We encourage all horse owners to familiarize themselves with biosecurity practices when attending any horse event. We reserve the right to require a negative Coggins test if directed by government agencies.

General Rules

1. The show will follow the rule book of The Heritage Circuit Handbook (Saskatchewan Horse Federation) unless specifically stated otherwise.

- 2. The organizing committee reserves the right to decide any point not covered in the rules, and to correct any error or make any alterations that may be necessary in the prize list.
- 3. Class order is subject to change and times are set as guidelines only. Classes with three or less entries may be combined or cancelled.
- 4. Show Fees must be received the Stampede Office 7 days after entry has been made. A Statement of Account will be sent to the exhibitor. Fees may be paid by online by credit card at time of entry, or by mail or in person by cheque, money order, cash or credit card authorization to cover all entry and stabling fees. If you are sending by mail consider the amount of time needed. E-Transfers cannot be accepted as a form of payment. _NSF cheques will result in a \$50.00 service charge
- 5. Show entry is not accepted and a competitor will not be allowed to compete until all entry fees have been paid in full.
- Exhibitors cancelling their entries after the official closing date, but prior to the start of the show, shall be refunded all fees only upon presentation of a valid veterinary certificate or medical letter. Non-veterinary cancellations or scratches will not be refunded.
- 7. If the competitor is under 18 years of age, the waiver must be signed by the competitor and parent or guardian. The waiver must be in the hands of the show secretary before rider packages will be given to the exhibitor.
- 8. The presentation and signing of your entry form shall be deemed acceptance of these rules and absolves the All-Breed Horse Show Committee and the Medicine Hat Exhibition & Stampede Co. of responsibility or liability.
- 9. Helmet policy: All youth under 18, as of January 1st of the current year are required to wear an ASTM/SEI approved helmet when participating in any event sanctioned by the Saskatchewan Horse Federation.

Dressage

- 10. Regardless of the level one is competing at, all junior riders in both the English and Western dressage must wear an approved helmet. Sr Riders are required to wear an approved helmet in English Dressage but is optional in Western Dressage Classes, a Western Hat may be worn.
- 11. Western Dressage classes will follow the rules and use the 2024 tests of the WSDAC. These can be found at www.westernstyledressage.ca/wsdac-tests-%26-rules-1.
- 12. Dressage classes will use the 2023 Equestrian Canada Tests (USEF tests). These can be found at www.equestrian.ca/sport/dressage/tests.
- 13. Dressage will be ridden in the grandstand arena. The sand arena will be used for warm up.
- 14. Dressage Schooling will be available in the Sand Ring for the duration of the Show. Schooling in the Grandstand arena will be announced when ride times are posted.
- 15. Dressage competitors must supply their own readers.
- 16. Dressage classes at the Introductory, Training and Basic may be split into Junior and Senior riders if the number of entries warrant a split. Only one Championship and Reserve Championship will be awarded for each level.
- 17. For both English and Western Dressage divisions, a horse may compete in any two (2), but only two, consecutive levels, and a maximum of four (4) tests per day (combined English and Western). It is the rider's responsibility to make sure they do not exceed the allowed number of tests per day per horse.
- 18. **One rider may show in no more than 8 Dressage Tests per day**. Once entries close, if there are open times Riders entered in the show may have the opportunity to enter additional classes.
- 19. Dressage entries are limited to 50 tests, a maximum of eight hours per day.

General Performance

20. In the Halter classes, no exhibitor may present more than one horse to the judge in the same halter class. If an exhibitor has more than one horse they would like to show in the same halter class, a different exhibitor must be named. The horse's number will remain the same. The exhibitor can be named as "Unknown" on the entry form;

however, the show office MUST be notified of who the unknown handler will be before the show office closes on Friday July 19, 2024. All exhibitors, including unknown exhibitors named the evening before the class, MUST be in proper show attire, have completed a liability waiver, and hold a current membership with their provincial governing body. That exhibitor will show the horse the class; there can be no exchanging of horses in the show arena by exhibitors.

- 21. Ranch Horse Classes will follow the 2024 AQHA book for Ranch Horse Classes, and use the AQHA patterns for Ranch Riding.
- 22. Freestyle Reining Entries are limited to 10 due to time. The class will follow the NRHA handbook, nrha.com/media/pdf/handbook/2023/freestylereining.pdf. Class requirements will be posted on the show's website page.
- 23. Pee Wee Division Open to riders 3-8 years of age. Classes are Showmanship, Trail and Pleasure/Horsemanship. Riders are to be lead and can have assistance in Showmanship. Assistant or person leading the rider must be the parent or Adult responsible for the Rider, be able to control the horse, be dressed in proper attire with safe footwear, complete Riders Waiver and have a Provincial Membership.
- 24. Walk Trot classes are divided into two categories; Short Stirrup riders 14 years and under; Rookie Riders 15 years and over. These classes are intended for riders or horses who are new to the show ring and not yet ready to lope or canter. Riders entered in Walk/Trot classes may not cross enter into any classes which required a rider to lope or canter. With the exception of Barrels and Pole Bending.
- 25. Green Horse classes are offered for horses or Riders in their first year of showing. These classes are open to horses of any age with limited exposure to the show ring. Horses will be expected to walk, jog/trot, and lope/canter. Horses may enter classes in other divisions they qualify for, except for walk/trot classes.
- 26. Junior horses are five years old or younger as of January 1, 2024. Junior horses may be shown two-handed in a snaffle bit or in a bosal.
- 27. Novice Reining is open to any horse or rider that are new to the sport of Reining. May not cross enter into Jr. Rider or Sr. Rider Reining Class. Modified pattern maybe used.
- 28. Exhibitors may ride more than one horse in classes requiring only individual work: up to 3 horses in an individually Judged class. Except for Freestyle Reining, Ranch Trail and Ranch Riding, where a maximum of 2 horses maybe exhibited by one Rider, and Ranch Cutting and Ranch Horse Boxing where an exhibitor may only enter one horse per class.
- 29. Horses liable to kick must be identified with a red ribbon in their tail.
- 30. An unruly horse may be excused from the ring at the discretion of the judge.
- 31. Any exhibitor using the wrong number in the ring, or having no number, will be disqualified.
- 32. If a tack change is needed, the hitching ring must be notified prior to the class to have the gate held. The gate will be held for no more than 10 minutes.
- 33. Stallions may be exhibited by a rider of senior age, and the rider must be able to manage the stallion on the grounds and in the class, or they will be excused.
- 34. Dogs must be always kept on a leash and are NOT allowed in the hitching ring.
- 35. Any protest or complaint must be made in writing and must be submitted to the show secretary, along with a \$50.00 cheque, within one hour of the completion of the class or incident in question. A protest must contain a specific statement of an alleged violation of a rule or a condition of a class. It must provide the full name of the alleged violator. The appointed protest subcommittee will review the protest and determine a ruling based on the rules and regulations under which the show is sanctioned. Their decision shall be made within six hours and their decision shall be final.

Exhibitor Age Categories

All ages are as of January 1, 2024. Year of birth as noted on birth certificate determines competition age.

PeeWee Lead Line: Open to children 3-8 years old. Be able to sit in the saddle with feet in stirrups and hold reins. May not cross enter in any other class.

Short Stirrup: 14 years and under. Walk and jog/trot only. May not cross enter in lead line or any riding class that will require a lope/canter.

Rookie Rider or Horse: Rider 15 years and over. Walk and jog/trot only. May not cross enter in any riding class that will require a lope/canter.

Junior C: 11 years and under (2012 or later)

Junior B: 12-14 years old (2009-2011) Junior A: 15-17 years old (2006-2008) Senior: 18 years and over (2005 or earlier)

Nifty Fifty+: 50 years and over (1973 or earlier). A Senior competitor may cross enter the Nifty Fifty+ classes if they

meet the age requirement.

Jackpot Classes: \$25.00 per class, Entry fee added to the payout.

PeeWee Classes: \$8.00 (entry into Pee Wee Showmanship, PeeWee Leadline Trail, Pee Wee Horsemanship and Chil-

dren's Costume class)

Pairs Classes: Each competitor must pay an entry fee. Post entries accepted with no late fee. **Ranch Cutting Open**: \$200.00 (Cattle Fees \$135.00, \$50.00 add back, \$15.00 transport fee.)

Ranch Cutting \$250 Limit Rider: \$200.00 (Cattle Fees \$135.00, \$50.00 add back, \$15.00 transport fee.)

Ranch Horse Boxing Open: \$125.00 (Cattle Fees \$60.00, \$50.00 add back, \$15.00 transport fee.)

Ranch Horse Boxing \$250 Limit Rider: \$125.00 (Cattle Fees \$60.00, \$50.00 add back, \$15.00 transport

Ranch Horse Boxing Youth: \$ 75.00 (Riders 17 and under)

Post Entries: Any entries received after Sunday July 14, 2024, will be considered late. A late fee of \$25.00 will be charged per horse, class fees will remain the same. Post entries can be made at the show office up to 7pm the evening before the class. Except for Ranch Cutting/ Boxing,

Office Fee: \$10.00 per a horse charged once (if two riders are using the same horse only one office fee is charged)

Cypress Circuit Fee: \$5.00 per horse/rider combination and is forwarded to the Cypress Horse Show Circuit. There is no GST added to this fee.

GST will be added to the total of the show fees.

Awards

Ribbons will be awarded 1^{st} - 5^{th} in all classes. Prize money will be paid in all performance, halter, and gymkhana classes as follows: 1^{st} - \$20.00, 2^{nd} - \$15.00, 3^{rd} - \$10.00, 4^{th} - \$ 5.00.

Jackpot Western and English Pleasure Classes Purse will start with \$100.00 Each entry fee of \$25.00 will be added to the payout.

The pot will be Split as follows:

English Pleasure Stake: 1^{st} – 50%, 2^{nd} – 30%, 3^{rd} – 20% Western Pleasure Stake: 1^{st} – 50%, 2^{nd} – 30%, 3^{rd} – 20%

If entries exceed 15 the pot will be Split as follows

English Pleasure Stake: $1^{st} - 40\%$, $2^{nd} - 30\%$, $3^{rd} - 20\%$, $4^{th} - 10\%$, Western Pleasure Stake: $1^{st} - 40\%$, $2^{nd} - 30\%$, $3^{rd} - 20\%$, $4^{th} - 10\%$,

In Dressage: Should there be only one competitor in the class, the following scores must be achieved to receive a placing: $1^{st} - 60\%$ or higher, $2^{nd} - 57-59.9\%$, $3^{rd} - 54-56.9\%$, $4^{th} - 51-53.0\%$. No ribbons will be awarded for a score less than 51%.

Dressage Champion and Reserve Champion: will be awarded to top two horse/rider combinations with the highest and second highest combined score achieved from their 3 best scores in that division of the two days. If there are less than 3 riders in a division, two divisions can be combined for an award to be presented.

Dressage Hi Score. There will be one awarded for Western Dressage and one awarded for Dressage, using the highest scores percentage wise between Basic through Level 4 (open Class) The following handy cap will be used to determine the high Score, horse/rider combination and must compete in a test that requires all gaits to qualify for the High Score, only your top scoring test (by percentage) will qualify for the award.

The levels offered and their point handicap include:

Basic or Training Level – 0 points Level 3 or Third Level –6.0 points (open class)
Level 1 or First Level -- 2.0 points Level 4 or Fourth Level 8.0 points (open class)

Level 2 or Second Level -- 4.0 points (open class)

High Point Awards

All High point Awards are based on a Horse-Rider Combination, A rider does not have to compete in all the classes to qualify for the award. The awards will be presented to the Horse Rider combination that has accumulated the most points in the qualifying classes listed under each age division

New this year is the All Around Champion Award.

An All Around Buckle will be awarded in each age category Sr., Jr A, Jr. B, and Jr. C., to the Horse-Rider accumulation of the most points in the Western High Point Classes, English High Point Classes, Ranch Horse Classes (excluding the Cattle Classes), Pole Bending and Barrel Racing.

A Western High Point will be awarded to the Horse-Rider accumulating the most points in Showmanship, Horsemanship, Western Pleasure, Trail and Reining.

English High Point will be awarded to the Horse-Rider accumulating the most points in English Pleasure, Equitation, Road Hack and Show Hack.

Arriving, Unloading, Parking and Camping

To enter on to the Medicine Hat Exhibition Grounds, arrive by the Cuyler Road gates (see map). Unload horses and tack at Barn 7. Once you are unloaded, move your truck and trailer to the infield. Access to the infield is north of the Cuyler Road entrance. Cross the track at that gate. There is ample parking for vehicles without trailers also in the infield. Vehicles will be towed that are in the no parking areas. Please remember there is activity happening on the grounds outside of the Arena – setup is ongoing for the Medicine Hat Exhibition and Stampede.

There is plenty of room for camping in the infield and the campground will be open for camping this year. **No electrical** hookups however there is water available, and the washrooms will be open.
