CLASSIFICATIONS OF PRAIRIE CROCUS COMPETITIONS

Prairie Crocus Competitions are sanctioned by Manitoba Horse Council, riders must:

- a) Have a Westman Dressage Membership, Dressage Winnipeg Membership, Pony Club Membership, Dressage membership from another province (e.g. Regina and District Dressage Association and Saskatoon Dressage Association), a Manitoba Horse Trials Membership, or Prairie Sport Horse Association membership.
- b) Have a Manitoba Horse Council Membership or other provincial membership (required for insurance coverage purposes; please provide a copy)
- c) When registering, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Your horse:
 - a) The horse's owner must be a member of Manitoba Horse Council or the Provincial Horse Organization where they are from for insurance purposes.
 - b) Must have a negative coggins test in the last 6 months. Proof of negative coggins test provided prior to arriving on site.
 - c) All horses must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be asked to leave event site at the discretion of Competition Management. Proof of vaccinations must be provided with entry.

Prize List:

When there is only **one horse** in the class, placings shall be awarded in accordance with the follow chart of percentages: 1st place: 60% or higher, 2nd place: 57%-59.9%, 3rd place: 54% - 56.9%, 4th place: 51% - 53.9%

Jackpot Rules:

Please ride your level.

- If you score 68% you must ride one test up at the next Jackpot, if you score over 72% you must go up one level at the next Jackpot.
- Only your top scoring test will qualify for payout.
- Only one payout for a horse/rider combination per day.
- The levels offered and their point handicap include:
 - Introductory / Training / Basic 0 points
 - Level 1 4.0 points
 - Level 2 6.0 points
 - Level 3 8.0 points
 - \circ Level 4 10.0 points
 - These points will be added to your highest total score; then it will be divided to create the percentage.
 Riders will be placed based on percentage.
- Payout per day
 - Wildcard = 20%
 - Will be drawn the afternoon/evening of the competition.
 - 1st place = 25%
 - \circ 2nd place = 20
 - 3d place = 15%
 - \circ 4th place = 10%
 - \circ 5th place = 5%
 - Last place if score is over 50% = 5%

GENERAL RULES & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY FOR WESTMAN DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS

ENTRIES: Copies of all membership cards must be e-mailed to the show secretary prior to the show to validate your entries. For subsequent shows in which you enter, this will not be necessary. If you do not have your membership proof, you will not be allowed to show. Westman Dressage accepts Dressage Winnipeg or Manitoba Pony club memberships, membership with Manitoba Horse Trials, memberships from dressage clubs based in other provinces (for competitors coming from out of province), or the Prairie Sport Horse Association in lieu of a Westman Dressage membership (a Westman Dressage membership can be purchased with registration for the show or go to https://westmandressage.com/membership-application/). You will need a PTSO membership to show. To apply for a MHC Manitoba Horse (MHC) membership go to https://manitobahorsecouncil.ca/Member-Benefits.

NO PHONE OR LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED: All entries must be accompanied by a Waiver of Liability duly signed by the appropriate person (athlete, owner, parent/guardian, Person Responsible) and dated (if you entered online a hard copy must be signed at the show office on Friday). All entries must be accompanied by the appropriate fees. Parent or guardians must sign for junior exhibitors. Failure to do so will result in an inability to participate in the show. If the show fills up a wait list will be created, and you will be contacted if a spot comes available and you will be allowed to enter even if it is after the entry deadline.

EMERGENCY PLAN: In case of an injury to a spectator, athlete or horse, the announcer will call for an immediate halt in all rings. All stabled horses shall remain in that location until further notice, vehicle traffic is requested to refrain from moving. **Amberlee Brownlie is our designated EMO with First Aid Training. Please refer to Westman Dressage's Emergency Action Plan.**

Medication Rules: Medication rules are in place to ensure competition safety, a level playing field, and to protect the welfare of the equine. For information regarding medication control, please refer to Equestrian Canada Rule Book Section 10 (see p. 8 of the 2024 Prairie Crocus Competition handbook).

DAILY Horse Temperatures: Competitors stabling their horses at the Keystone Centre will be required to take the horse's temperature twice daily (AM & PM) and post on the results on the chart. The chart will be located on the horse's stall. This will be monitored by the steward. **Please remember to bring your own horse thermometer**. For additional information please see last page of prize list and the Emergency Action Plan.

COGGINS TEST: a negative coggins test result, completed within the last 6 months, is required. Proof of negative coggins test provided prior to arriving on site. (see Article A809)

VACCINATIONS: You will need to provide proof of vaccination with your entry (receipt showing purchase of vaccine or vet certificate of vaccination).

CANCELLATIONS: Competitors cancelling after the official closing date will only be refunded entry fees and stabling costs (unless stall has been used), minus the administration fee and deposit, upon receipt of a veterinarian's certificate of disability or a doctor's certificate. Documentation with an accompanying letter of explanation must reach the Show Secretary within 30 days of the last day of the competition. A \$50 non-refundable deposit will be collected at the time of entry to secure a spot in the show. This deposit will be applied to the entry fee if the entry is not cancelled. The deposit must be received by the show secretary within 7 days of receiving the entry for the spot to be held.

SUBSTITUTION FEES: There will be a \$10 administration fee for substituting a horse and/or athlete show entry after closing date. All appropriate waivers must be signed and memberships in place.

REPORTING FOR COMPETITION: Competitors arriving on the show grounds should report to the show office to confirm that all is in order with your entry forms and classes and to pick up your show numbers. The number of individuals in the show office at one time will be limited. This is expected even if you are using your own numbers. For security reasons, we need to know which horses are on the grounds and ensure that we have the correct contact information. The show office will be open from 11:00 AM until after 8:00 PM on Friday and opens one-half hour before the show starts on Saturday and Sunday. For those arriving Friday afternoon, please report to the show office as soon as you arrive. You can arrive starting at 11:00 AM on Friday. You must leave the Keystone Centre by 9:00 PM on Sunday. Contact the show office by calling 204-724-9202.

Prairie Crocus Competition – Competitor dress and tack rules

10.3 Rider Apparel

10.3.1 Safety Headgear

- a. It is mandatory that the protective headgear meets the ASTM/SEI, BSI/BS, EN, AS/NZS or CE VG1 01.040 2014-12 (provided they are BSI Kitemarked) standard at any MHC sanctioned Prairie Crocus competition.
 - i. NOTE: at a tack check following the test, the steward may ask the rider to dismount so that the helmet may be inspected.

10.3.2 Boots

- **a.** Riders must wear dark or colour coordinated riding boots (plain, laced or with zippers) with a heel (tall boots or jodhpur/paddock boots).
- **b.** Half chaps may be worn with paddock boots if they are of matching colour to the boots, are without decoration of any sort, and are well-fitted.
- c. Juniors are permitted to wear jodhpurs and jodhpur boots.

10.3.3 Breeches/Jodhpurs Breeches or jodhpurs must be worn. White, light or dark coloured breeches or jodhpurs with jodhpur boots may be worn; bright colours or patterns are not permitted. Contrast piping is allowed.

10.3.4 Shirts/Jackets

- **a.** Shirts may be long or short sleeved with a collar. Contrasting collars, points, piping, or crystal decorations are allowed. Tie, bow tie, hunting stock or choker may be of any colour.
- **b.** Short jackets, cutaway with short tails, or tailored dressage vests, may be single colour with subtle pin-striping, check or tweeds. Striped or multicoloured jackets are not permitted. Tasteful and discreet accents such as a collar of a different hue, modest piping, or crystal decoration are acceptable.
- c. Safety vests, including an inflatable vest that is attached to the saddle, are permitted provided they conform to the rules governing jacket colours.

10.3.5 Gloves

a. Gloves must be worn at all times when mounted or lunging, and should be white, light-coloured, or any solid colour.

10.4 Spurs

- a. Spurs are optional at all levels but must be a matched pair of conservative colour.
- b. Spurs must be metal and have smooth arms, although plastic knobbed (Impuls spurs) are allowed.
 - i. The shank of the spur must be straight or slightly curved down, point backwards and must be centered on the arms.
 - ii. The neck may be curved directly back, but not upwards or in towards the horse. Exception: swan neck spurs are allowed, as are dummy spurs with smooth arms and no shanks.
- c. Protective bands that keep spurs in place are permitted.
- d. Rowels must point directly back from the center of the spur and be vertical. If rowels are used, they must be blunt/smooth and free to rotate.
 - i. Spurs with horizontal rowels are prohibited.
 - ii. Metal spurs with rotating knobs or balls are permitted and they can rotate vertically or horizontally.
- e. Any spur found to be sharp by the tack check steward must be removed and may be replaced with an appropriate spur.

- f. Use of illegal spurs anywhere on the competition grounds will result in elimination.
- g. Acceptable spur lengths are as follows:
 - i. For adults the maximum spur length is 5 cm.
 - ii. For juniors the maximum spur length is 3.5 cm.

10.5 Whips

- a. Dressage whips may be carried in all levels.
 - i. Exception: whips may not be carried in championship classes.
- b. Ladies riding sidesaddle may always carry a dressage whip.
- c. The total length of the dressage whip (including lash) may not exceed 120 cm. Whips for ponies in all classes may not exceed 100 cm.
- d. A whip must not be used in a way that disturbs other riders and may not be picked up if dropped during a test.
- e. When saluting, the whip, along with the reins, should be taken into one hand. The free hand should be lowered to the rider's side.
- f. Dressage whips are always permitted in the warmup and schooling areas.
- g. Excessive use of a whip at any time while on the competition grounds is forbidden and constitutes abuse. A whip should never be carried or used in a manner that affects other horses.
- h. Telescoping whips are not permitted.
- i. The use of a lunge whip is prohibited except when lunging in a prescribed lunging only warmup area.

Please also see Articles 10.6 - 10.8

See Article 10.9 for other Tack and Equipment (p. 56 of Prairie Crocus Handbook)

NUMBERS: must be worn at all times when out of the stall and visible at all times, including the warmup, schooling and/or exercise areas as well as in the competition rings, whether the horse/pony is under saddle or not. This requirement includes non-competition horses.

SHOW SCHEDULE: Warm-ups in the competition rings will be available on Friday. Competitions generally start between 8 and 9 am on both Saturday and Sunday and continue until completion of the classes based on entries. In the event of changes to the schedule (due to scratches or lack of participants), day sheets will be posted daily the morning of competition. These sheets will inform all competitors of the most current and correct order of go and will override previous scheduling. It is the competitor's responsibility to check for any possible changes.

WARM-UP: Horses may be schooled only in the designated areas. Schooling of horses/ponies may only be done by MHC membership holders.

To avoid disrupting the warm-up of other competitors, the Show Committee requests that the warm-up ring not be used for test calling. Horse may NOT be ridden in the actual competitions rings unless arranged ahead of time as per our paid "warm-up" program.

LUNGEING: Lungeing is not permitted in an area where horses are being ridden. Lungeing is not permitted in the indoor competition ring or the indoor warmup ring due to limited space. Lungeing and work in hand (unmounted) may only be done by the athlete, owner, coach, groom or Person Responsible. It is not permitted to lunge a mounted horse at any competition, whether or not the horse is entered in the competition. Lungeing is permitted only in designated areas if space permits. Show organizers are not obliged to provide a lungeing area.

CROSS-ENTERING: More than one athlete may ride the same horse/pony at a competition providing the horse/pony is not entered by two athletes in the same class. The athletes can both be juniors or open or any combination of these providing they are not in the same class unless the class is divided into separate categories for the purpose of ribbons. The horse/pony must not compete against itself.

MAXIMUM NUMBER OF LEVELS/TESTS/CLASSES PER HORSE PER DAY: A horse/rider combination may compete in any two, but only two consecutive levels and a maximum of four tests per day for Introductory, Training and First levels, and three tests per day for Second, Third and Fourth levels.

No horse may compete in more than four tests or rides combined per day. A horse may compete in any two, but only two consecutive levels and a maximum of four tests per day.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST: No child or adult may compete in a class in which horsemanship is a factor before a judge by whom said child or adult has been instructed, coached, or tutored with or without pay within 30 days of the date of competition. It is the responsibility of the athlete not to enter a class or ride in front of a judge from whom he/she has received instruction or a riding clinic in the previous 30 days. Any coach/trainer may not be judged by his/her student or owner of a horse they are training within 30 days of the coaching/training taking place. No child or adult may complete in a class where the judge who is officiating *or* the steward responsible for checking his/ her tack is a member of his/her immediate family.

LIMIT OF ENTRIES, TIME CHANGES AND CLASS CANCELLATION: The show committee reserves the right to limit entries, combine or cancel classes, alter ring sizes, decide on any point not covered by the rules, and correct any errors or make any necessary changes to the prize list or program during the course of the competition year. Competitors will be notified at the earliest possible time of any changes. The onus will be upon the competitor to familiarize her/himself with such changes.

PROTECTIVE HEAD GEAR: At all times persons, regardless of age or level of competition, must wear properly fitted and fastened safety approved protective headgear when mounted at any MHC-sanctioned Dressage competition at the event location.

STABLING AND TACK STALLS: You are allowed to tie a horse to a trailer during the day but not over night. Horse stalls are optional. Stabling fees include final cleaning of the stall. Tack stalls are optional; however, no tack or feed can be located in the aisles. Tack stall sharing is allowed. It is the responsibility of the competitor to find someone to share with if they want to share the tack stall with someone else. Due to fire rules and insurance regulation, all tack, boxes, bedding, etc. can't be stored in aisle ways as they must be clear at all times in case of emergency.

HORSES: Horses may be removed from the show grounds after they have completed competition for the day. Once the horse has completed its last class, it may leave the show grounds (but we encourage you to stay for the presentation of awards and prizes!)

PRESENTATION OF AWARDS: Prizes will be presented after the completion of the show each day in the afternoon/evening. We wish to show appreciation and respect to our sponsors, therefore, the Show committee requests that competitors or their designates and their horses be suitably attired, with proper head gear, for presentation of awards. Photos will be taken for publication.

LIABILITY: It is a condition of entry that neither Westman Dressage nor the Show committee will be held responsible in any way for damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses or property of spectators or competitors. Waivers must be signed by all Persons Responsible and their parents/guardians, as well as the horses' legal owner. Persons Responsible must be present and accountable. Persons Responsible who are prevented from performing their duties by reason of illness or other cause, or who must be absent from any competition where horses under their care are entered and stabled shall immediately notify the competition secretary and, at the same time, appoint a substitute

CALLERs: A caller for tests will be provided at no cost test for any competitors that would like a caller provided for them. You are allowed to have your own caller. Tests will be called over a sound system. All EC tests may be called during the competition, limited to reading the movement a maximum of twice without adding anything else which might assist the athlete. Caller's dress code is to be smart and casual Jeans slacks and mid length shorts are permitted. Inappropriately dressed callers may not be allowed to call a test. Callers may not wear personal electronic devices while calling tests.

SALUTE: Athletes must take the reins in one hand (either left or right) at the salute. Let the other arm drop loosely along the body and incline the head in a slight bow. Gentleman athletes may not remove their protective headgear at the salute. In freestyle classes, the initial and final salutes must be made inside the arena and with the horse and rider facing the judge at C. Failure to salute is an error of test and the rider will incur a two point penalty.

DOGS: must be under control, quiet and on a leash at all times. The use of flexi-type leashes is discouraged. Please review the Keystone Center's policy regarding dogs on the property. <u>http://www.keystonecentre.com/about/rules-regulations/</u> (Pets – always on a leash, allowed in stabling areas only, not in halls, show areas, or concession vicinity)

PARKING AND TRAVEL INSTRUCTIONS: Please go to <u>http://www.keystonecentre.com/about/maps/</u> for a map to find the Keystone Centre as well as where various hotels are for those who are looking for accommodation. When you enter the Keystone Grounds from 18th Street, you will turn east off 18th, travel east until the stop sign (you are on the keystone grounds) turn left (north) travel until a dead end, turn left (west) and the barn entrances and parking are straight ahead.

WESTMAN DRESSAGE: Reserves the right to refuse entries and reserves the right to ask anyone to leave the premises in the event of disorderly conduct, as per Show Management and Board of Directors of Westman Dressage.

WESTMAN DRESSAGE YEAR-END AWARDS: To qualify for Westman Dressage year-end awards you must have a Westman Dressage Membership.

- 2. Time slots can be purchased by a single rider or group of riders. All horse/riders must be registered with the competition to be eligible for a Warm-up time. Show numbers must be visible on horse or rider.

BIOSECURITY REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL COMPETITORS

- Stall Labels must be completed for each horse, including the horse name and 24-hour emergency contact information, and placed on the horse's stall door.
- You must check your horse's temperature twice a day and record it on the Horse Temperature Chart. A normal horse temperature is between 37.2 – 38.3° C. Any temperature over 38.8° C (102° F) must be reported to the horse show office and/or horse show veterinarian.
- Do not share feed/water containers or buckets between horses and do not use communal water troughs. While filling a bucket, do not let the hose end touch the bucket or the water in a bucket.
- Sharing tack and equipment puts horses at risk and is not recommended. If tack/equipment must be used by multiple horses, be sure to clean/disinfect it between uses by different horses.
- Observe good hygiene around all horses on the grounds, and especially after handling a teammate's horse prior to touching your horse.
- Wash hands immediately with soap and water, or use disinfectant hand solution after handling horses, especially after contact with the mouth, nose or feces.
- Hand sanitizers are available. Please use them and indicate the importance of their use to your friends, family and casual visitors.
- All stalls have been cleaned of all manure and bedding, and disinfected. Feel free to sanitize your
 assigned stall prior to bringing your horse in.
- · Do not allow nose-to-nose contact between horses.
- Do not permit your horse to lick or sniff surfaces in common areas. If this does occur, please use a disinfectant wipe on the area.
- · If sharing a wheelbarrow, please do not bring it into your horse's stall. Leave it in the aisle.
- · Please dispose of manure in designated areas only. Do not put trash in manure pile.
- If your horse develops a fever or signs of illness, contact the show veterinarian or steward immediately.
- Following the competition, it is recommended that all horses be isolated at their home facility for 21 days prior to reintroduction to other horses. If this is not possible, be sure to observe all horses carefully for 21 days.
- Following the competition, all horses should have temperatures taken twice a day for four days, and be observed for abnormal behavior and signs of cough, nasal discharge, discomfort or lameness.
