WHAT IS NIA?

- The Neighborhood Improvement Assoc. (NIA) was formed in 2003 to empower community residents through the stimulation of economic growth.

- Illegal Dumping Campaign -

Beginning in 2015, the campaign targets illegal dumping in the Trenton community. Illegal Dumping is immense amounts of garbage that is disposed outside of a landfill or designated waste facility, usually to avoid disposal fees and save time and effort. Common items dumped are construction materials, electronics, appliances, medical waste, furniture, and abandoned vehicle parts and tires. Illegal dumping poses a number of threats to the city, environment, wildlife, and citizens, in addition to creating other long-term issues. For more information, visit niaofni.org/illegal-dumping.

- City of Trenton's Redevelopment Project -

Trenton is overwhelmed with dilapidated housing, neighborhood disinvestment, absentee landlords, and abandoned and boarded up properties that continue to distress the community. Our project goals are to assist the City of Trenton in creating new, affordable housing, repair, renovate and redevelop existing houses or buildings, improve sidewalks, light fixtures, and landscaping, improve hard structures such as roads, curbs, street furniture, and create community resources and educational hubs, such as a garden, community center, and outdoor activities.
