I enjoy working on environmental remediation projects and knowing that the work that we do improves the natural and water environment.

What does a typical day look like in this role?

I work from home and spend most of my time behind my computer. My hours are flexible. Some of the things I do in a typical week include: coordinating sample events with field personnel and laboratories; reviewing and summarizing analytical data; participating (remotely) in project planning and status meetings; writing project submittals; and developing proposals for new projects.

What are the most challenging aspects of this career?

Working for a contractor, you need to be able to manage working on multiple projects at once and utilize your time efficiently. As a remote worker, it's important for me to be able to communicate clearly and have a good rapport with the field staff that I'm working with.

Environmental Science, Chemistry, Construction Management, Water Resource Management
