legion members. These grants help families in need meet the cost of shelter, food, utilities and health expenses, thereby keeping the child or children in a more stable environment.

Who is eligible for a grant?

The minor child must be under the age of 18 and still in high school, however TFA may be extended until the completion of high school provided the child has not reached the age of 21. The minor child must be the biological child, stepchild, or in the legal custody of, a qualifying veteran. A qualifying veteran is defined as a member of the United States Armed Forces serving on federal orders current under Title 10 of the United States Code, inclusive of all components, OR any veteran possessing an up-to-date membership in The American Legion. Active duty applicants can be considered without being a member of The American Legion. A single onetime non-repayable Temporary Financial Assistance grant of up to \$2,500 will be permitted for the minor child(ren) of a qualifying veteran.

No child is considered eligible for Temporary Financial Assistance until a complete investigation is conducted at the post or department level, a legitimate family need is determined, and all other available assistance resources have been utilized or exhausted. Additionally, the TFA application must originate and be filled out by someone at the local level.

National Emergency Fund

Established after Hurricane Hugo in 1989, the National Emergency Fund has delivered over \$11 million in aid to Legionnaires and Legion posts, helping prevent post closures and support recovery. With grants of up to \$3,000 for individuals and \$10,000 for posts, the NEF ensures rapid relief when it's needed most.

Eligibility

Membership in The American Legion must be active when the disaster strikes and when the application is filed.

What's covered: An NEF grant may be considered when the applicant:

☐ Has been displaced from his or her primary residence due to damage sustained during
a declared natural disaster.
☐ Provides copies of receipts of items required to meet immediate needs (such as
temporary housing, food, water, clothing, diapers, etc.) during the period immediately
following the disaster.

You must activate this benefit by going to www.thelit.com or calling 800-235-6943.

New Award Certificate for Educators

The Committee on Youth Education (COYE) is reviving The Americanism Commission Certificate of Appreciation for Education.

This program is to recognize individuals, in our Department and communities, that promote the four pillars of the American Legion, core values and educational goals of The American Legion by advancing the principles of Americanism, supporting the education programs, and helping to instill a sense of pride and civic responsibility in our nation's youth.

Each Department can nominate up to 3 individuals (members or non-members) each year. A list of Nominations to the COYE will be due to the Americanism National Headquarters before the Fall Meetings by September 26th. That means our Department must have them no later than September 15th.

<u>Individuals that are nominated by each Department</u> and approved by the Committee on Youth Education will receive a Certificate and a letter from the Americanism Commission that can be presented by the Department at their choosing.

We got this very late and the timeline is short because we expect many more than 3 nominations for the Awards Committee to evaluate. You must make the September 15th suspense date. The nominations must go through the Department Headquarters.

VA Healthcare Provider and VA Physician of the Year packages have been forwarded to National. They have a deadline of Sept 7th.

We are working on the National nomination packages for LEO, Firefighter and Employers of Veterans, we have a little time on those.

It is time for all of the Post to start talking to your Police and Fire Departments looking for nominees for next year. Give some thought to the VA Physicians and Healthcare Providers that serve you. There are many very good ones in the system that deserve recognition. A "Healthcare Provider" includes "ANY" VA healthcare provider; Xray tech, audiology tech, psychologist, Social Worker, and all of the other skills that are involved in direct patient care.

Take care of the people that take care of you. Recognize their excellence.

Ralph T. O'Neil Education Trophy Description:

This award is presented to the department with the greatest percentage of accredited schools participating in the American Legion School Award Medal program. It consists of a large silver-loving cup-style trophy with engraved detailing and a wooden base. The engraved inscription reads: "Ralph T. O'Neil Education Trophy, awarded to the department with the highest percentage of accredited school participation in the School Award Medal program." A laminated image of the trophy mounted to a suitable plaque is provided for the department. This award is named in honor of Past National Commander Ralph T. O'Neil.

Daniel J. O'Connor Americanism Trophy Description:

This award is presented to the department that has excelled in promoting Americanism through post-level activities as measured by the Consolidated Post Report and supporting narrative. The award consists of a large gold champion cup-style trophy topped with a U.S. flag and eagle, mounted on a two-tiered wood base. The upper tier bears a gold metal plate engraved "Daniel J. O'Connor Americanism Award (year)." The lower tier bears an additional engraved plate that reads: "Awarded to the American Legion Department of (state), American Legion (number) National Convention, (city and state)." This award is named in honor of Daniel J. O'Connor and was previously known as the "William Randolph Hearst Americanism Trophy."

Department Award for 100% Post Children & Youth Reporting Description:

This award is presented to departments who achieve 100% post submission rate of the Children & Youth report. It consists of a certificate signed by the national commander, national adjutant, National Americanism Commission chairman and Committee on Children & Youth chairman

AND of course, something about membership.

Department Retention Award Description:

This award is presented to the departments in each category with the highest membership retention rate for the membership year. It consists of \$2,000 check by national headquarters

Post 147 – Miami





Starting at 15, Jose's love affair with baseball would become a life-long passion. After starting in the Legion's baseball program, Jose went on to play in high school, college, at the semi-pro level, and internationally. He went on to play in fast pitch and senior slow pitch softball, finishing his career at 78 years old.

Throughout his adult life, service to others has been an important part of who Jose is. He served in the Army with the 10th Mountain Division, and then became an Air Force civilian, working

maintenance on aircraft at Vance Air Force Base. Work eventually brought him to Tulsa when he was hired at American Airlines, a place where he worked for over 30 years until retirement.

After 63 years of playing baseball and over 30 years at American Airlines, Jose didn't just go home and retire, he remained active through community service in Tulsa, a place he's called home for 60 years. He served as an ordained deacon in his church for 44 years and he founded the Tulsa Hispanic Lions Club in 1982, an organization he served with for 18 years.

Throughout his years of baseball and community service, Jose's wife of 70 years, Gloria, has been right by his side, starting as a cheerleader for Jose's baseball team and later serving as the church choir director while Jose served as a deacon.

Before our visit with Jose, he took the time to set up much of his memorabilia, a truly impressive collection of photos, uniforms, bats, rings and more. We can't thank him and Gloria enough for their hospitality and for taking the time to talk with us.

The Korean War Armistice is on July 27, and in 2023 The American Legion LeBron Post 58 Guthrie, OK, teamed up with Jaeho Yi, President of the Korean American Association, to

recognize and present the Ambassador for Peace Medal to Veterans who served in the Korean War.

Please read this email in its entirety to learn about Captain Charles Graham Gibson Jr being repatriated and the opportunity we had to honor his service with the medal. During the 2018 Singapore Summit when President Trump met with Kim Jong-un, 55 boxes of remains were released. Captain Charles Graham-Gibbons Jr was in Box #48 Recovery of U.S. human remains from the Korean War - Wikipedia Read more below.

At our first ceremony in July 2023, our goal was to identify 12 Korean War Veterans, we were humbled by the response we received with 31 medals and had another wonderful turnout for our November ceremony. We recognized several deceased Veterans, those Killed In Action, and several who were still living, including several Legionnaires from Guthrie, Chandler, Perry, and Edmond, Oklahoma, however, membership of The American Legion is not a requirement. Those families with deceased Veterans accepted the medal posthumously. Family members attended from as far away as California, Missouri, and Kansas. And since our first ceremony, we have recognized over 120 Veterans and their loved ones with the Ambassador for Peace Medal.

This recognition continues across the department, as many Posts have showed interest in honoring their Legionnaires and community Veterans, furthering our mission with Posts in Duncan, Tulsa, Skiatook, Seminole, Salina, Sayre in partnership with the Clinton's Veterans Home, Providence Place in Woodward, as well as several home visits.

Our next ceremony in Guthrie is scheduled for Sunday, November 16, with the Meet and Greet at 12:30, ceremony at 1 p.m. and a Korean style lunch to follow. The ceremony will take place at a local church. Korean War service is verified by reviewing the Veteran's DD-214 (military discharge paper) and then review of the application (attached) with the Veterans information. We have other options though and can discuss further if necessary. These two items are sent to the Korean Consular to confirm and award the medals. Guthrie Post 58 is honored to assist Jaeho Yi facilitate this recognition for our Korean War Veterans.

Veterans and their family members can submit a Release form to Senator Lankford's office at the following link to request a copy of their DD-214 from the National Archives. Help with a Federal Agency - Senator James Lankford

The year 2023 was the 70th anniversary of Armistice Day (July 27, 1953) of the Korean War, known as the Forgotten War, which has never been forgotten and never will be forgotten by the Koreans, Veterans, and their families. As this is a special day to recognize our Veterans, the Korean government commemorates the day with a special thank you by awarding this medal for those who risked their lives to preserve and protect the freedom and democracy for their home country, The Republic of Korea (aka South Korea).

I received a text a few weeks ago from a man in Arizona who was in Washington DC with a Korean Veteran on an Honor Flight. Apparently, there was a man at the Korean War Memorial who suggested they call me and gave my name and number. We submitted his documents for his medal. Two days later I received a call from a woman in Texas, she was also at the Korean War Memorial in DC when a man gave her a cup of coffee while in line, and he then suggested she contact me. She at least asked where he was from and he responded Oklahoma. So, thank you whoever you are, you have blessed these Veterans and their family members.

BUT, more about the Texas woman's cousin. KIA/MIA Korean War. <u>Capt. CHARLES</u> GRAHAM GIBSON JR. - Service Member Profile

After his remains were identified in March 2025, his remains were flown home to Michigan Saturday, October 11th, and he will be laid to rest tomorrow, Thursday, October 16th at Fort

Custer National Cemetery in Augusta, Michigan. I have been in contact with the Next of Kin and the cousin, coordinating the direct delivery of Charles' Ambassador for Peace Medal from the Korean Consulate General Houston, Texas. In addition to DPAA coordinating his Memorial Service with the Armed Forces, I was able to contact Battle Creek Mayor Behnke to present a Certificate of Recognition to the family. My desire is to have every Korean War Veteran receive the same recognition as if they were here in Guthrie.

Learn more about DPAA and how WE NEED TO SPREAD THE WORD to family members of those MIA/KIA to submit DNA in hopes of identifying their loved ones <u>Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA)</u> THIS!!! Our mission, we need to share the info and educate our communities.

Please feel free to share with friends and family members and be sure to call, text or email with any questions. The application process takes about two weeks after we submit the forms which allows time to review, verify and ship the medals from the Korean Consular. **Deadline to submit applications for the Guthrie ceremony is Wednesday, October 29th.** Look over your rosters and make calls, Buddy Checks work well. Thank you!

But we are strong, each in our purpose, and we are all more strong together.

A clear and legible copy of the DD-214 (or any other verification of service in the

Korean War)

Any other medals the veteran received from the U.S. government or the Korean government

Has the veteran revisited Korea? If so, when?

Eligibility criteria for Ambassador for Peace Medal recipients:

Veterans must have served in Korean territory during the Korean War from June 25, 1950 to July 27, 1953, or have participated in United Nations peacekeeping operations until the end of 1955. U.S. Navy members also are eligible, if they served abroad in a naval vessel that was assigned to Korean waters from 1950 to 1953. The Medal may also be awarded posthumously. The next of kin, such as the spouse or descendants, may apply for the Medal on behalf of a deceased Korean War Veteran.



We will think about you always, and talk about you too!


