Some of you haven't filed to save money \$ \$ Texas calls it "Homestead Exemption" \$

\$ Every residing homeowner is eligible

\$ Homestead exemptions remove part of your home's value from taxation, so they lower your taxes. For example, your home is appraised at \$100,000, and you qualify for a \$25,000

exemption (this is the amount mandated for school districts), you will pay school taxes on the home as if it were worth only \$75,000.

You should file your regular residential homestead exemption application between January 1 and April 30. Early applications will not be accepted. If your application is postmarked by April 30, this will allow the district time to process it before your tax statement comes out in the fall.

Note: Trash can be put by curb after 6:00 p.m. on Mondays & Thursdays or in the morning on Tuesdays and Fridays. Trash is not allowed in view any other times.

Dear

Please do not leave trash bags near the street. It is against City Codes and Deed Restrictions for trash to be in front of my house too long. Please either take them with you or put them inside my gate. I will put the trash out for the garbage men.

It is against the law to blow leaves and debris down the storm sewers in the streets. You and I could be fined if you are seen doing it. Too much debris can stop up the drain and cause flooding.

Do you want to help foster youth in a meaningful way?





Your neighbors thank you for all your hard work and dedication: your yard is a joy to behold!

Hurricane Katrina (the one that devastated New Orleans) was on August 29, 2005. About September 1, 2005 the Martin's were happily named YOTM for the first time ever. A short while later, on September 23, 2005, Hurricane Rita was en route to Houston. Rita's pending arrival so soon after Katrina frightened a lot of people (millions). Pre-storm anxiety set in motion the largest evacuation in United States' history - and the September 2005 YOTM sign was stashed away for safe keeping until the anxiety and storm threat were gone! March - November a home is selected for Yard of the Month based on the merits of good maintenance, design, seasonal color and an overall appearance that supports the standards set for BV by our Deed Restrictions. An added consideration for choosing the winner? What would Briar Village look like if all our homes looked like this one?

An effort is made to share the honor of YOTM with as many as possible. We try to keep 5 years between repeat honors to the same house. Also, please keep in mind that the home chosen for any month may not have the most beautiful yard in the entire world, but at the moment the YOTM Team saw it, it had something special that set it apart, that deserved special recognition. Many homes are given Honorable Mention each month. December selections are based on Holiday Decorations. Judging usually takes place around the 4th Friday/Saturday/Sunday each month. YOTM is independent of the Board of Directors.

2019 All New Access Cards for Tennis Courts and Pool

The access control system for the tennis courts, pool and clubhouse was updated, requiring all cards from the previous system to be swapped for new Access Cards.

Bring your old cards and the completed Access Card form to be issued new cards. The form is on the opposite page, and on the BV Website under Resources, Forms (Downloadable).

You may swap your card(s) at the Graham Management office, see below. You may also mail your old card(s) in with the completed form, and new card(s) will be mailed back to you; however, there is no guarantee of receipt for cards that are mailed.

If you have never had a card and would like to purchase one, please complete the form and either bring it to the Clubhouse or management office, or mail it in with the payment for the card(s) to be mailed back to you.

You must be current with Annual Maintenance Fees to be eligible to have card(s) replaced. Residents with a past due balance must first pay their balance before a new card will be issued.

BPCIA Meeting Highlights – March 28, 2019

Resident attendance totaled 6. 2019 Annual Maintenance Fees are 84% collected. Most of the painting work inside the clubhouse has been completed by dedicated volunteers; see "A Million Thanks" at the left below.

Deed Restriction Violations: through March 27^{th} , 1^{st} letter = 162; 2^{nd} letter = 42; Certified letters = 26. ACC approvals: 7 submitted, 2 approved, 2 pending, 3 denied.

Two residents had comments as follows: many issues of cars parked too long in the street blocking neighbor's driveway access, abandoned cars, people running a car detailing business out of their residence, many cars sitting for extended periods of time in driveways; clogged storm sewers in the Panagard, Locke Lane area. Residents wanted to know what can be done to alleviate these problems; BV has increasing rental property and we need to tighten up on enforcing deed restrictions and finding some way to better inform renters and landlords about the requirements of deed restrictions. A suggestion was made to put more information on the subject in this newsletter.

A third resident presented a preliminary proposal, asking if the Board is receptive to possibly changing to another Website provider that costs less, and brings back features we had and liked with our old website, before we signed on with Nabr one year ago. The Board said yes to the idea, so a more detailed proposal will be presented as soon as possible. For lower cost, the new website would include, for example: private messaging; messages sorted with newest posts at top - which are features not available from Nabr.

Architectural Control Committee (ACC)

All improvements visible from the street must have ACC approval BEFORE work starts. Get the ACC Approval Form on the BV Website or from GMI.

Deed Restriction Violations (DRV)

Please review your Deed Restrictions, which are on the BV Website. If you receive a DRV Letter, please take it seriously, but please do not take it personally. The best course of action is to simply fix the problem and move on.

If you are uncomfortable in any manner with a letter you received, please feel welcome to contact me or GMI - our management company - to discuss it.
