Positively Destroyed

We are consistently told in every walk of life that 'winners never quit'. To support this ideology a few sportsman, businessmen etc are lifted up as examples that if they can succeed, anyone can. They peddle the same message of 'chase your dream and never give up.' The world applauds and those who look on who have not achieved such success sink a little deeper into despair, believing that their seeming failure is their fault and they just didn't want it enough. In this doctrine of success; pride, selfishness and stubbornness are idolised, the hallmarks of Lucifer himself. These traits were the cause of his casting from heaven as he sought "to be as God". Satan has taken his own desires and mass marketed them to a duped world who aligned itself with his rebellion long ago in Eden.

So the message of 'mind over matter' and 'winners never quit' is pumped out with ever increasing regularity. So it was with great surprise that a highly successful sportswoman spoke with great conviction against this modern mantra. Alex Scott, the former Arsenal and England Ladies Football player noted with passion that she was tired of this message that 'winners never quit'. She continued by noting that "winner's know when to quit". Alex Scott observed that a real champion, a true winner knows that there are some situations where stubbornness will hinder success and not encourage it. As her fellows pundits and presenters looked on with shock that a fellow professional would dare rock the mantra boat, I couldn't help but see how true this assessment was on a level that Miss Scott has missed.

So, so many souls refuse the gift of Salvation through the atonement of sin made by Christ Jesus on the Cross at Calvary in the belief that faith is a crutch. Their fallen minds heed the lie of Satan that if they just persevere and push on in their efforts to achieve success, they can and will achieve it. Such demonic lies based on the pride of man and devil are bought hook, line and sinker a million times a day across the world. Pride refuses to accept that if we are to gain eternal life we must accept defeat. This pride filled refusal to concede to Christ was evident when Jacob wrestled God in Genesis 32. Stubbornly Jacob refused to yield to a monumentally more powerful being until he reached utter exhaustion and in so the pride was defeated. The blessing he sought from God via the worldly wisdom of conquest was only given when he conceded defeat before the source of all wisdom! It finally dawned on Jacob that to win the blessing of God, he would have to quit the fight against Him! In this concession of Jacob before God, we see how the

wisdom of God is once again at odds with the devilish doctrine that we swallow everyday that 'winners never quit'.

Mike Tyson, the fearsome boxer who was once labelled 'the baddest man on the planet' noted how sometimes "you need to surrender" to return stronger and wiser. Rio Ferdinand (former Manchester United and England footballer) builds on this observation with his comment that "failure produces self-evaluation". If the secular, non-believing world can see this, why are we as Christians so slow to encourage others to self-evaluate? You see it is through failure, often deeply painful and difficult failure, that the Holy Spirit ministers to us of our need of salvation from our sins. In this evaluation of ourself after failure before God, our hearts are illuminated by the Spirit of the victory of Jesus on the Cross and how through His abundant grace we can be partakers of His victory through the imputing of His righteousness unto us.

However the devil wants no one to sit in proper self evaluation as it leads to big questions of life being asked, such as 'Why am I here?' 'What's the purpose of my life?' Etc, etc. This point was illustrated in C.S. Lewis' Screw tape Letters, as Lewis imagines a conversation between a lesser demon and senior one. The lesser demon is confused as to how a man he was tormenting came to Christ. As he recounts the failure to keep the soul from Jesus, he complains to the senior devil that all seem well, the man would just go for long walks to think but there was no obvious sign of his seeking for Jesus. Infuriated the senior devil scolds the demon by observing that a man should never be allowed to think deeply about himself and life as this leads to awareness of God. So the devil actively pursues man with every kind of distraction and motivation he can possibly devise so as to keep the mind of man from looking for God. Indeed it is a sign of the end times that man will 'run to and fro' (Daniel 12:4), for he will be so obsessed with achievement and distraction that he will forget all about God. In this dismissal of God, any dark and insidious imposter can sneak into the heart and mind of man that is created to worship something greater than itself.

So the devil has convinced the world that if you plow through, never surrendering your lusts and desires you can achieve everything you want, you can be as God. We haven't gone that far from the original sin of Adam and Eve have we?! So he will have you pursue and chase, even unto the point of despair and despondency. Why? Because if you succeed in your efforts you become arrogant and conceited, pride filled and boastful. If you fail, you slump into self pity

and depression. Either way you remain cut adrift from God and an eternity away from true triumph that is achieving life eternal through faith in Jesus Christ.

So the true winners in life are those whose hearts have been stirred by God to seek to win Christ and not worldly success. Furthermore, what these worldly successful individuals miss is the clear Scriptural truth that God raises up whoever He pleases to raise up and will put them down again whenever He pleases. One look at the life of King Nebuchanezzar will attest to this truth.

Yet greatest of all rebukes to this pride filled teaching is the very work of Christ Jesus on the cross. As Spurgeon noted, to the sinful world, the Cross is the epitome of shame, humiliation and defeat. Yet in the eyes of Faith, it is the site of Our Lord's greatest victory. The One who holds all power in the universe accepted what the world saw as defeat, yet in His obedience to the will of The Father, this seeming defeat was an eternity filling triumph.

To conclude, we look at the untold heartbreak this mantra of 'winners never quit' causes to those who have not been able to force through their dreams. For every one individual who stands and boasts of their 'self made success', there are a thousand more who worked equally hard but their efforts came to little or nought. By the worlds estimation these people are weak, failures, lazy and a lost cause. So they are cut adrift, looked down on and left in their deep despair. Flawed attempts at promoting good mental health in these desperate souls are fruitless as suicide rates continue to rise all across the Western world.

Such broken hearts are longing to be of worth, to be loved, to feel fulfilled but they cannot summon anymore conviction to fight on so they sink lower and lower into depression. Friend if you are such a soul, be exceeding glad for the fight is not yours, it is God's. Christ overcame sin and death on the Cross. End this rat race of humanity you are desperately trying to take part in; it's course ends in hell! Grace Be Unto You

Have you ever noticed that with the opening of each Pauline Epistle, Paul greets the reader with "Grace be unto you, and peace" (Ephesians 1:2)? This familiar warm greeting to the various churches and individuals whom Paul writes to is often skipped over as a mere introduction to the meat of the message. Yet if all Scripture is good for teaching (2 Timothy 3:16-17) as we are rightly taught in the Word of God, why have we raced over these wondrous sources of heavenly revelation?

Ask yourself this, why does Paul make this a consistent point of grace then peace to be extended to each of his correspondents? Could it be that in this simple greeting an incredibly deep and beautiful truth is contained?



Paul, through his greeting, is emphasising that to have peace, a peace with God, grace must have first been received. In other words, where no grace has been poured out on a regenerate heart, no peace can be established in that same individual. This is logically correct as when two sides are at war, peace can only be established when terms of peace have been put in place and ratified. Then when the terms have been fulfilled, peace is brought into effect. The terms of peace with God were given back in Genesis by God Himself. The terms were then ratified on the cross at Calvary by Jesus Christ. So by accepting the terms of peace with those who we were at war against (God Himself), namely our surrender to Him, we are gifted grace through the work of Jesus Christ in the shedding of His blood. Thereby a relationship of peace is established between God and redeemed man.

If we look at the world's wisdom however, we are led to believe that we can have peace without grace. Everyone is desperate for a peaceful existence, and we're told that this can be achieved through 'mindfulness' exercises (Buddhism repackaged), Yoga (mystical Hindu practice where people adopt positions and poses that worship false gods/demons), physical exercise ("exercise profiteth little" Philippians),


of we sinners from eternal death by the shedding of His perfect blood on the cross of Calvary.

Ancient Briton

In our last article we saw some of the beginnings of a Great Apostasy in these Isles. As the 19th century moved on, so we see the rise of Darwinism. Here was a theory said to be able to exist without the need for God. We have the writings of atheists like Voltaire and Rousseau that could be linked with evolution and man willing his own destiny. Further, evolutionary teaching was soon tied to theology and leading German apostates like Astruc, Strauss, Semler, Eichorn, Hupfeld and Kuenein stepped forth. The 'Standard Greek Text', the work of Westcott and Horst was to be the bible of the 20th century. It was the product of apostates in the Church of England and had scholarly backing from men like Lachmann, Mill, Griesbach, Fell, Scholz, Tregelles and Tischendorf.

However, first let's take a closer look at the 19th century and the spiritual war to destroy the pure Word of God. As the forces of darkness gathered we see God raise up a Protestant voice in the formation of the Protestant Alliance. He also sent forth the Protestant Truth Society and Kensit's Wycliffe Preachers. John Kensit was martyred in this land while preaching in the open air in 1902. Yes, 1902.

As Darwinism rose so men like Lamarck, Buffon, Sedgwick, Hutton, Lyle, Huxley and Alfred Russell Wallace stood forth with their evolutionary teachings. Step by step the aim was to overturn belief in the Genesis Flood. Their unscientific theories became 'fact', men accepted they had an animal past. Sin no longer existed, in fact it never had, they could be their own saviour.

Next, we witness a 'revival' of occultism spreading through Victorian England led by Madame Blavatsky. There was a huge rise in spiritism made popular by the likes of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle and Sir Oliver Lodge. There was also a growing denial of New Testament miracles. Then we have the establishment of the society for

Psychical Research that made occultism 'respectable'. We see the foundations of the Vegetarian Society laid that plays its part in today's New Age world view. There was a huge rise in seances, the 'doctrine of devils' were abroad.

However, Satan is aware that there is still a lot of believers that wield a blood washed Book, the A.V 1611 Bible. So, his next move is, the Book must be undermined from within. How will this be done? German universities like Tubingen would supply scholars to feed their teaching to British universities and on to the pulpit. The idea? To take the 'science' of evolution and apply it to theology and religion with a particular concentration on that of ancient Israel. The plan, first weaken the supernaturalism of the Old Testament. Why? Because if the foundations were undermined it would help destroy faith in the New Testament, this would also impact on the unity of the Book. The establishment of 'scientific evolution' could be used to interpret the Bible.

Taking the theology departments was easy. Men like Astruc attacked the Mosaic authorship from which developed the multiple authorship theory which led to the Graff Wellhousen Theory. Scores of theologians were bewildered by the 'evidence' and the 'assured results of scholarship', thus their faith was undermined. Soon the liberal scholars took their 'Higher Criticism' into the ministerial colleges and men like David Straus strongly pushed an evolutionary view of the Old Testament.

As already mentioned the target was the Old Testament, especially the record of Creation. Remove this account and faith in it, call it a myth, legend, poetry and allegory and the new doctrine of evolution could win the day.

So the guns of Higher Criticism opened fire, making Abraham a myth, Joseph a legend, leaving Egypt via the miracles of Moses, false, no crossing of the Red Sea, no wilderness wanderings, no fall of Jericho, David not the sweet psalmist, Jonah a myth, Goliath a legend and countless other stories were all said to be silly superstitions.

If certain books were difficult to challenge as false, a later date of writing was pronounced on them, than they were said to be written after the events they recorded.

However Satan had still not removed the Book. So he had another plan. That plan was and is to undermine the genuine with a counterfeit. We now see the Revised Version of 1881 step forth. The Alexandrian Text was back in town. Westcott and Hort and the committee that met for ten years gave us the text that was to be the foundation for modern bibles. The consequences of their 'work' a corrupt, doctrinally impure and worldly 'church'.

With the dawn of the 20th century a new group of believers, ministers and scholars came through. There were still thousands of A.V users but faith in the Book

had been shaken. You may ask, if Satan wants to destroy the Bible why produce a counterfeit? He knows men are religious by nature, therefore give them a false book to go with a false religion. There will therefore always be a false and a True Bible. There always has been since the beginning of the New Testament Church.

The 20th century was a time when many scientists and theologians believed man was 'coming of age', few noted the storm clouds that were to rock this 'Sceptred Isle'. The Victorian 'Age of Faith' was gone. 'Reason' was not god. The A.V Bible, 'the secret of England's greatness', was now little esteemed but there would be a price to pay and it would be paid in the trenches of World War I. The seed of unbelief had been sown, now it was 'harvest' time. You cannot discount the history and direction of a nation from it's response, whether positive or negative, to the Word of God. The Golden Age, the god of science, the god of assured scholarship were dumb stupid idols.

By the time World War II hit the church was in growing chaos and at the end of it much faith had been swept away. The voice of the prophet was almost silent and for most preachers who had imbibed the poison there was no longer an authoritative Bible. Huge parts of the church were now in love with the 'biblical' text that had existed in the Dark Ages. The A.V Bible wasn't just dumped, it was mocked, cursed, vilified, textually amended and classed as archaic. The work of the A.v translators was considered inferior, theologically a fossil, something that stood in the way of union with Rome.

If you don't do the will of God, someone is gonna get mad at you."

Spencer continues, "The point is that NO MATTER WHAT YOU DO, someone is gonna get mad at you. So you may as well do the will of God, let the chips fall where they may, and rest knowing that at least what you are doing is pleasing God."

Ultimately though we will let God have the last word on the matter, as the writer of the Book of Hebrews reminds us that we are to, "Make perfect in every good work to do his will, working in you that which is well pleasing in his sight, through Jesus Christ; to whom be glory for ever and ever. 


May the Lord be with you all in raising our children in this sadly sin filled world, teaching them the love and truth of Jesus. Amen.





Book of Ruth - Part Nine

We mirror Boaz's earnestness by swiftly resuming our look at the final chapter of this incredible little book. Following Ruth's submission and request to Boaz that he become her's and Naomi's Kinsman Redeemer, Boaz sets off the next day to assemble the elders in the hope of fulfilling the request of his beloved Ruth.

We see in verse 2 of chapter 4, that Boaz is eager to settle the matter, so he calls together ten elders of Bethlehem and instructs them to listen to the situation at hand. Boaz has not hesitated or delayed by waiting for the next allotted convening of the elders. He is not enslaved to adherence of men's clerical tradition as his concern is the welfare of his dear Ruth and old Naomi. As we have seen time and again, the character of Boaz foreshadows the Lord Jesus as we see consistently in the ministry of Jesus as He walked amongst man, His concern was not mindless adherence to man's self righteousness (see His numerous interactions with the pompous religious leaders of Israel), but to seek out and redeem the weak and weary of both body and soul.

Boaz's speed of thought and action is motivated by His awareness and love of the character of Ruth. Remember that in chapter 3, Boaz had commented on how all the city knew that Ruth was a virtuous woman. Such a woman is a gift of God indeed and to any hesitant Christian man reading this who is certain of the Godly, virtuous nature of a woman whom he is thoughtful to marry, I say to you linger no longer and secure this rare treasure with which God has greatly blessed you. Christ does not dither when a repentant heart cries out to Him for redemption. No, He straightway becomes that souls Kinsman Redeemer and creates in them a new heart, giving them His own righteousness.

As we enter verses 3 and 4, we see the gentle wisdom of Boaz begin to shine through. He sets out a business advertisement highlighting the sound deal that is available to a closer relative of Naomi by buying the

land belonging to the house of Elimelech, Naomi's deceased husband. Seeing the potential profit, the closer relative of Naomi than Boaz happily says he will buy the land by stating "I will redeem it." This unknown relative is keen to 'redeem' a clearly profitable piece of land, for he is obviously a noble and charitable man (said with tongue in cheek).


Yet in verse 5, Boaz makes it clear that with the redeeming of the land the relative would also have to take Ruth as his wife and raise a child to the name of her deceased husband Mahlon. This was established law within Israel during this time of the Judges as it would ensure provision for the widow and the continuation of the line of the deceased husband.

Boaz calm approach to the matter ensured that all legal frameworks were accurately followed but that also the moral bankruptcy of this unknown relative of Naomi was exposed in front of several witnesses. It would've been very easy for Boaz to try and cut a deal for Ruth and the land behind closed doors. Yet such an approach is sinful, and as a descendant of Boaz, namely Solomon, would later observe with the heavenly insight of the Holy Spirit, those who try to hide a sin will not prosper (Proverbs 28:13).

So in verse 6 we see a quick reversal of decision by the other relative of Naomi, as he firmly declines the offer and then adds insult to injury by calling a marriage to Ruth as a 'mar to his own inheritance'. Yet what the world sees as ugly and unwanted, the Lord sees great beauty and value. For this apparent 'smear' of an inheritance according to man, God elevates to become part of the lineage of Jesus Himself. So the cast off of the world should not be troubled, instead pray the Lord will have on pity on you and extend to you entrance into the Kingdom of God through the perfect blood of Christ Jesus.

So with the disgusted dismissal by the unknown relative, Boaz instead is invited and joyfully accepts to buy the land and take Ruth as his wife as he is the next closest relative. We see in verses 7 and 8 that the custom of this period to signify the completion of estate law was for the surrendering party (the one passing on the deal which in this case was the unknown relative) to remove their shoe and give it to the successful party, in this case Boaz. This acted as a symbolic gesture that any right to tread on the land involved in the matter, had been passed over to the other individual involved in the agreement.

Therefore with the surrendering of a shoe signifying the transfer of ownership of the land and responsibility of dear Ruth, Boaz seals his position as kinsman redeemer of Ruth and Naomi. Remember that to be a Kinsman Redeemer, the man in question must be a free man, not bound in slavery to anyone and be free from all debt, owning his property fully. Boaz fulfils these requirements and so has the power and capacity to aid Ruth and Naomi. As Boaz foreshadows in his saving act, Christ fulfils perfectly in the Redeeming of sinful mankind from righteous judgement and damnation. Jesus alone is free from all bondage to sin and answerable to no man or created being. Jesus alone holds all creation as His own, having formed it by His Word, so being in debt to no one. Hence why Satan's tempting of Jesus in the wilderness that Satan would give Jesus all the kingdoms of the world if Jesus would worship Satan, were quickly rebuffed by Christ, for Satan had no such authority to offer the world in any deal. Therefore Jesus fulfils the criteria of Kinsman Redeemer perfectly for a sinful mankind, who in the granting of redemption by the grace of God, we pass from ownership of death to ownership of life in Christ Jesus.

A joyous scene erupts in verses 9 and 10 as Boaz happily calls all who are gathered to act as witnesses to his becoming Kinsman Redeemer of Ruth and Naomi. Far from the shame of that the unknown relative believed he would incur in marrying Ruth the Moabitess, Boaz declares it with to all with a bold and joyful song. This unbridled joy and celebration of redemption gives but a pale glimmer of the heavenly joy released as the all the angels sing at the redeeming of but one lost soul to Christ. Such a momentous act cannot be hidden away in shame, for all of heaven acts as witness to the grace of Christ towards a repentant heart as He becomes our eternal Kinsman Redeemer.

Boaz continues in his embrace of the seemingly shameful (according to the world's estimation) by announcing to the no doubt celebratory crowd (remember how all the city acknowledged Ruth as a virtuous woman in chapter 3) that he would raise up a child with Ruth in the name of Mahlon, her deceased husband. Boaz declares the purpose of this noble venture to all to highlight how he would seek to ensure the name of the house of Elimelech would not be "cut off from his brethren, and from the gate of his place". In so doing Boaz fulfils the Mosaic law that protected the lineage of a deceased man's family name in he had not fathered children, whilst also ensuring the care of the grieving widow.

This restoration of the deceased's position within the people, fulfilled by Boaz, is a stunning reflection of how Jesus restores the dead in sin unto the heavenly fold, establishing the once shamed name into the Book of Life itself. Furthermore it is a brilliant microcosm of how the Lord will re-establish Israel in the last days, even though the people had wandered from the Lord as the house of Elimelech had done when they left Bethlehem for Moab. The Book of Ezekiel shares a powerful picture of this same miraculous event yet to come with the 'valley of the dry bones being restored to life' (Ezekiel 37:1-4).

Yet as this wilful drift from God brought tragedy indeed to Elimelech and his family, God drew blessing out of the rebellion by bringing the virtuous Ruth into the chosen people of God, making her part of the lineage of Jesus Himself. So too has God crafted blessing from the wilful ignorance of the Jews so that in their rejection of Jesus and the Gospel, it was then given unto we, the Gentiles. Furthermore the embracing of Ruth the Moabitess into the people of God by the Lord was a clear reminder to the Israelites that they weren't a special people because of what they could offer to God; they were and are a special people to God purely by His will and good pleasure. This pompousness of heritage was revealed routinely by the Pharisees in Jesus' earthly walk as He consistently warned them to not elevate themselves just because they were descendants of Abraham. Indeed Christ spoke against this self righteousness by stating that He could easily raise up children of Abraham from the stones on the floor.

Even in this pomposity, God has not abandoned His people. He will restore them when they cry out in realisation in the final hours of time that Jesus is their Messiah and Kinsman Redeemer. Herein Christ will deliver His people so that they might also not be "cut off from their brethren, and from the gate of his place", thereby fulfilling Ezekiel 37:1-4.

Verse 11 opens with the acknowledgment by the elders of their witness to this happy event as all the city look on in delight at the union of a Godly man and his virtuous bride. A beautiful day it will be indeed,

when all heaven shall witness the Marriage Supper of the Lamb when Christ and His bride the Church are united in glory together forever in the Fathers house.

It is clear from verse 11 and 12 of chapter 4, that given the rich blessings poured out onto Boaz and Ruth by the elders of the city, (that they would have many children together like Rachel and Leah bared for Jacob) that both Boaz and Ruth were greatly respected by the people. So whilst Ruth had suffered so greatly in recent years, her commitment to virtue before the Lord had been noticed and was about to be rewarded richly. Let this be a comforting reminder to us all that there will be long, hard days of loss, sadness and even despair; but when we commit to the Lord, hold fast to faith in Him, our labours in His name never go unnoticed and we shall be rewarded so graciously by Him.

An amazing historical detail is woven into the blessings uttered by the elders unto Boaz and Ruth, as they pray for a Godly line of men to come from this union. The line spoken of begins with Pharez, the son of Judah born of a sinful relationship between Judah and his daughter in law Tamar. This morally stained generation is not skipped by the elders as they give their blessing, but why not? Because it exalts the name of God for in His wondrous grace He ordained that the very line of Christ would flow through such sin rooted men. In this act, God highlights how His Son would be sent for such sinful souls and it is a physical reminder of Romans 5:20 where we are told, "where sin abounded, grace did much more abound".

So at long last we see the wedding of Boaz and Ruth arrive in verse 13 of chapter 4. Shortly after a son is born to Boaz and Ruth, highlighting the flowing blessings of God on this union.

In this happy news the women of city celebrate with the once broken hearted Naomi, as they all give thanks to God for the delivery of so loving a redeemer as Boaz. Note how the praise is fixed firmly on the LORD and how all these wonderful events that had taken place are solely because of Him and no other. How slow we are today to give full praise to God for the wonderful blessings He graciously gives us. Yet as the women sing these praises, highlighting the grace of God in bringing one such as Boaz to Naomi, the song is so sweet, the words so heavenly it would not be amiss to believe they are singing of the Redeemer of Israel Jesus Christ. This is seen exquisitely in verse 15 as the women note to Naomi, "he shall be unto thee a restorer of thy life". Yes they are speaking of the dear little one who will be called Obed, as Naomi nurses him through his early life, but who else is a restorer of life but Jesus Christ?

Verse 15 also makes a fantastic stand against the deeply flawed argument that the Bible is sexist towards women. The blessing and thanks given by the women to God with Naomi observes that the love of Ruth towards Naomi is worth more than seven sons. Remember Naomi has buried her two sons back in Moab, yet in her faith in God, He has blessed her with a love so deep, pure and true as witnessed in Ruth towards Naomi, it is clear even to strangers that it is of more worth than even many sons. How precious the love of one virtuous woman is towards another individual according to Scripture is absolutely huge and should never be underestimated. Ladies bear this in mind, the heavenly love of God that you can reflect in your life is so momentous it can drastically alter many lives for the better. It is wondrous gift that has been cruelly robbed off women by the modern feminist movement, as women have become cold, distant, aggressive, controlling, opinionated and greedy; all hallmarks of the Father of lies that is Satan, the author of such modern movements.

We close this beautiful little book with the genealogy that flows from this providential union of Boaz and Ruth. In but three generations the mighty King David will rise to the throne of Israel. Though a sinner, a king whose heart was after the Lord's own and one so dearly loved by God that he would be promised that from this same bloodline, one would come who would sit on the same throne with all power and glory forever. Again at best we have unproven theories as to how stars could be 'born' but these are considered hopeful in the extreme even within secular science.

So how do we explain these massive yet youthful entities? Genesis 1:14-15 explains it all very neatly and concisely. God made the stars on day four of creation week approximately 6000 years ago according to Biblical history. This timeframe is ideal for the massive Blue Stars to still exist given how much of their own mass they consume to sustain themselves. The young Earth creationist once again has sound scientific evidence for their position, which is hardly surprising given that the only eye witness account we have of the beginning of the universe is God's revealed Word, other Bible.

Provision for a Nation

In the second half of our look at chapter 39 of Genesis, we come to study the false accusation that led to Joseph's imprisonment. How often in life do we find the innocent falsely accused by the wicked in order to see the innocent fall. Sin wants to bring us all down, by hook or by crook, and it will drag us there by any means. Yet Joseph is a shining example to us all in remaining steadfast in his righteousness and honour despite a most powerful temptation to sin. By the end

of this chapter Joseph, like his saviour Jesus Christ, is numbered with the transgressors. Yet from this position he shines forth in the darkness.

Verse 7 - And it came to pass after these things, that his master's wife cast her eyes upon Joseph; and she said, Lie with me.

His masters wife's interest in Joseph was not immediate, but took time to develop. But note that the sin began with the lust of the eyes. Our eyes are a tremendous source of temptation into sin especially that of lust. Does not the Lord say it is better for us to pluck out an eye that offends than have both and be in Hell (Matthew 18.9).

The mistress of the house had already committed adultery of the heart before she ever said a word or tried to lay a hand on Joseph. (Matthew 5:28). But when she finally does make her move it is with no attempt at subtlety. Given her brazenness in her outright request to lay with her it should be of little surprise that she has no issues in falsely accusing him later. No doubt she was an attractive women, and no doubt that being the wife of the captain of the guard she felt that she was difficult to turn down in her requests whatever they may have been. Clearly the fact that she had a husband did not act as the cover to her eyes that protected her thoughts of lust from all others. She had a focus of her attention and was quite set on getting her way. She was, one would suspect, not expecting the response that came from Joseph.

Verses 8-9 But he refused, and said unto his master's wife, Behold, my master wotteth not what is with me in the house, and he hath committed all that he hath to my hand;

There is none greater in this house than I; neither hath he kept back any thing from me but thee, because thou art his wife: how then can I do this great wickedness, and sin against God?

Joseph remains steadfast and upright before God. Though he is young, the head of all in his masters home and single, he does not entertain this advance for a moment. In fact his refusal is a three pronged one, attempting to prick the conscience of Potiphar's wife enough to put the breaks on the situation. Firstly he states that his master holds him in the highest esteem, and with the highest trust and respect that any man could in his own household. And this is a very good first reason for denying the request. The greater the trust placed the greater the betrayal and baser the act if the trust is broken. Secondly, Joseph points out that whilst Potiphar had committed everything into Josephs hand, that did not include his wife, for she belonged to Potiphar alone, and Joseph recognised the marriage covenant as one taken before God. As such his third point is the most important. To accept the request is to directly break a covenant taken before God and as such is a great wickedness. He calls a spade a spade, and spells out the sin for what it is.

Verse 10 And it came to pass, as she spake to Joseph day by day, that he hearkened not unto her, to lie by her, or to be with her.

All of this appears to have gone completely over the mistress of the homes head. Or at least in one ear and out the other. She is fixated on Joseph as a prize she must conquer, and his concerns that he would be breaking his masters trust, or indeed that she was Potiphar's wife were not concerns she shared. It is likely that in Egypt adultery was not uncommon and therefore more easily shrugged off as a sin. That is not to say that it did not come without the harshest of penalties. Indeed for the accusation later to be levelled at Joseph, Potiphar could have had him executed. But my point here is sins are always easier to commit if the culture at large does not find them abhorrent but tolerates or perhaps even embraces them. We are certainly seeing this in the culture at large today are we not.

Potiphar's wife therefore, with singleness of mind continues her pursuit and repeated attempts at solicitation of Joseph. Joseph however does what we should all do with the strength of God by our side. He goes out of his way to avoid the temptation. Not only does he refuse her but he goes out of his way to avoid being in situations in the home where he is with her, especially alone presumably. However it is almost inevitable that this could not be maintained forever, especially were one of the parties is so determined to

get their way. Yet we should take note that when faced with a situation where we know that sin and temptation lies in wait, we should actively seek to avoid these situations.

Verses 11 and 12. And it came to pass about this time, that Joseph went into the house to do his business; and there was none of the men of the house there within.

And she caught him by his garment, saying, Lie with me: and he left his garment in her hand, and fled, and got him out.



Whether this was a setup we will never know. Given her brazen attitude and her stature as an important woman, it would not be beyond possibility that she could have asked all the other servants to leave the house. Josephs subsequently finds himself in the position that he has tried so hard to avoid. This time however she physically lays hold of him, certainly at least his outer coat. One can imagine her sneaking up behind him, and from this position it would be easier for Joseph to quickly shrug off the outer garment and escape. This is not the first time that Joseph's garment has gotten him in trouble and then been used as evidence in a deceit. Joseph again represents the model we should all follow. When presented with a situation where the temptation to sin was front and centre he didn't simply move to another room. He fled! He got himself completely out of the whole house!.

Verses 13-15 And it came to pass, when she saw that he had left his garment in her hand, and was fled forth, That she called unto the men of her house, and spake unto them, saying, See, he hath brought in an Hebrew unto us to mock us; he came in unto me to lie with me, and I cried with a loud voice:

And it came to pass, when he heard that I lifted up my voice and cried, that he left his garment with me, and fled, and got him out.

Joseph left with such pace that it seems to have even taken the mistress of the house by surprise. Now a woman scorned she decides that since she can't have her way she will exact revenge on Joseph. How dare he turn her down! If she couldn't embroil him in sin, she has a great intent to accuse him of it. Here we see an example of lustful wanton "love" all too rapidly converting to hatred when spurned. We can see a similar example in Amnon and Tamar in 2 Samuel 13-15. This is in contrast to holy God ordained and blessed love that continues even when spurned or slighted, and for a wonderful example of this see Hosea.

The first thing she does is to round up the other men of the house, the other servants presumably who themselves may have harboured some jealousy and resentment towards Joseph and the favour shown to him by the master of the home. This feels like a rather familiar situation.

We also see further evidence of the lack of respect for her husband in that she doesn't refer to him as her husband, master or even lord, but rather simply just "he". She continues by making sure that everyone knows that she cried out for help and this was what had caused Joseph to flee. By doing so she impresses on all her innocence in the scene. Indeed later in the book of Deuteronomy, such a cry for help is used to help determine the innocence of the women in such matters. She wants and needs a sympathetic audience. Whilst a 'he said she said' situation here would cary much weight in her favour given her position in the home, its even better if she can persuade others in the home of the authenticity of her story. The more people that believe her story the better chance she has of exacting revenge, because these are people that may have genuinely wished to believe evil of Joseph.

Verse 16-19 And she laid up his garment by her, until his lord came home. And she spake unto him according to these words, saying, The Hebrew servant, which thou hast brought unto us, came in unto me to mock me: And it came to pass, as I lifted up my voice and cried, that he left his garment with

me, and fled out. And it came to pass, when his master heard the words of his wife, which she spake unto him, saying, After this manner did thy servant to me; that his wrath was kindled.

Her dramatisation takes the next step in waiting with the coat by her side for the Master of the house to return. One can almost imagine her laying on the bed or on the couch with Josephs coat laying with her as a proof positive image of her story. She certainly sells it effectively as Potiphar, despite the esteem with which he held Joseph, takes his wife side. To be fair to Potiphar, I suspect unless you were utterly certain of your wife's infidelity, you would make the same judgement. It is natural to favour the loved one over the servant.

Verses 20-23: And Joseph's master took him, and put him into the prison, a place where the king's prisoners were bound: and he was there in the prison. But the Lord was with Joseph, and shewed him mercy, and gave him favour in the sight of the keeper of the prison. And the keeper of the prison committed to Joseph's hand all the prisoners that were in the prison; and whatsoever they did there, he was the doer of it. The keeper of the prison looked not to anything that was under his hand; because the Lord was with him, and that which he did, the Lord made it to prosper.

In what plays out next we see the grace of God towards Joseph once again. Being cast into prison was a relatively light sentence. God intervenes here and puts his hand of restraint on Potiphar's anger which could have justifiably led to Josephs execution, should he have so wished. But being captain of the guard he had access to the Pharaoh's prison and this is where he decided to incarcerate Joseph to rot away the rest of his existence. This was also God's hand in that had he been slung into any old prison in a far flung location within Egypt's boarders, Joseph would have likely never come into contact with those that would be able to bring him to the attention of Pharaoh.

And so once again Joseph finds himself in a 'hole' a long way from home and with no comfort from those he knows and loves. And yet God does not abandon him. Prison bars are no barrier to Christ. How many

stories have we read and heard of dear brothers and sisters in Christ, imprisoned for righteousness sake, who tell of how in this location, within prison walls they never felt closer to God. A wonderful example of this in modern times would be the life of Rev Richard Wurmbrand, tortured mercilessly by the Soviets for his faith, but who felt Christ ever more clearly with him, the harder they tried to break him.

But for Joseph even within this setting, his love for his God, and the blessings God bestows in return are evident to the prison authorities. A good man will do good wherever he finds himself because by the fruits ye shall know them. Good works are the fruits of salvation here in the old testament also, such that God raised up a 'friend' in the most unlikely of individuals – the keeper of the prison.

May we as believers all follow this pattern and strive by the grace and will of God to do good whatever situation we find ourselves in, such that those around us may see Christ in us. Amen.
