

The Gerasenes' demoniac is a cautionary tale. It unmasks the scapegoating mechanism that structures the dynamic of evil in history. To be a disciple of Jesus is to live like the former demoniac among the Gerasenes: as a sign of forgiveness in a world rife with violence ending in self-destructive chaos. Following Jesus is a process of discovering our true identity as we practice reconciling love, and witness his love by which we have been touched.
