All April Events Canceled

In light of the growing concern over the global pandemic, COVID-19 (Coronavirus), HOA Meetings and Briar Village events have been cancelled for the month of April. This includes the Easter Party on April 4, 2020, the Spring Fling scheduled for April 18th, and the Spring Garage Sale on April 25th. These event were cancelled in an effort to follow CDC guidelines to prevent the spread of COVID-19 and to keep us all safe during this difficult time. After things have returned to the new normal, we will look at scheduling replacement events. The Board is also looking into ways to hold the May Board meeting in a remote fashion if conditions still require it.

Please also remember that in accordance with Harris County's Stay at Home order, the BV playground, pool, and clubhouse are closed for the safety of the community. The area has now been taped off. Do not enter the playground or use the play equipment until the Harris County Directive has been lifted. The Harris County directive is currently scheduled to last through April 30th, however it is expected to be extended. This closure does not apply to the Tennis Courts.

Briar Village is truly a "gem" in this big, sprawling city. We here in Briar Village have large lots, beautiful tree-lined streets, and well-maintained amenities. Most importantly, we are a community of people who, for the most part, are caring neighbors and good people. As a community, we can all do our share to keep Briar Village the great community it is and, of course, the best way to do that is to abide by our deed restrictions and the Exterior Maintenance Guidelines. One such restriction is storing your trash and recycling receptacles out of public view.

There has been a proliferation of homes in Briar Village where the trash and recycling containers are stored in public view, either on the side of a home or in front of the residence. These containers are an eye sore (especially when they are overflowing with trash!) and storing them in public view is not in accordance with our deed restrictions – restrictions that we all abide by to maintain the beauty of this neighborhood. Residents are responsible for removing trash and recycling receptacles from public view and placing them behind their homes, their garage, or in approved, covered storage areas at all times except

- Monday at 6 p.m. through Tuesday at 6 p.m.
- Thursday from 6 p.m. through Friday at 6 p.m.

By placing the trash and recycling containers out of public view, we not only improve the appearance of our homes, but we also do our part to maintain the beauty of our neighborhood generally. Failure to place these containers out of public view will result in violation letters and repeated notices can result in loss of privileges and fines.

Let's all do our part to keep Briar Village looking beautiful by placing our trash and recycling receptacles out of public view!

Singlefamily home sales are up 13% year over year and inventory dropped slightly to 3.5 months of inventory (seller's market). Swim at Your Own Risk

The Houston heat will be here soon! We would like to remind all residents that our neighborhood pool is "Swim at You Own Risk." This means that



there are no lifeguards on staff at the pool. BV made the decision mid season last summer after increasing difficulty finding reliable lifeguards. Making the decision to make our pool SAYOR means that we can enjoy this neighborhood amenity longer into the year, but please make sure that you and your family are following the posted pool rules. Propping the gate open or allowing other residents in who do not have an access card is prohibited. Only residents and their guests, who have current access cards are allowed to use the BV Pool. Additionally, only residents of homes current on BV Maintenance Fees are eligible for access cards. Access cards cost \$25 for each household and can be ordered from Graham Management. Cooks Corner: Zucchini Cakes



INGREDIENTS 2 large zucchini 2 large eggs 1/2 c. bread crumbs 1/2 c. ricotta 1/4 c. freshly grated Parmesan 1/2 tsp. garlic powder 1/4 tsp. crushed red pepper flakes Kosher salt Freshly ground black pepper Vegetable oil, for cooking

DIRECTIONS

Grate zucchini on box grater, then use a clean kitchen towel to ring out as much excess water as possible. Work in batches as necessary.

In a large bowl, combine zucchini, eggs, bread crumbs, ricotta, Parmesan, garlic powder, and red pepper flakes. Season with salt and pepper.

In a large skillet over medium heat, add enough oil to come ¹/₂" up the sides. Scoop about a ¹/₄ cup of zucchini mixture and add to skillet. Carefully flatten with a spatula and cook until golden, about 2 to 3 minutes per side. Place on a paper towel–lined plate, sprinkle with salt and serve.

Homemade Playdough

Ingredients

2 c all-purpose flour
3/4 c salt
4 tsp cream of tartar
2 c lukewarm water
2 Tbps vegetable oil (coconut oil works too)
Food coloring (optional)

Instructions

Stir together the flour, salt and cream of tartar in a large pot. Next add the water and oil. If you're only making one color, stir in the the color now.

Cook over medium-heat, stirring constantly. Continue stirring until the dough has thickened and begins to form into a ball. Remove from heat and then place inside a bowl, gallon sized bag or onto wax paper.

Allow to cool slightly and then knead until smooth. If you're adding colors after, divide the dough into balls (for how many colors you want) and then add the dough into the quart sized bags. Start with about 5 drops of color and add more to brighten it. Knead the dough, while inside the bag so it doesn't stain your hands. Once it's all mixed together, you're ready to PLAY.


Store the play dough inside the bags to keep soft. If stored properly it will keep soft for up to 3 months.
