

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
BV Annual Halloween Party Oct 27, 2018

Diwali – November 7, 2018 Very Important Holiday of India

This festival is as important to Hindus as the Christmas holiday is to Christians.

Diwali, or Dipawali, is India's biggest and most important holiday of the year. The festival gets its name from the row (avali) of clay lamps (deepa) that Indians light outside their homes to symbolize the inner light that protects from spiritual darkness.

Over the centuries, Diwali has become a national festival that is enjoyed by most Indians regardless of faith: Hindus, Jains, Buddhists, and Sikhs.



Hindus interpret the Diwali story based upon where they live. In northern India they celebrate the story of King Rama's return to Ayodhya after he defeated Ravana by lighting rows of clay lamps. Southern India celebrates it as the day that Lord Krishna defeated the demon Narakasura. In western India the festival marks the day that

Lord Vishnu, the Preserver (one of the main gods of the Hindu trinity) sent the demon King Bali to rule the nether world.

In all interpretations, one common thread rings true - the festival marks the victory of good over evil.

Non-Hindu communities have other reasons for celebrating the holiday: In Jainism, it marks the nirvana or spiritual awakening of Lord Mahavira on October 15, 527 B.C. In Sikhism it marks the day that Guru Hargobind Ji, the Sixth Sikh Guru was freed from imprisonment.

The Five Days of Diwali

On the first day of Diwali, people consider it auspicious to spring clean the home and shop for gold or kitchen utensils.

On the second day, people decorate their homes with clay lamps and create design patterns called *rangoli* on the floor using colored powders or sand.

The third day is the main day of the festival when families gather together for *Lakshmi puja*, a prayer to Goddess Lakshmi followed by mouth-watering feasts and firework festivities.

The fourth day is the first day of the new year when friends and relatives visit with gifts and best wishes for the season.

On the last day of Diwali, brothers visit their married sisters who welcome them with love and a lavish meal.


Utility Construction in BV

Currently part of BV is getting new underground gas lines. The lines used to run in the easement at the back of properties, but lines are being moved to the front easement. Minimal visible digging is involved. All utility lines are marked with different colors, as detailed below. In the United States, the American Public Works Association (APWA) Uniform Color Codes for temporary marking of underground utilities are:

Red	electric power lines, cables, conduit, and lighting cables
Orange	telecommunication, alarm or signal lines, cables, or conduit
Yellow	natural gas, oil, steam, petroleum, or other gaseous or flammable material
Green	sewers and drain lines
Blue	drinking water
Purple	reclaimed water, irrigation, and slurry lines
Pink	temporary survey markings, unknown/unidentified facilities
White	proposed excavation limits or route

Some municipalities use pink paint to make lines and codes on the pavements related to required street improvements such as ramp replacement, asphalt grinding and form injection. These markings are not related to utility locating.

As of 2016, according to the spokesperson for the Hindus of Greater Houston, there were about 120,000 Hindus in the Houston area. In 1969 the first Hindu institution, ISKCON Houston of the Hare Krishnas, opened, and in the following decade there was an increase in Houston's Hindus. The original Hindu places of worship in the Houston area were private residences; later dedicated buildings opened in the area.

Just south of Briar Village is the Nithyanandeshwara Hindu Temple at 14140 Westheimer. This temple opened in early 2017.

BPCIA Meeting Highlights – October 25, 2018

Common Areas: all but one of the four "No Soliciting" signs had been installed. The Free Little Library is complete.

Clubhouse: awaiting bids to repair siding. Approved bid from AIC Security for camera for new Brivo system.

Pool/Tennis Courts: Eric Newman will re-hang one windscreen. Pool bathhouse renovation has begun, the target for completion is 90 days; a change order to this contract for \$165,694 was approved.

Security: on 10/17/18 at 11pm there was a breaking and entering in the 14200 block of Wickersham. Super Neighborhood reported a substantial increase in thefts from unlocked vehicles in driveways, typically between 2-5am. Some vandalism/destruction of mailboxes and mail theft. Citizen Patrol is going well, one new member was added last month; ongoing training for new members held at the HPD Westside Command Station.

Activities: Holiday social gathering on 12/2 from 1-4 pm; it is also an opportunity for craft vendors to offer their products.

Newsletter: everything is running smoothly. A reminder was given to submit articles by the 3rd Friday of each month.

Website: is running smoothly, participation continues to increase. A web page was added for progress updates on the bathhouse renovation.

Deed Restrictions: violation notices sent since September 27th, 42 1st letters, 12 2nd letters, 4 3rd letters, and 7 "nice yard" letters were sent.

ACC: 11 requests received, 5 approved, 3 pending, 2 denied. To streamline the process, the Board created a checklist for Graham Management to use when initially processing ACC applications. The names of two documents on the BV website will be changed to "Common Paint/Shingle Colors" rather than "Approved Colors" to prevent confusion.

Financial: Operating Funds = \$487,893; Reserve Funds = \$342,835; Accounts Receivable = \$66,890; 2018 collection rate = 97%. The Study about BV's Financial Reserve has been received, the Board is reviewing it.

Open Forum: a resident asked if coyotes have been seen in BV. No one on the Board has seen coyotes, but they have heard them.

Board Elections in Early February 2019 Is this the year you decide to get involved?

In 2019 three director positions are up for re-election and one director will be resigning mid-term, so we'll need a volunteer to complete the one year left on that term.

Request for biographical data will go out in December for all candidates, so they can be included in the mailing with the Annual Proxy, then the election takes place at the Annual Meeting in early February.

After the Annual Meeting all the Directors meet and decide amongst themselves who will fill the various officer and director positions.

Please give it some thought, as we need new people to share their time and talents keeping our neighborhood the special place it always has been.

BV Deed Restrictions and City Ordinances are very clear that the keeping of fowl is NOT allowed, but...this brazen guy is happily living in the Briarview-Locke Lane area. Residents claim he is wild and doesn't bother anyone.



He somehow eludes the coyotes, so he must be a smart rooster, but is he smart enough to not crow at the crack of dawn? They are hard-wired to do that. If this guy belongs to someone, who doesn't know, here's the Deed Restriction:

Animal Husbandry

No animals, livestock or poultry of any kind shall be raised, bred or kept on any lot except that dogs, cats or other common household pets may be kept provided that they are not kept, bred or maintained for commercial purposes.

Here's the fowl excerpt from City Ordinance Section 6.31: It is unlawful, except as provided in sections 6-33 and 6-34 of this Code, for any person to keep, possess or maintain in the city any chickens...

Architectural Control Committee (ACC)

All improvements visible from the street must have ACC approval BEFORE work starts. Get the ACC Approval Form on the BV Website or from GMI.

Deed Restriction Violations (DRV)

Please review your Deed Restrictions, which are on the BV Website. If you receive a DRV Letter, please take it seriously, but please do not take it personally. The best course of action is to simply fix the problem and move on.

If you are uncomfortable in any manner with a letter you received, please feel welcome to contact us or GMI - our management company - to discuss it.
