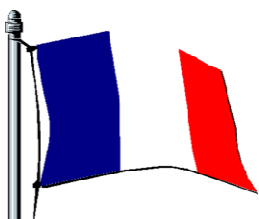
May 8th is WWII Victory Day in France Cinco de Mayo? Not this year. Instead, let's join the French!

WWII Victory Day (la fete de la victoire, le jour de la liberation) is a holiday to celebrate the end of World War II and the French people's freedom. It is the anniversary of when Charles de Gaulle, leader of the Free French Forces announced the end of World War II in France on May 8, 1945. Church bells rang in celebration, probably including the bells of the Notre Dame Cathedral. The announcement marked the end of a 6 year war, and the Nazi oppression in France, which resulted in many, many deaths.

Before May 8th, schools, colleges and universities focus on this history to ensure that all generations know what happened in the war and why it is important to preserve everyone's rights in modern society.

It is a public holiday and a day off for the general population; schools and most businesses are closed. People celebrate by attending parades and church services. They sing patriotic songs and display their flag on homes and public buildings. The mood is joyous, but people make time to remember those who died in WW II. Veterans of WWII used to play an important role in celebrations, but now their advanced age prevents most of them from participating.

The national flag of France is tricolor, blue, white and red in 3 equal width vertical stripes, it was adopted on February 15, 1794. The flag was designed after a cockade (a knot of colored ribbons on the Parisian Militia's hats) worn during the French Revolution, 1789 – 1799. The American Revolution ended in 1781, France's support of our Revolution was instrumental in our success. Many say our USA Revolution was an inspiration for the Revolution in France.

One year ago we changed website providers Time to set that straight! New Proposal!

The Nabr Website through Graham Management has been given a very fair trial of one entire year. From the beginning many residents weren't pleased with the change. Many thought to give the new website a chance, which we did.

After an entire year, the shortcomings of the Nabr Website are glaringly obvious. A resident group has prepared a proposal to change website providers, which should be on the agenda for the May 23rd BPCIA monthly meeting.

Some features of the proposed, new website. There are more, these are highlights.

- Only the name Briar Village will be at the top of web pages. We will no longer be tied to Graham – or some other management company – for access to our website. Messages will be sorted with new messages / posts at the top, no more hunting to find new messages. Message length is unlimited. (Nabr's length is 500 characters.) We will again have private messaging. Nabr doesn't offer it. We will have the option for like/dislike, thumbs up or thumbs down on each post. We will have automated reservation and payment features. Navigation tabs for pages makes finding things easy, no hidden pull down menus. Photos are easy to load on the Message Board, with a choice of 3 sizes. Photos of activities, Swim Team or Yard of the Month are completely sizable. Nabr limits size of these photos to small. We have unlimited choices of formatting, fonts, colors for our web pages. Nabr has set templates we have to use. The established website provider is local and offers us training as well as the ability to make changes or improvements to our website as we want or need them at nominal cost (sometimes no charge). Nabr is out of town and offers us nothing outside their pre-designed package. Nabr is not receptive to changes or improvements. Yearly cost of \$365 is significantly less than Nabr's \$688

This past year many long-time BV website users have quit because they don't like the Nabr Website; and more and more residents have left the BV Nabr Website and gone to websites such as Next Door. One lady's dogs were out at 11:00 pm, she posted it on Next Door, but got no response. Meanwhile, her dogs were seen by someone who only looks at the Nabr Website. Another lady posted a found dog on the Nabr Website, then joined Next Door only to find the owner's post for a lost dog there! Some residents have even posted questions and comments about how our neighborhood functions, and other BV things, on a local realtor's Facebook page!

Before we changed to Nabr, we all knew, understood and used our Briar Village Website, which was started in 2003. It worked very well for about 15 years. Our communication then was phenomenal, but it isn't any more, it is fractured. We need to get back to what we had that worked for us, especially for security purposes.

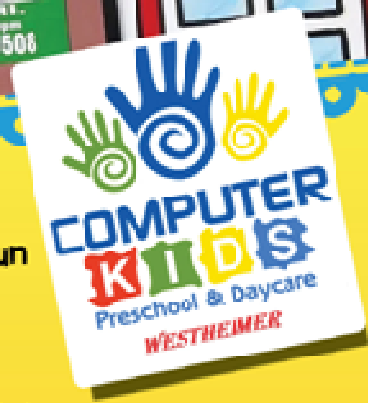
**Our Story**

### You can directly report a litterer!

Even after more than 30 years of the Don't mess with Texas® campaign, litterbugs still roam the roadways, tossing trash from their car windows and letting litter fly out of their truck beds. We're talking about cigarette butts, fast food wrappers, and the like. They're small, but they're still trash.

#### Here's what to do.

1. Keep all hands in the vehicle and take some notes. When you see litter thrown or flying out of a vehicle, intentionally or accidentally, take down the following information: license plate number, make and color of vehicle, date and time, location, who tossed the litter, and what was tossed.

Then go to the Don't Mess With Texas Website, the "Get Involved" section and fill in the below blanks on the website; be as accurate as possible and submit:

- ✓ Texas License Plate Number (Texas Plate Only)\*
  - ✓ Make and Model of Vehicle\*
  - ✓ Date\*
  - ✓ Time in Hour and Minute\*
  - ✓ Location\*
  - ✓ What was tossed\*
  - ✓ Comments
  - ✓ Who tossed it?\* Driver Passenger Truck Bed
- \* Indicates a required field.

#### 2. Now what happens?

TxDOT compares the information through the Department of Motor Vehicles registration database, and when an exact match is located, we send the litterer a Don't mess with Texas litterbag along with a letter reminding them to keep their trash off of our roads.



And you can feel good about doing something to clean up our beloved Lone Star State. Visit their website and be surprised with what is there to see!

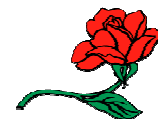
### Memorial Day – May 27th

Memorial Day is observed on the last Monday of May. It was formerly known as Decoration Day and commemorates all men and women who have died in military service for the United States.



*Memorial Day was first celebrated May 30, 1868 by placing flowers on the graves of more than 20,000 Union and Confederate soldiers buried in Arlington National Cemetery.*

*May 30<sup>th</sup> was the original date chosen for "Decoration Day" because flowers would be in bloom all over the country.*

### 2019 All new Access Cards required for Tennis Courts and Pool

The access control system for the tennis courts, pool and clubhouse was updated, requiring all cards from the previous system to be swapped for new Access Cards.

**Note:**  
**There is no additional fee to simply swap your old card for a new one.**



**First time cards are \$25 each, limit 2, see ordering details on the order form.**

The order form is on the BV Website under Resources, Forms (Downloadable), from GMI, and in previous Newsletters.

You may swap your card(s) at the GMI office, see below. You may also mail your old card(s) in with the completed form, and new card(s) will be mailed back to you; however, there is no guarantee of receipt for cards that are mailed.

If you have never had a card and would like to purchase one, please complete the form and either bring it to the GMI office, or mail it in with the payment for the card(s) to be mailed back to you.

You must be current with Annual Maintenance Fees to be eligible to have card(s) replaced. Residents with a past due balance must first pay their balance before a new card will be issued.

### BPCIA Meeting Highlights – April 25, 2019

Deed Restriction Violations: 1<sup>st</sup> letter = 72; 2<sup>nd</sup> letter = 36; 3<sup>rd</sup> letter = 7. ACC approvals: 10 submitted, 4 approved, 6 pending.

### Deed Restriction Violations (DRV)

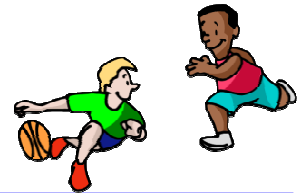
