This picture of 6 United States Marines raising the U.S. flag on the Japanese island of Iwo Jima is the most reproduced photograph in the history of photography.

Easy Company took two flags up Mt. Suribachi on Iwo Jima. The raising of the second and larger flag is captured in the photograph. Easy Company

had been fighting 4 days, during which they suffered 40% casualties.

There are six Flag Raisers in the famous Iwo Jima photo, four in the front line and two in back. Three of them would die in battle shortly afterwards. The remaining three became national heroes within weeks. from www.iwojima.com

BPCIA Board of Directors 2019

The Briar Park Community Improvement Association (BPCIA) held its Annual Meeting in the BV Clubhouse on February 7, 2019, the main purpose of which was election of new Board members. About 32 residents attended, and a quorum of votes was easily received at the check-in desk. Some years it is difficult to get a quorum (10% of homeowners) vote, and the meeting is put on hold while interested residents go knocking on doors to get enough votes.

There are seven members on our Board of Directors, they each serve a two year term, but the number of incoming members is staggered so that we always have experienced people on the board to assist any newcomers and keep things running smoothly. This year, three board positions were up for election, next year there will be four.

The Briar Village Real Estate Market had 4 home sales this past month at an average sales price of \$253,640. There are currently 14 active homes on the market with 7 active homes for lease. This time last year, Briar Village had 16 active listings, so it's not uncommon to have a few more homes available at the start of the year.



The Greater Houston Market home inventory level lowered to 3.5 months. This means that it is currently a seller's market, but demand is a little soft this time of year as the total number of home sales will be about half of the peak numbers we will see in June and July.

Our McDonalds – Hwy 6 @ Piping Rock

In December our newly rebuilt McDonalds had its Grand Opening, which included a small ceremony to dedicate a bike rack specifically installed for the use of Briar Village residents, especially families who want to bike over for a burger! Two of our Board Members, Gale and Eric attended, it looks like it was a fun day.



New this year: McDonalds is offering a Pre-K learning event called "Small Fries Playtime" on Tuesdays from 11:30 am -12:30 pm. It is based on pre-K children, but all are welcome.

Trash Talk

With trash pickup 2 days a week and recycling 1 day a week, we have something sitting on the curb 7 days a week, due to those who set things out early and those who don't promptly put empty receptacles away...



Trash Out at the Wrong Time

- Lowers the value of living in Briar Village
- Attracts the wrong crowd
- And it's against the law

City of Houston Code of Ordinances, Solid Waste and Litter Control:

It shall be unlawful to place or to allow to remain any materials at the curbline for basic garbage collection service by the department prior to 6:00 p.m. of the day preceding a day designated by the director for basic garbage collection service at that location.

Basic garbage collection service shall commence at 7:00 a.m. on the day designated by the director. It shall be unlawful to place or allow to remain any materials at the curbline on a designated collection day after department collection service personnel have passed the site for that day, and the department shall not have any obligation to return to collect items not present at the curbline when the department vehicle serviced the site.

The violation of any such provision shall be punishable upon first conviction by a fine of \$50-\$2000, if convicted for a first offense, and \$250-\$2000 EACH DAY for subsequent convictions.

It is the resident's responsibility to stop the practice of their lawn services, (who often "do yards" in BV on Thursdays and Fridays), leaving bagged lawn debris sitting on the curb, frequently too early or too late, in violation of the City Ordinance above.

> IT IS AGAINST THE LAW To set trash on the curb at the wrong times.

Weeds and Trimmings and Things in the Street

Lawn maintenance is a lot more than just moving the grass and edging near concrete sidewalks and driveways.

You are required to also keep weeds and grass runners from growing in flower beds and the cracks of your driveway and sidewalk. Pull them, weed eat them, or use an herbicide, but don't ignore them - they make your home look unkempt, regardless of how manicured the lawn is.

After you mow and edge, you must also clean up any trimmings left on all concrete areas. Plug this clean-up into your maintenance time. Often simply using the mower to blow the trimmings back onto the lawn solves the problem, or use a leaf blower or a broom to clean up clippings.

You are the steward of the street in front of your house, especially if you have a storm sewer inlet in the street. Keep leaves, dirt, debris, and litter out of the street. Not only does it look messy, but all that refuse can clog the storm sewer and possibly cause a flood of yours and your neighbors' homes.

Getting Trash Right! Household Waste & Recycling Service for BV 2019

Trash pickup is a major budget item for Briar Village.

Because we are in the City of Houston, we are eligible for the City's trash services once per week. However, the City allows us the option of having a private service, for which they reimburse us \$56,304/YR (our tax dollars). Until October 2018 we paid \$101,760/YR for our private service, when the cost went up substantially to \$150,000/YR. We are still bound by the City's Code of Ordinances that trash cannot be put at the curb before 6 pm the day before trash day. BV's private contract is with VF Waste Services, which is in Briar Village 3 days a week, two picking up trash and one picking up recyclables.

In January 2019 VF distributed new, blue, upright, wheeled recycle containers to each home in BV. Use for recycling only.

- DO NOT USE FOR TRASH ON TUES OR FRI -

Follows is VF Services information.

Household Waste Collection Guidelines

Household waste must be in (up to 8) containers or bags not to exceed forty-five (45) gallons or forty (40) pounds at each residence, curbside.

Tree & Yard Waste Collection Guidelines

Tree and yard waste must be in (no more than 8) containers or in bags not to exceed forty (40) pounds at each residence, curbside, combined with household waste. Tree, shrubs, and brush trimmings must be cut in lengths not to exceed four (4) feet and no greater than eighteen (18) inches in diameter, securely tied in bundles. Tree trunks must be split into quarter sections.

Service Collection Schedule

No earlier than 7:00 am and no later than 6:00 pm.

Curbside Service Days

- [1] Household & Tree/Yard Waste: Tuesday & Friday
- [2] Recycling: Thursday
- [3] Bulk/Heavy Trash: Friday



Confused about trash pickup on holidays?

- VF Observes the following Holidays
- ★ New Years Day
- Labor Day
- Memorial Day
- Thanksgiving Day
- ★ Independence Day
- Christmas Day

If your service day falls on one of the observed holidays, you will be serviced on the next scheduled service day.

Do not put your trash at the curb if it is going to sit there for several days before the next scheduled pick up.



As per the City Ordinance quoted on the preceding page, trash is not to be in view prior to 6:00 p.m. the day before garbage collection. You can be fined.

Bulk/Heavy Trash Collection Guidelines (Friday)

A limit of four (4) items, combined with household and yard waste per week at each residence, curbside.

Accepted Items for Bulk/Heavy Trash (Friday)

Household appliances, furniture, stoves, TVs, sofas, doors etc.; refrigerators must have freon drained and be tagged accordingly by a certified technician; grills must be emptied of ash or briguettes; water heaters must be drained.

Resident-generated construction material not to exceed one (1) cubic yard or thirty-five (35) pounds per container.


BV Annual Maintenance Fees

BV Maintenance Fees of \$543.00 were due January 31, 2019. If yours are not paid, please make arrangements to do so. Contact Graham Management (GMI) at 713-334-8000. Installment payments are accepted. Those with delinquent Maintenance Fees may be denied access to certain community features.

Note: from time-to-time everyone has health or other life issues that prevent timely payment. The courtesy of a brief note or phone call from you to make us aware of your special circumstance(s) is much appreciated and will be kept confidential.

Mis-delivered Mail

If you find mail in your mailbox that was mistakenly delivered to you, but belongs to someone else, follows is what you can do

- Personally deliver it to the correct address, knock on the door and speak to the addressee or put the mail in their mailbox.
- ✓ Put the mail back in your mailbox with the red flag up so the mail carrier will know there is 'outgoing' mail.

In either case – on the outside of the envelope – write "misdelivered on <u>the date</u> to <u>your address</u>" then make an arrow to point at the circle you've made around the correct name and address. This information informs both the intended recipient AND the mail carrier that the error was made and handled as efficiently and as quickly as possible.

Some mail is date sensitive, which cannot be known without opening it, so the date it was mis-delivered may be important to the intended recipient.

Note: simply writing "forward" does nothing for the recipient's peace of mind, nor does it alert the carrier of the error.

Mail Theft in BV

The U.S. Postal Service (USPS) advises:

- Always deposit your mail in a mail slot at your local post office, or hand it to your letter carrier.
- Never send cash or coins in the mail. Use checks or money orders.
- Promptly remove mail from your mailbox after delivery, especially if you're expecting checks, credit cards, or other negotiable items. If you won't be home when the items are expected, ask a trusted friend or neighbor to pick up your mail.

If you observe a vehicle near mailboxes, take down the license plate number and call security. If you are missing mail, report it to the USPS.

Be vigilant and don't be embarrassed to monitor suspicious looking vehicles and people. BV security is everybody's business.

BPCIA Meeting Highlights January 24, 2019

Nine residents attended.

Clubhouse: received 3 bids (\$2,687, \$2,900, \$3,150) to repaint inside Clubhouse; Board decided to have resident volunteers paint it instead, making the cost be for paint and supplies only; painting with new color(s) to be done in March, a slow month for rentals.

Pool/Tennis Courts: windscreens continue to be an issue; replacements are costly; suggestion was to simply remove them if/when their condition deteriorates further. Pool bathhouse renovation should be completed in about 4 weeks.

In December, a runaway driver, who fled the scene, damaged the low stone wall along the pool entry sidewalk, the west corner of the waterfall and dislodged the stone on the SE corner of the women's bathhouse; insurance adjuster set the damage at \$7,000, BPCIA must pay \$1,000 deductible.

Security: November 25th to January 24th, BV had 4 home burglaries and 1 theft from a vehicle, all on the west side of the Bayou. We contracted with our security service for additional, random patrol hours during the holidays. In the future, for New Years Eve and July 4th, we will have our security patrol on late night duty reminding residents that fireworks are illegal in the City of Houston, and contacting HPD as needed. New residents, renters especially, may not know fireworks are not allowed inside city limits. Lost pet signs continue to be removed by an unknown, misguided individual; assistance in identifying this person is requested. If you see anyone removing lost pet signs, contact the BPCIA Security Director immediately.

Activities: Easter Egg Hunt is the next BV event, date tba.


Newsletter: everything is running smoothly.

Architectural Control Committee (ACC)

All improvements visible from the street must have ACC approval BEFORE work starts. Get the ACC Approval Form on the BV Website or from GMI.

Unhappy About Something?

All residents are not going to be completely happy with every



service provider in BV, all the time. It has been Board Policy for years that residents who have an issue are requested to NOT contact our contracted service

providers directly, but to contact the Board Director over any responsibility area, including those we contract with for management, pool services, clubhouse cleaning/rental, common areas maintenance, security, etc.

For example, if you have a complaint or concern about the security service, direct it to the BPCIA Board Director over security, NOT to the security service.

Additionally, if you have any BV-related issue, it is generally best to contact the Board Director over that area first, before calling GMI, or posting on the BV Website Message Board.

Website: is running smoothly, participation continues to increase. Residents still want the Message Board set up differently, so new posts are easily seen.

Deed Restrictions: violation notices sent since December 6, 2018, 54 1st letters, 31 2nd letters, 3 3rd letters.

ACC: 8 requests received, 5 approved, 2 pending, 1 denied.

Financial: maintenance fees for 2018 collection rate = 97%.

Open Forum: a resident presented a well-composed document addressing the need for "No Fireworks" "Fireworks Prohibited" signs at our entries, and asking for increased attention to the illegal, widespread, and lengthy use of fireworks all around BV on New Year's Eve and July 4th. A resident asked that the Board be more active in addressing the continual abuse of trash in view at the wrong times, which was particularly intense over the recent holiday season. resident asked that going forward Board Members use only the BV Website to post information pertinent to BV, because when various websites are used, important information is diffused or missed by residents who have the need to know. A resident also reiterated that postings self promoting/seeking personal profit are not allowed on the BV Website's Message Board; you may offer the name of a good repairman for example, but he is not allowed to post his own information; you may offer things for sale, such as a coffee table (items you might sell in a garage sale) but you may not post items you sell as a business or side business, jewelry or craft items for example.
