On two occasions, Joseph was engaged to be married and yet on both occasions, the bride to be died before the wedding took place (the first died on the night before the ceremony).

Seeking a fresh start, Joseph set to emigrate to Canada, yet he was forced to return home after only two months due to ill health. Poor health would blight his life from there on in. He did however move to Canada where he became a private tutor, only to experience the heartbreak of his second fiancée dying as previously mentioned.

Joseph's Faith never faltered however, so much so in fact that became known as the local 'Good Samaritan' of Port Hope, Ontario, Canada, helping the poor and needy at every opportunity.



The message whilst gracing the pages of the New Testament, is found also in the pages of the Old Testament. Turn to Numbers 21:7-9 and read of the miraculous deliverance of the

sinful Israelites from the righteous judgement of God by the simple act of looking on in faith.

In this passage, we see that the Israelites were being judged by God for their ill judged anger against God and Moses for supposedly leading them into pain and death in the wilderness. One Small Step....

An interesting news item slipped out into the press on February 26th 2021. A new government bill was passed that changed the wording of the maternity leave regulations so that Tory Attorney General Suella Braverman could maintain her position and not resign (a strange requirement for current female governmental employees who are expecting).

The House of Lords objected to the amendment using the term 'person' in the maternity leave bill and supported the use of the term 'mother' instead. The government relented to this objection and has conceded that the term 'mother' is "legally acceptable."

Whilst it is obviously good news that the important wording of 'mother' to reflect the uniquely female blessing of childbearing, and that this term is applicable during pregnancy not just at and post birth. Book of Ruth – Part 6

We recommence our look at the Book of Ruth with a most beautiful of continuances, the grace of Christ as represented in the acts of Boaz towards Ruth.

In verses 15-17 of chapter 2, we see a continuation of the care extended to Ruth by Boaz, even when she is unaware of the careful provision he has made for her welfare. We see that Boaz instructs his workers to allow Ruth to glean in the thriving fields without rebuke (a rare privilege not given to gleaners), whilst to also deliberately leave choice grain so that Ruth may benefit from this richness of harvest for both herself and Naomi.

As a result of this wonderful generosity, Ruth ends the day with an amount of barley equal to 8 pounds or 3.6kgs of barley! We the reader of this wonderful account of God's sovereignty and provision are aware that this wondrous blessing is from the generosity and grace of Boaz towards Ruth and Naomi; a generosity motivated by his just nature and Godly heart. Yet dear Ruth is unaware of the source of this immense generosity and care for herself and Naomi. Isn't it so with ourselves when a wonderful blessing is brought into our lives and we sit in almost disbelief at its richness and how to came to be. However we know from James 1:17 that "every good gift and every perfect gift, cometh down from above from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variableness, neither shadow of turning." Every blessing, every good and perfect gift comes from the hands of God, this we are clearly told by God's revealed word; however we all too often leave it at joyous bemusement on receiving the blessing and do not give due thanks to the one who sent the blessing, namely God. Oftentimes it takes another to rightly point out to us that the source of the tremendous blessing is no mystery, or it's not purely due to the individual who God has used to deliver His blessing to us, it's from The LORD himself.

Such a gentle correction is seen in verses 18-20, as Naomi, seeing the bounty that Ruth has returned home with, enquires of Ruth as to how did she come about such an abundance? Ruth recounts that it is from the generous giving of a man named Boaz. Ruth is obviously unaware of the close connection that Boaz holds to Naomi through the house of Elimelech. Again though weren't we all unaware of the grace constantly extended to us day after day by The LORD when we were yet sinners and blind to His wonder? On so many occasions, the blind whose hearts whilst being stirred by the Holy Ghost, are ministered to by servants of Christ, bringing the light of the Gospel to them in their spiritual darkness. This is our need to preach the Word of God boldly, for He has purposed us to be the vehicle of the spreading of His word to all corners of the world.

Naomi on hearing that the welcome blessing of plentiful food has come from Boaz, immediately recognises the scope of the enormity of God's grace and provision. Naomi bursts into praise of The LORD, marvelling at how he "hath not left off his kindnesses," (verse 20) and that He has delivered His gifts through her kinsman Boaz. She sees that God in the richness of His love, grace and wisdom has moved all things so that both herself and Ruth have been offered relief through her own bloodline. A bloodline that originally brought her house in tragedy of death, now through another offers her peace and contentedness. So as Boaz is Naomi's

kinsman, a relative delivered by God to provide for the house of Elimelech, so to is Jesus Christ our deliverer from the house of death into which our ancient parent Adam first led mankind into. Boaz represents the glory of God's redemption, for Jesus is our relative also, for He lived as a man of flesh and blood, born from the bloodline of Adam as are we all, so that He might provide the sanctuary for those who submit themselves to Him, as Ruth so wonderfully did earlier in the account of her life.

Ruth then relays how Boaz has instructed her to remain gleaning in his fields, under his protection. There may have been understandable doubt as to the motivations of Boaz in Ruth's mind. This doubt often appears in the mind of those curious of faith in Christ, or even young in faith, in that how can it be freeing to serve? It is a logical question and only experience can provide a full answer. Experience in living as a servant of Christ shows the heart that all labours, all trials, all pain, when endured for His sake and out of service to Him, will be rewarded. It is this hope, this promise that Paul speaks of when he observes that trials lead to experience, experience to patience, patience to hope. This experience that builds Godly wisdom in being patient for the reward is displayed by Naomi's reply to Ruth.

Ruth notes that Boaz has instructed her to remain with his workers, so that she is protected. This instruction is confirmed by Naomi to be a wise instruction in that Ruth will be cared for and watched over by those that Boaz has trusted with working for him. So to does Christ instruct us to take strength and spiritual protection by having fellowship with other Christians, so that we are kept safe in the fields of this world where there are lions of Satan looking to devour us.

We end chapter 2 seeing that Ruth obeys the instruction and confirmation of instruction to stay within the fields of Boaz. However all too many Christians do not listen to this instruction to remain within the safety of Jesus' instruction and commands. We wonder

out into other fields, owned by Satan, lured away by false promises of sweeter gifts brought to us by our efforts and not the Lord's supply. As Naomi, the elder wisely advised her daughter in law to listen to the instruction of Boaz, those experienced in life and more importantly the Word of God are to instruct the younger of years that if they want continued blessing, they are to remain within the loving boundaries so clearly displayed in His eternal word.

This is the title of an intriguing article on The Guardian Newspaper website that looked at the Papal visit to Iraq in early 2021.

Early Briton and Beyond

As stated in our last article, by the time the Roman legions leave our land there was a British Church. Had that Church existed for years without the Word of God? How did the early British Church grow without a Rule of Faith, without a Standard? Do we really think that as the centuries passed the Britons had no copy of God's Word?

By the early part of the fourth century the shadows were falling over and a sense of security is quickly passing from Roman Briton. As Rome (Pagan) declines there is a growing fear and insecurity in these isles and by the end of the fifth century the legions are gone.

Whilst I have no wish to labour a point in this series, yet the point is vital. As back in Bible lands only by a faithful transmission of God's revelation could the human race be

guaranteed an authoritative statement of everything which had been revealed and believed by the first recipients, so God I believe through early missionaries in Roman times did not leave His Church 400 years without His Word.

Further, assuming a true revelation has been given us by God in the first place, could such a revelation be preserved without a pure Scripture? Also knowing the Church to be an institution of Christ, what for example could the British Church know of the foundation, laws, ordinances and doctrines of that Church without the Scripture? Finally, assuming the end of salvation is to be holiness, and growth in knowledge and grace in the believer, how could spiritual life be perceived, described, and Christian character be built in these isles, without the Scripture?

With the barbarian invasions, Briton descends into darkness. We then witness the disappearance of the language of the Britons. When the light dawns again things are very different. The land is barbarous, poverty and degradation are everywhere. Markets, cities, temples, academic places of learning are gone, it would seem most likely the art of writing was lost. The original Church of the Britons which had fled West, appears to have lost evangelistic zeal though doubtless there were still some faithful souls.

The seeds of Christianity now were spread from Ireland after Patrick brought Ireland in touch with Churches in Western Europe. Later Columba went to Scotland. However there was a difference in the Christianity brought to England. It wasn't Roman in form. The Celtic Christians were communities of monks (not the Catholic type), further their preachers were not controlled by the Papacy. Do note reader that we have moved on in history to the time of Papal Rome.

The Celtic Church stood against the growing power of the Papacy. Irish and old British Christians saw no reason to accept the boasting claims of Rome. It will come as no surprise then that Rome viewed them as heretical. It was the Roman Catholic, Mr Arthur O'Clery, K.C. who wrote, 'It was undoubtedly on the charge of heresy, that the Columbine monks were, in Bede's words, 'exposed and eliminated.' The Celtic Church rejected a European controlling Church, thus Rome was not going tolerate that impudence.

The year 1997 saw the 1400th anniversary of Augustine in the Isles. Landing at the Isle of Thanet, this Roman Bishop had been given a direct commission from Pope Gregory. Thus it was that the Roman form of 'Christianity' that had conquered Western Europe came to subdue the English Church. From now on two differing forms of Christianity would seek to win the people of these isles, one brought by the likes of

Columba and the other by Augustine.

It must have been a surprise for Augustine to discover that there was already an ancient Christian Church that had survived the pagan

invasions. So, a Conference was arranged in A.D 601 or 603, for Augustine to meet the Bishops of these isles. No agreement was reached in various matters so a 2nd Synod was planned for more representatives of the British Church to be present. No agreement was reached. The British stated, 'they would do none of these things...(matters discussed),...'nor receive him as their Archbishop', Augustine was angry.

We see then that the British Church did not recognise the authority of the Pope. Before the conference mentioned, it is said the Celtic Christians sought counsel from a godly old hermit who told them, 'If Augustine rises from his seat when you approach him, then perhaps there is something in what he says. If he remains seated and does not rise to greet you as brethren then have nothing of him. '. Augustine did not rise and when they refused to submit to Rome he said, 'You will either join us in evangelising the Saxon or feel their swords'. This threat was fulfilled when at Bangor the Celtic Church was destroyed and it's people martyred. The Celtic Church in England was finally defeated by Rome at the Synod of Whitby in A.D 664.


In A.D 1172 at the Council of Cashal, Henry II brought the Celtic Church, which was a shadow of its former self, under Rome. Roman Catholicism was now the only religion allowed in Britain. In A.D 1230 there was submission of the throne to Rome on political matters of Church and State in this land and Europe we see the Dark Ages extend.

Finally, it is easy to think that all Gospel witness fell silent but God would have had His remnant according to grace. An original New Testament seed was planted in this land and the light of Christ which first illuminated this 'Sceptured Isle', was never fully overcome by Rome's false gospel.

Did Jesus Really Rise From The Dead




Did Jesus Really Rise from the Dead?

The apostle Paul describes the resurrection of Christ as central to the Christian faith in 1 Corinthians 15. 

Flip Flopping Poles

Do not be alarmed, we're not discussing particularly fickle Polish individuals with such a title. Instead we are considering the interesting scientific discussion as to how in Earth's history, the North and South Poles have actually switched to quite plausible dramatic effect.

Science is now confident that the Earths magnetic poles have indeed switched round brought about by some catastrophic event, and that this dramatic alteration of our environment led to the extinction of many plant and animal species on a global level.

Now of course the evolutionary scientist suggests from the foundation point of their own personal bias of removing God from existence, that these switches of poles occurred long ago and probably numerous times. They are forced to this conclusion under the burden of having to fit this discovery into the belief of a billions of years old earth.



However there is a problem with this theory. It is universally accepted in science that the Earth's magnetic field is weakening with each passing year. Logically this means that if you were to extrapolate the weakening backwards so as to ascertain the likely strength of the Earths magnetic field even just a few million years ago let alone a few billion, the magnetic field would be so strong it would stop any life from existing on Earth. Isaiah 53

As believers in Christ we see the Lord and His Sacrificial Work in this chapter. Yet from the

Middle Ages in Europe and beyond, the Jews have interpreted the Servant as Israel. However, the writings of ancient Jewish scholars on messianic prophecy very much match the Christian interpretation. Rabbi Elia de Vivas of the 16th century writes of Isaiah 53, 'Thus the Messiah suffered on account of our sins, and was wounded; he who does not wish the Messiah to be wounded for our transgressions may choose himself to suffer and carry his own sins.'

Traditionally the ancient Rabbis identified the 'Servant' as the Messiah. Jonathan Ben Uzziel paraphrases Isaiah 53:10, 'Behold my Servant the Messiah will prosper'. The Talmud (Jewish writings in reference to Isaiah 53:4 names the Messiah 'the Sick One'.

The Hebrew Bible presents two pictures of the Messiah, One who comes to suffer and die – Isaiah 53. One who comes as King – Daniel 9, Isaiah 11:1-9. This puzzled some Rabbis and led to a belief in two different Messiahs – Messiah Ben Joseph – who suffers and Messiah Ben David who reigns. Thank God we know the 'Two' are 'One'.

Isaiah 53 then is a picture of prophecy of vicarious suffering. Here is a mystery that only Calvary solves. Further, this chapter is an example of the mystery of contradiction and paradox.

- 1: Root out of a dry ground (v2). Yet fruitful (v10) see his seed.
- 2: No form nor comeliness (v2). Pleasure of the Lord is His (v10).
- 3: Despised, rejected (v3). Yet the Saviour (v5).
- 4: He dies (v9). Yet lives (v10).
- 5: Has no offspring (v8). Yet has seed (v10).
- 6: Grave with the wicked (v9). He died with criminals but was buried in the sepulchre of the rich (v9).

7: he suffers adversity (v10). Yet enjoys prosperity (v10).

8: He is triumphed over (v8). Yet He triumphs (v11).

9: He is cut off (v8). Yet prolongs His days (v10).

10: He is condemned (v8). Yet justifies the condemned (v11).

Are our arrows being fired by the Enemy?

This article is something of a convoluted journey that my wife and I have taken over the last few months, which has involved taking stock of current cultural situations and looking at them in scriptural context and with prayer. This is journey that I hope to share with you here and maybe it addresses some thoughts that you as the reader may have had in relation to your own family.

This Journey begins with President Biden. Only the second catholic President in the history of the United States (the first being John F Kennedy) he has in his first two months in office done more to forcibly forward the agenda of the LGBTQ+ and proabortion movements than any other administration in such a short time scale (which no doubt has rather upset the Pope).

By the time this article appears in Truth to Wonder, it is possible that the current attempt to push through the "Equality Act" will have succeeded in passing the Senate.

This Act has not been publicised in the world media but is a bolting on of gender equality to the Civil Rights act of 1964. This is momentous, as it lays gender rights at the same level of law as the rights of race. Racism and "genderism" will be on the same footing when it comes to falling foul of prosecution for discrimination.



Should this act pass the senate you will be able to identify as any gender you wish (and at last count there were more than 112 gender identities) and under law be protected from any form of discrimination; be that in the work place, education, welfare, healthcare etc. The trans-sexual activists have been particularly vocal in lobbying for these changes. It would mean that you can identify as for example a woman if you are in fact a biological man and be able to compete in women's sports, use a women's bathroom / toilet facilities, locker-rooms, changing areas, and even domestic abuse shelters without prevention. This right would extend even to the schooling system down to the level of kinder-garden – yes preschool children.

In addition surgeons will not be allowed to refuse to perform any manner of gender reassignment surgery regardless of personal beliefs. You will have to perform a breast removal surgery in a teen girl who wants to identify as a boy even if you regard this as misguided mutilation – that's as long as you wish to keep your job.

Men and women will no longer have set roles in the areas of the work force – for example it will be permissible for a man identifying as a woman to do pat downs and strip searches on a biological women; and that woman will not be able to request another biological woman to perform this task, as that would be deemed as discriminatory to the transsexual woman. Religion gets no safe space within this Act. In fact the Act explicitly exempts itself from the Religious Freedom Restoration Act. This means that faith based schools, adoption centres and other faith / religion based charities would face government sanctions for maintaining teaching of the Bible and fundamental biology, especially on subjects such as sex and marriage.

Think it cant get worse? Well as a final kick to morality the Act also treats any refusal to offer abortion as "pregnancy discrimination". Pro-life defences at the federal and local state level would be fundamentally undermined. We in the UK are in a far less 'Christian' nation, and believe me this is coming here as well. Only recently a local authority in the south of England was condemned for not allowing trans-sexual women access to the domestic abuse facilities for biological women. The popular toy, Mr Potato head is as of today, no more, the company stating that it conforms to gender stereotypes and does not fit the culture at large anymore. Toy companies in general are looking to remove gender stereotypes, pushing for gender neutral dolls, pink dinosaurs, and other none gender fixed designs. Schools are pushing

story times based around books about homosexual penguins, or boys that wear skirts. Transsexuals make guest appearances in assemblies and drag queen story times take special pride of place in the day – all without the prior consent of parents. Children as young as 4 are being asked to choose a gender from a list of over 20 when joining

school groups. Why? Because through these actions Satan knows that if you have the children you have the generations to come.

More concerningly parents are getting less and less of a say in their child's education. As one fifth grade public school teacher said regarding parents concern over the schools support of the aberrant gender identity that their children were adopting; "their parental right ended when those children were enrolled in public school". Other schools in the United States are supporting preteen and teen trans gender identities, changing a child's pronouns on school documents but keeping this concealed from the parents. They also allow children as young as 12 to leave the school grounds to start gender reassignment / puberty blocking hormones without the parents consent or knowledge. If a parent expresses concern, or refuses to use the

pronouns a confused child wishes to use, the school regards the parents home as a "unsafe environment", and will do even more to encourage gender counselling and concealment of therapy from the parents. The parents rights stop at the school gates in many of these schools, and frankly its terrifying.

And this leads me to my next leg of the journey. My wife an I are expecting our first child together, and in light of all this have struggled with the concept of sending our child to school when the time comes, but rather, we are considering home-schooling. If things are this bad now, give it 3-5 years and schools will be places where parents lose all control.

As Christian parents to be, I and my wife have struggled to reconcile the scriptural command to "bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord" with sending them to state schooling. We wouldn't want to take our child to a church that was teaching false doctrine once a week on a Sunday, neither would we sign them up to a evolution summer school, or a gender and sexual tolerance seminar, so why would we send them to 5 days a week of humanist indoctrination, where they will get all of this 8 hours a day?

But what about the counter points? Lets start with the most popular. We should send our Christian children to school so that they can be "salt and light" to the rest of the world. As born again believers this is what we should all be. But as a reasoning for sending our children into the spiritual battlefields front lines I have concerns.

Firstly lets look at Pauls statement in 1 Corinthians 15 vs33



Matthew Henry writes of the above:

"He tells them that they would probably be corrupted by them, and fall in with their course of life, if they gave into their evil principles. Note bad company and conversation are likely to make bad men. Those who would keep their innocence must keep good company. Error and vice are infectious: and, if we would avoid the contagion, we must keep clear of those who have taken it. "He that walketh with wise men shall be wise, but a companion of fools shall be destroyed" (Proverbs 13:20)

We see this in everyday life. We no doubt all know people led astray by bad company. Think of Gods command to the Israelites as they set to conquering the promised land. He commanded them that they remove all the Canaanite peoples including the children. Why? Because God knew that the above statement was true. The Israelites were not to live amongst the Canaanites and be "salt and light", to influence them for God. They were too wicked and they would only serve to corrupt the Israelites through influence and intermarriage. The children of the Canaanites were included in this. What happened? They

chose to not carry out Gods command and they fell into gross wickedness and idolatry because of the surrounding influences.

Christian parents (and I'm including all denominations here) have been sending their children for the greater part, into secular schools for decades. And we don't see the schooling system getting any better through their children's influence. What we see if anything is Christian children leaving the church in droves by the time they reach further education. Who is influencing who here?

We also have to ask who was being told to be salt and light? The phrase "salt and light" is a compound paraphrase from the sermon on the mount in Matthew 5. This was a sermon delivered to the disciples, and to Jew first, for at the time of this sermon the Gentile nations had not been called. We as born again believers in Christ also apply this to our lives, as representatives of Christ. This however was not an application to the children of Christian parents, many of whom have not yet made a statement of faith or personal testimony to a believing faith in Christ. It is our job and commission as parents to prepare them for the battle. Are we not sending out our children ill equipped into a war-zone where the enemy knows full well what's at stake? We've just seen the reason for not keeping bad company as believers, how much more should that be for us as parents to keep our children not only from bad company before they have a saving faith but even more so humanistic teachers!

My question would be – if you are using your child as salt and light, are you equally doing the same and getting on the school board and

PTA meetings in order to affect change in the school as a whole? Isn't that our job as parents not our child's job, and wouldn't that be more effective?

Scripture says the devil is out there prowling like a roaring lion waiting to devour us. (1 Peter 5:8). Do we send our child out to play with that lion without first raising them and training them in Christ Jesus and the armour of truth? Are we not sending them out desperately ill equipped? Is it not our first task to evangelise our children and then educate them?

Others would argue that you can do this at home during the times they are not at school. When would that be? First thing when you're getting them up, tired and grumpy, finding their PE kit and deciding between three different breakfasts? Or when they come back from school, when they are equally tired, want to play, and don't want to do their homework, let alone learn why its scripturally wrong in the first place. My hats go off to those of you that make and have made this work. But again I would ask, do you send your child to play in the sewers just because you have a hose at home to wash them off? Or do you not let them enter that effluence in the first place? Muck will always stick somewhere!


Still others will use predetermination. God has predetermined who will be saved. Therefore I will send my child to school regardless of its current state or what they teach because if God has predetermined my child to be saved they will be fine. Do we approach our witnessing in this way? Or do we say that we should witness to all because we do not know who God has chosen? In the reverse sense why should we expose our children to

humanistic indoctrination without a solid foundation on the basis that if God has chosen them they are fine?

A further argument is that schools have always been places of indoctrination and there have been many bad cultural times before. This is in essence true. However comparing this current culture to previous is not helpful in resolving this issue either. If we hold that we are approaching, if not in, the very end times, what does scripture equate those end times with. As in the days of Noah (Matthew 24:37). It is comparable only with a world about to receive the ultimate judgement because of how wicked it was, so that every thought of man was only evil continually. If this is the case and these are the times we live in, then why would we want our children in schools surrounded by this culture?

But home schooling is not about sheltering. It is not about bubble wrapping our children, but talking to them frankly and explicitly about the culture, but without bathing them in it, and handing them to others to teach them. Its about building solid relationships and equipping them to stand in the Lord, so that when they do go out and face the world they can give reason for the hope that is within them (1 Peter 3:15). You have as parents fulfilled your commission and honoured the blessing that God gave you in the child. Ultimately this isn't about the child but about you and your role as a parent before the Lord, for which we will all have to give an account. And I feel deeply burdened by that accountability. Deuteronomy sums up our responsibility well in chapter 6 and verse 6 and 7.

We are told that children are like arrows (Psalm 127:4). But like arrows they will fly only where they are pointed. Do we do the training and pointing of those arrows towards God, or do we hand over those arrows to another's bow to fire?



We as a couple have decided that in these times we can only fulfil our role as parents before the Lord by seriously looking at home schooling when the time comes. I hope you can see our reasoning and may be it makes you stop and think about a few of the issues the way it did us. Amen.

A Final Thought

Mark 10: 21-22 - Then Jesus beholding him loved him, and said unto him, One thing though lackest: go thy way, sell whatsoever thou hast, and give to the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven: and come, take up the cross and follow me. And he was sad at that saying, and went away grieved: for he had great possessions.

The account of the rich young ruler's discourse with the Lord Jesus Christ gives us much opportunity for reflection, particularly at this time of year when we consider the atonement and the good news of the free gift of the gospel. The young ruler seemed to have a lot going for him; he was a staunch doer of the commandments, paid reverence to Christ and sought eternal life. Jesus, as he beheld him and loved him, laid out for him the final step to secure salvation. Yet when our Lord put him to the test, the rich young ruler failed miserably. One moment seeking eternal life next sad and going away and the grieved. What could cause such a remarkably swift change of countenance? "For he had great possessions"; his heart was in the wrong place. The love of worldly things continues to prevent many people from being saved. Instead of in heaven, where moth and rust doth not corrupt (Matthew 6:19-20), the young ruler preferred to lay up his treasures on earth. And are we not sometimes guilty of the same? How many times have we fixated on a new car, or perhaps the latest fashion, and not on our sanctification and the riches that await us in glory? And how many at this moment are outside of the Kingdom due to serving the wrong master, worldly possessions and the accumulation of wealth? Let us never forget that the greatest possession of all is the free gift of eternal life promised through faith in the Lord Jesus Christ and his atoning work on Calvary's tree. Where our heart is in the present will determine where we will reside in eternity; let us all be sure that we are serving the right master. And, from there, let us preach the gospel boldly this Easter season and beyond, witnessing that salvation through Christ costs nothing, but gains infinitely more than anything money can buy.
