The news has reported west Houston thieves, driving stolen cars, following unsuspecting residents home and robbing them when they exit their cars in their own driveways. police can't help you much if the only identification you can provide for the thieves is a stolen license plate number.

Do not drive straight home from your bank, or a shopping trip, or even from your grocery store. Do not allow anyone to follow you into your driveway. Be alert – Coyotes attacking people ...a word to the wise

Frisco, Texas is a northern suburb of Dallas, it is between McKinney and Denton, Texas. Frisco is about 28 miles from downtown Dallas - - about the same distance Briar Village is from downtown Houston.

Police in Frisco are warning residents about a string of incidents involving an aggressive coyote, including an attack on a jogger on a Wednesday morning, and a nine-year-old child. The jogger suffered a neck injury and had to undergo surgery. The child suffered a minor injury and was taken to a doctor for treatment.

On Oct. 26, a coyote tried to jump on a runner...but a passerby scared off the coyote. The attack on the child



happened on Nov. 1. On Nov. 11, a police officer spotted a coyote "stalking" a runner. The officer turned on his siren and drove through the intersection, scaring off the coyote, according to dash cam footage released by the police.

The Frisco Police Department's animal services unit has been trying to catch the coyote. The department has also been working with other wildlife experts, who said the aggressive attacks are abnormal for coyotes.

Frisco Police offered these safety tips:

- If you walk or jog, consider carrying something that makes a loud noise to scare off an animal; such as an air horn or whistle.
- If you walk small animals, ensure they are on a leash and be alert.
- Do not allow domesticated animals to roam free outdoors.
- Do not approach or feed wildlife and keep trash in a secure container.




Currently, homes have been selling in 61 days on the market while last year homes averaged 80 days on the market.


Need a gift for a child?




On Sunday, December 2nd from 1 pm - 4 pm, the BV Clubhouse was a happy, busy place. Attendance was great and there were lots of pretty, clever and interesting things on display - lots of Christmas shopping was happening! Refreshments were served and everyone - young and old enjoyed the event.

Christmas story you haven't heard before

We learned in school that Christopher Columbus discovered America in 1492. His fleet consisted of 3 ships, the Nina, the Pinta, and his flagship, the Santa Maria - here's what we didn't learn in school!

...After engaging in festivities and drinking, Columbus ordered the crew to continue sailing to Cuba late into the night. One by one the crew members fell



asleep until only a cabin boy was steering the Santa Maria, causing it to run aground off the present-day site of Cap-Haïtien, Haiti on 24 December 1492, sinking the next day.

Realizing that the ship was beyond repair, Columbus ordered his men to strip the timbers from the ship. The timbers were later used to build a fort which Columbus called *La Navidad* (Christmas) because the wreck occurred on Christmas.

Losing your dog is like losing a family member

True story. In November a BV family's beloved dog accidentally got out and disappeared. The family blanketed the neighborhood with signs with photos of their LOST DOG.

The evening of Tuesday, 11/6 signs were posted at: Piping Rock and Joel Wheaton, tennis court parking lot, Briarstem, Briarcrest, Briargreen, Joel Wheaton and Ella Lee, Overbrook, Panagard Entry at Westheimer, Briargreen Entry at Westheimer, Piping Rock Entry at Hwy 6.

The signs began to disappear on 11/8, some were

immediately replaced on 11/8. Then, by 7:00 am the morning of Friday, 11/9, all the signs were gone except the 3 at the perimeter entry streets.

Because of when the signs disappeared from which locations, and because several crumpled up signs were found in the tennis court trash can, someone who exercises in the morning or



evening may be removing them; we are asking those with security cameras to be on the lookout and report to our security service.

We have been over this issue before: sign posters are supposed to date their signs and the sign Gestapo is supposed to leave all signs alone for 2 weeks.

This community is very good at finding lost children and lost pets, but not when our most valuable tool is destroyed by someone who clearly doesn't see the value and importance.

BV Security Report – December 6, 2018

Burglaries of 3 homes and 3 motor vehicles were reported in the past 30 days.

Twelve mailboxes were destroyed and a Molotov Cocktail was thrown in the middle of Briarport (see photo from the BV website below). No further details are available for publication at this time, but an investigation is on-going to determine if any of these are the acts of a group of young people, one of whom lives in BV.

Jugging is slang for a robbery that targets bank and ATM customers, 2 incidents were reported.

A giant thank you to Ranger Patrol's team, especially Officer Wilson, for working to improve the situation in BV. Officer Wilson has been adjusting his patrols and patrolling on his own time to assist in curbing some of the recent incidents.

Installation of new access controls for the Clubhouse and other Commons areas is complete and is working well.

Citizen Patrol added 2 new volunteers this month and had HPD conduct Citizen Patrol Training in our Clubhouse. Volunteers are performing many hours of patrol each month.



Board Elections February 7, 2019 Is this the year you decide to get involved?

In 2019 three director positions are up for re-election.

January 2nd is the deadline to submit biographical data to GMI if you want to run for the Board and have your information included in the mailing with the Annual Proxy. The election takes place at the Annual Meeting February 7th.
