Emergency Action Plan for Severe Weather or Other Interruption to Show

1. The Show Chair and Steward(s) convene to determine the situation and to make a decision.
2. Announcement of temporary stop of competition and the estimated length of the delay.
3. Horses and riders on the property to return to their stalls, trailers, cars or designated safe areas. Spectators advised to congregate at show office.
4. Once Show Chair and Steward(s) have ascertained that the interruption has passed, set and announce new starting time — minimum 30 minutes to ensure safety of grounds and equipment.
5. Show steward reports to EC

Emergency Action Plan for Injury to Exhibitor or Spectator

1. Do Not Move the Patient.
2. Notify the Show office by telephone or radio, who will then notify medical personnel and Show Management.
3. Medical personnel will evaluate patient and determine status.
4. Catch the horse (if applicable)
5. Advise the show office by Radio - Show office will call 911. Exhibitors are asked NOT to use their cell phones as the area code affects the directions.
6. Announcer will ask exhibitors to clear the area then Ringmaster, Steward or Show Management will help keep spectators back.
7. Show Personnel will keep the road clear so ambulance can get through without hurting anyone else.
8. A member of Show Personnel should be at front entrance to meet the ambulance Ask them to turn off their siren and escort them to the scene of the accident. (Ambulance sirens could spook a horse and cause additional accidents)
9. Accident forms will be completed by the Show Steward from Equestrian Canada.

Emergency Action Plan for Injured or Dead Horse

1. The Show Chair and Steward(s) convene to determine the situation and to make a decision; clear the area of all those who are not delegated to respond to the emergency.
2. Check for any injuries to handlers/riders. Call the medic, if necessary.
3. Call the on-call vet and the owner or the Person Responsible as per the entry form. Provide the name and phone number of the veterinarian to owner/PR. Send someone to the entrance to meet the vet.
4. If the accident is in the warm-up ring or competition arena, announce the delay and keep people away from the area.
5. If it is impossible to clear the spectators, Create a visual shield with screens.
6. Have equipment readily available suitable to load and transport a standing injured horse, an injured down horse or a dead horse safely under appropriate professional supervision.
7. As soon as the situation is stable, the steward must phone Equestrian Canada Competitions Line to report major injury or death. Complete and submit eye witness reports including the horse injury reports.

EACH COMPETITOR (THIS INCLUDES AT LEAST ONE RECORDED OWNER AND ALL TRAINERS, DRIVERS, RIDERS, HALTER HANDLERS, COACHES AND THE PERSON(S) SIGNING THE ENTRY BLANK) IN AN ARABIAN HORSE ASSOCIATION RECOGNIZED ARABIAN DIVISION, AT THE TIME OF ENTRY INTO A COMPETITION, MUST SUBMIT A COPY OF A VALID AHA MEMBERSHIP/COMPETITION CARD, JOIN AHA OR PAY AN AHA SINGLE EVENT MEMBERSHIP FEE PER COMPETITOR.

WHEN AN AGENT SIGNS FOR THE OWNER AT AN AHA RECOGNIZED COMPETITION, BOTH THE OWNER AND AGENT MUST BE MEMBERS OF AHA OR PAY THE AHA SINGLE EVENT MEMBERSHIP.

SINGLE EVENT MEMBERSHIP IS NOT ACCEPTABLE AT AHA REGIONAL OR NATIONAL COMPETITIONS.

EXHIBITORS IN WALK-TROT CLASSES ARE EXEMPT FROM AHA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS AT QUALIFYING COMPETITIONS, BUT MUST HAVE AN AHA MEMBERSHIP WITH COMPETITION CARD AT AHA REGIONAL AND NATIONAL COMPETITIONS.

EXHIBITORS IN LEAD LINE CLASSES OR PARENTS/GUARDIANS SIGNING FOR MINORS ARE EXEMPT FROM AHA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS. (BOD 5/12)

Equestrian Canada

- The PAWWSHA Sport Horse and Working Western competition is sanctioned as a Bronze competition of Equestrian Canada 308 Legget Drive, Suite 100, Ottawa, Ontario, K2K 1Y6 and is governed by the rules of EC. (A602.1)
- Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location. (A602.5)
- Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC- sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition. (A602.7)
- Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book. (A602.2)

- When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance (Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments).

Statement of Principals

The health and welfare of horses in Canada is of the highest priority for Equestrian Canada (EC) and the Canadian equestrian industry and community we serve. EC supports adherence to the humane treatment of horses in all activities under our jurisdiction. Under the EC Statement of Principles, all persons shall be committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of all horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.
- Ensuring that all equestrians, including owners, trainers and competitors, or their respective agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their own horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.
- Requiring owners, trainers and competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions.
- Actively promoting the development of, and adherence to, competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The Rule Book

Exhibitors, Judges, and Show Officials are responsible for knowledge of the Rules. Both a complete knowledge of and compliance with the rules are essential, and all participants must be fully cognizant of all rules as well as class specifications in the division in which they compete. Full details of Horse Show operation – EC (including FEI) rules – list of recognized judges – **other vital information is in the Rule Book**. Copyright for exclusive use of recognized shows. See current EC Rules and Amendments. Every individual is eligible to count points won at recognized EC shows for Annual and Provincial Championship Awards. The current EC Rules and Amendments are presently in effect and have been used to compile the Rules and Regulations for this prize list. Horse recordings are not required in a recognized BREED competition.

Bronze Licence is required for this competition. A temporary sport licence may be purchased.

Amateur Competitors: All seniors competing in EC amateur classes must possess a current amateur card. This must be applied for at the same time as the Competitive License. Membership to EC is now called a Competitive License. All exhibitors, owners, trainers, riders, drivers and handlers must join EC with a competitive license to be able to compete in any EC sanctioned show. **(B1302.b)**

COVID Mitigation Plan

All show staff and competitors will adhere to all federal, provincial, and local mandates in place at time of show. Show staff also reserve the right to implement COVID precautions at their discretion including limiting number of people in the show office, requiring masks indoors, and social distancing. All COVID precautions in place will be communicated to exhibitors via email prior to the show, posted on social media, and prominently displayed on show grounds. As the show occurs outdoors, it will not be cancelled due to COVID unless required by provincial or federal law

PAWWSHA General Rules & Conditions

- **Participants are required to carefully read all rules posted at www.prairiearabians.com/entershow. The following is an excerpt only and does not include all rules.**

General Conditions

- The Agri-Park grounds are located on a quarter section of land due east of the Melville Regional Park and adjacent to #10 Highway, northeast of the City of Melville, along Agri-Park Road between Highways #10 and #15.
- There will not be a veterinarian, farrier, or ambulance on site. Emergency contact information is provided.
- Wash bays are available but are cold water only; judges will be aware of this.
- **COGGINS TESTING AND PROOF OF VACCINATIONS IS REQUIRED** - you must provide proof of negative test and vaccinations prior to unloading your horse. All horses entered in any class at an Equestrian Canada competition must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See EC Rules Section A, Article A519, Vaccinations.
- Patterns, show schedule, and individual ride times will be distributed to entrants no later than Friday June 10th.
- Competitors arriving on the show grounds must report to the show office promptly.
- There will be zero tolerance for abuse of horses, show officials, or fellow competitors.
- **Entries are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis.** Once the show is full, a wait-list will be created. All competitors are encouraged to enter as soon as possible to secure their spots.
- No child or adult may compete in a class in which horsemanship is a factor before a judge by whom said child or adult has been instructed, coached, or tutored with or without pay within 30 days of the date of competition.
- AHA entries can not be accepted without an up-to-date copy of the registration certificate.
- **Nobody will participate in the show unless entries are paid in full.**
- There will be a \$10 administration fee for substituting a horse and/or athlete show entry after entries close. All appropriate waivers must be signed and memberships in place. (Article A604.d and A806)
- Exhibitors canceling entries after the closing date of May 31 2022 for any reason without veterinarian certificate shall forfeit ALL fees. Exhibitors cancelling prior to the closing date or with veterinarian certificate shall forfeit office fee only.
- PAWWSHA reserves the right to refuse entries (articles A603.2.b A805 EC) and reserves the right to ask anyone to leave the premises without compensation in the event of disorderly conduct, as per Show Management and club executive.
- Stabling is outdoors and limited, please consider sharing a tack stall if possible. All horses entered in any EC show must be stalled and there is a limit of one horse per stall. It is prohibited to tie a horse to a trailer at an EC event.
- Move in time no earlier than 12:00pm Friday June 10th.
- **Final order of go and schedule will be distributed no later than Thursday June 9th and posted at the show.** *Tentative* schedule for both the Sport Horse and Working Western shows is as follows. This may vary pending entries.
- **Effort will be made to accommodate horses and riders who are showing in both shows/rings.** In cases where this is not possible, competitors will be contacted.
- In the event of changes to the schedule (due to scratches or lack of participants), day sheets will be posted daily the morning of competition. It is the competitor's responsibility to check for any possible changes.
- Use of shared warm up area is free of charge for all competitors at all times.
- **No riders will be allowed to warm-up in or around the competition ring without purchasing a warm-up block of time.** Paid warm-up times will be offered on Friday for the Dressage ring, Trail course, and Sport Horse Triangle. Warm-up Schedule will be shared with all competitors no later than Wednesday June 8th.

- To avoid disrupting the warm-up of other competitors, the shared warm-up ring may not be used for test calling.
- Lungeing is not permitted in any area where horses are being ridden (see EC Dressage Rules E 7.16).
- All entries are accepted with the understanding that the Arabian Horse Association, Equestrian Canada, PAWWSHA, its officers, contract personnel or volunteers or any of its affiliates, the Melville Agri Park, their officers, officials and employees will not be held responsible for any loss, damage or injury, to any exhibitor, his or her agent or employee, or to a horse or article of any kind. The submitting of any entry form to the Entry Secretary shall constitute and acceptance by each person signing same of the provisions herein set forth.
- **All Dressage riders (english and western) must wear protective headgear** at all times when mounted (See Glossary – Headgear Standards; see Article E 4.0; See article A905 General Rules EC).
- **All Junior riders must wear protective headgear; Protective headgear is strongly encouraged for all adult riders.**
- All Dressage classes will use Equestrian Canada tests; All AHA Western Dressage classes will use Western Dressage Association of America (WDAA) tests, and all SHF Heritage Western Dressage classes will use Western Style Dressage Association of Canada (WSDAC) tests. A Dressage horse may compete in any two, but only two consecutive levels and a maximum of four tests per day (See Article E 7.11.9). Horses competing in Second Level and higher may compete in a maximum of 3 tests per day.
- No hors concours entries.
- All horses brought onto show grounds must be entered in at least one class.
- Drug fees are mandatory for EC competitions and must be included with entry fees. For rules governing equine Medications, please see Rules of EC, General Regulations, Chapter 10 (Equine medication Control). Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location (Article A602.5). Athletes are also subject to the Medication Control rules set by Sport Canada and may be tested.
- Numbers must be worn and visible at all times in the warm-up, schooling and/or exercise areas as well as in the competition rings, whether the horse is under saddle or not. (Article A 814 and E 7.11.2 and E 7.11.3).
- Ribbons will be provided to 3rd place and placings to 8th place. **Ribbons can be picked up with tests / score sheets on Saturday and Sunday after the class. Any horse competing in Dressage must score at least 50% to receive a ribbon.**

High Point Awards

PAWWSHA members are eligible for High Point awards (the rider/handler and at least one owner must be members).

Horses and riders will accumulate PAWWSHA Points for each class that they enter **up to a maximum of 8 classes over the weekend** (Sport Horse and Working Western Shows combined). Horses and riders are welcome to enter more than 8 classes, but only their 8 best scores/placings will be used to calculate high point awards. Horses may accumulate points with multiple riders and/or handlers; riders may accumulate points with multiple horses.

Awards will be given in the following categories:

- High Point Versatility Horse** - Horse must compete in at least 1 Sport Horse in hand class, 1 Dressage test, and 1 Sport Horse rail class over the weekend
- High Point Dressage Horse** - Horse must compete in at least 2 Dressage tests over the weekend
- High Point Junior Rider / Handler** - Rider / handler must be 18 years or younger as of December 31st, 2022
