#### Oh The Gift Of God To Give

A message from Judges 6:11-16

We all have certain phrases and sayings that we offer up regularly when seeking to give our thoughts on a matter. Usually these are lazy cliches and are simply regurgitations of worldly foolishness provided by a tongue that doesn't have anything insightful to offer but feels the need to fill the air so as to avoid embarrassment.

Yet sometimes, a phrase sticks out, an expression hits a mark that has been long prepared for the bull eyes hit by the Holy Ghost long before the words ever left the tongue of the speaker. One such oft repeated saying that has stayed with me is something my Nana would often say as they were walking out the door to end the topic of discussion. It went like this, "Oh the gift of God to give, that we would see ourselves as God sees us." I remember when she said these words everyone listening would cease speaking and simply nod and 'hmm' in gentle agreement. It was a great debate/conversation closer.

I would often think, 'It's a strange gift to see yourself as a wicked sinner, as I know this is what God sees in me.' Of course it is very much a gift of God to have the heart woken from its spiritual death and hear the alarm of the Holy Ghost that we are in eternal danger of judgement and the wrath of God if we do not repent of our sins and believe in the Risen Christ Jesus. Yet this is not the context that my Nana would use this insightful saying. She would offer it up as a message of reassuring challenge to those who lacked belief and conviction in what God can do with a single life. As I write these words, I recall how these words would fill the air and land in my mind when I was often at my most doubtful of what value, significance or importance I might have been blessed with and what I could possibly succeed in.

What my Nana was alluding to was something some of the reluctant heroes of the Bible experienced, the disparity of what one sees and believes of themselves and what the Lord knows is in them. One example of this in the life of Moses. God selected a hot blooded man with a temper that lead even to murder but also possessed a willingness to hide from challenge and fear of public speaking and leadership. Yet the Lord knew Moses far better than Moses knew himself and selected him for the mighty task of leading his people from bondage and towards the promised land of their forefathers.

You see God will often select the individuals for a task who the world sees as the poorest choice for the task. For example, if you are trying to establish a 'new faith', then surely you wouldn't pick 12 nobodies from the backend of a nation, many of them uneducated, rough of speech and look and the rest from backgrounds and occupations hated by the people. Yet this is exactly what God did with the 12 disciples. Such was the conviction of God in selecting these men to build His church that their very names are carved into the Heavenly City.

With this being said, God will also select those with the in-built skills, abilities and character to succeed in a role given unto them by His ordination. Such traits are very, very often missed by the world. Simply look at many of your colleagues at work. Sadly many of them are not suitable for the roles they are in but whoever appointed them did not see the inner qualities of the individual, they only saw the paperwork in the C.V. It is not a C.V that leads to success, it is of the character, the heart of the individual that leads to success. Brilliance breeds success when it comes from a motivated heart. To see these traits and skills that often lay dormant in the individual, takes a heavenly eye. When the eyes of God look for one whom He will use to bring about His will, His perfect knowledge and wisdom selects those whom He has placed all the required skills and abilities, even if they have never been revealed to the individual in question. What is crucial as already stated, is the condition of the heart before God.

When this revealing of the selection of God for the fulfilment of His divine will is made, the individual thus called will often be utter perplexed as to their suitability for the role in question. They will have likely never flexed the muscles that God calls them to use with all power and might and so they doubt their very existence. It is like someone whose body aches 'in muscles they didn't know they had' after a new sporting activity is indulged in. Yet the muscles were there, they just weren't being worked. This is the power of negativity, it humbles and allows no place for pride for self congratulation. In the confusion and doubt seen in so many called by God throughout the Bible, it is emphasised that God exalts the lowly of heart and not the proud and arrogant. God will not share His glory with the vain, puffed up or pompous for they are after their father the Devil.

It could be said then that God is the ultimate headhunter, He always recruits the finest workers and has a 100% success ratio in their placements. Recruitment agencies today can only dream of such efficiency and accuracy in their placements! Yet despite knowing this and having seen this excellence of appointment many times over in the Bible, when it comes to ourselves we doubt and join the harmony of Moses in singing, "send someone else, I'm not the one you want."


Our Lord is so very patient though. He knows our enormous hesitancy to labour for Him, our desires to cling onto the world and happiness in hiding from the seemingly scary. So after being the ultimate recruitment consultant and headhunter, he becomes the ultimate motivator.

So how do you motivate a reluctant person whose wracked with self doubt and disbelief, to believe? Jose Mourinho, the football coach, when he took over at Chelsea FC in 2004, set about to turn a talented but doubtful squad into a team of winners. He would find out England midfielder Frank Lampard, a promising but unfulfilled talent, and tell him with absolute certainty and conviction that he was the best midfielder in the world. Seeing that Frank was pleased but doubtful of such praise, Mourinho kept going and would pop up at surprising times just to say to

Frank that he was indeed the best midfielder in the world. Mourinho saw something that Frank himself didn't and he assured him that he could succeed. As Frank Lampard would go on to say, I started to believe it and he went to become Chelsea's record goal scorer. Now if a fallen man such as Mourinho can spot hidden talent and motivate through walls of doubt, don't you think that God can do it even more impressively?!

So after this lengthy introduction, we turn to Judges 6:11-16 and we meet Gideon. Israel is in the time of the Judges, post Joshua and his Godly leadership and pre-kingship of Saul. It is a time of constant war and fear for the Israelites as they consistently fall into hideous idolatry (after failing to listen to God's command in wiping out all the Canaanites) and so reap the judgement of a jealous God.

Israel is under the oppression of the Midianites (the same people whom Moses fled to - lesson, don't assume that because someone helped you before, they won't be happy to attack you later) and are crying out to God for deliverance. This deliverance is not deserved as the Israelites had been serving the foul gods of the Amorites, but Our Lord takes pity on them and so calls a leader to rise up and free His people from oppression. This individual would be the rather unimpressive Gideon. Son of Joash the Abiezrite, Gideon is from a poor, totally unremarkable family from the tribe of Manasseh, an unimpressive tribe of Israel. As Gideon observes in verse 15, he's not even the most prominent male in this unimportant family. Here's your conquering hero everyone, impressed?



God however has no interest in the status of societal constructs. He has no respect of persons or rank and looks instead for a heart that is tender to His own. Rarely does such a soul arise from the well to do of the world, for such souls are self involved and vain and God will not share His glory with any puffed up sinner! No, God instead looks at the heart and sees something in Gideon that Gideon does not understand yet. Here's the gift of God to give, He is showing Gideon how He sees Him and it is remarkable indeed!

So the worker has been found, the job located, defeating the Midianites and freeing the Israelites, now the pitch to the prospective worker. God is of eternal wisdom and wondrous tenderness to the humble of spirit, so He approaches Gideon in a stirring and uplifting manner that is dissimilar to the call of Moses, even though both men doubted their ability to fulfil the role. Moses was prone to anger and fiery of heart but also famed for his meekness. A confusing blend in many ways. Such a character needs consistency and strength, one to put the fiery heart in its place and the other to underpin a nervous application. Gideon however is greeted with, "The Lord is with thee, thou mighty man of valour". There has never been a finer motivational speech in all history. God knows that Gideon is humble of heart and will be terrified about the thought of leading a nation against a powerful enemy, so He opens with the assurance that He closed with with Moses, that He is with him. Gideon needs reassurance before the task is laid out; doubt of skills and abilities is rife in Gideon so God places all the emphasis on His own shoulders. Some need responsibility gently placed on the shoulders before they set off timidly, others are better having it simply put on them and then given a shove. Gideon is the former, Moses is the latter but God sees the heart perfectly and assures and motivates each one uniquely and perfectly. This is the level of care and attention God applies to each of His children. Do not think this is special attention given to a handful of historical figures. No, no. It is the same attention He gives each and every single one of those who trust in Him.

Herein is the essential point of this entire issue. The wondrous depths of strength, mercy, wisdom, love, stewardship, meekness and courage that God sees in us is not of our own. There is a worrying proliferation of self-help guides in Christian bookstores, all designed so that the reader might unlock the plan God has for them and how they can achieve incredible success and security. These books have bought into the self esteem movement of psychiatry and mingled it with a repugnant dose of 'Christianised' self enlightenment propagated by Eastern mystic religions such as Hinduism and Buddhism. These books teach that God will unlock hidden resources, skill and knowledge through your self realisation of the latent brilliance within you. This undoubtedly appeals to pride filled man who is aching for any source of congratulatory praise as to it's basic condition as a human being.

Yet this is not Scriptural. As we have seen, God appoints His labourers according to the tenderness of their hearts in regards to His ordained will. Those who are humble of heart will be blessed and called by The Lord to labour in His glorious name and they will be supplied with all provisions required by The Lord Himself to fulfil His appointed task. God is able to greet Gideon as a "mighty man of valour" not because of any remarkable hidden wonders lying latent within Gideon but because He sees a heart humble in service to God. A humbled heart acknowledging the glory of God and one's own sin in regard to such supreme holiness and righteousness, is one ripe to receive the grace of God. Thus in the grace of God, the righteousness of the Son is imputed to the humbled heart and all wondrous virtues of Christ are now possible to be reflected in the life of the one who was once lost unto God. This is the whole point of the oft miss used verse, "I can do all things through Christ". It is not about Christ rubber stamping your efforts or your will. It is not a motivational, positive thinking mantra for the sceptical Christian to tell themselves when things aren't going how they wanted it to in life. Such a faulty application of this powerful verse has led many believers into self motivated decisions believing they are doing God's will, assuring themselves that Christ is on their side so they can do anything. However what is missed is that God

never ordained their self pious decision and so does not bless their endeavours. So as the decision fails to work, the disillusioned Christian begins to doubt the care of their Saviour rather than acknowledge their sin and seek God's forgiveness for plotting on ahead without His perfect counsel.

As God looks at the humble hearted, those who adore Jesus and are repentant of their own filthy rags of sin, He sees the righteousness of His own beloved Son in them. Now with the eternal depths of power, glory, grace, love, mercy, courage, wisdom that Christ holds held within the redeemed heart, they can go to the well of life and never thirst for provision in any task, no matter how large irregardless of what skills or talents they personally hold or believe they hold. This is the real application of "I can do all things through Christ", as He is the One who sustains every believer every moment of every day.



This is where all psychiatry, self help guides, life coaches, motivational speakers fail so spectacularly so frequently. They can't 'sustain' anyone's ability, anyone's hopes, anyone's peace, anyone's courage. They can merely observe what has been observed in a persons character and suggest alterations they may or may not improve the individual in question. It is all guesswork and any positive effect they have on an individual is very often only a temporary one akin to an adrenaline rush for the mind. As a character in a comedy show noted, "I was so hungry I ate a radish and told myself it was an apple. It didn't work, the mind has limits". Yet Jesus Christ is eternal, One whose depths of wisdom, power and glory swallow up all eternity such is His majesty. Here then, God is able to look at the most unremarkable, uneducated, non-courageous

person in the world and soften their hearts to His eternal love so that in their God enlightened humility, He can imbue them with the Spirit of God revealed in the glory of Jesus Christ. This is how the pre-incarnate Christ Jesus could sit peacefully under the shade of oak tree and greet a frightened Gideon as a mighty man of valour. He saw a heart that was frightened yes, but one with a flickering flame of faith amidst the idolatrous nature of his family, and in so imputed His own righteousness to Gideon so that the wonders of God might be manifest in the lifting up of one so lowly.

Herein is the gift of God to give as my Nana used to say, that He sees His own Son when He looks on His redeemed own. To see this wondrous gift though requires us to take our gaze off how we see ourselves as self interest is contrary to interest in all that is good, all that is of God. This is the cruelty of the 'I am what I am' movement. How do you know for certainty that this is what you are? You changed once already in your most deep and important of thoughts, how do you know you won't change again. You are likely settling for a poor imitation of yourself, a lost, confused, directionless, scared soul clutching onto a life that does not satisfy or fulfil but you have convinced yourself that this is all you are. A self involved life is a one robbed of purpose and peace and instead wracked with doubt, anger, and selfishness, The selfishness and pride of such an existence is hostile to God, an assault on His Sovereign throne. No, you can be more. You can be God's. Then with dedication of heart and mind to God, humbling of self, He will pull out of you wonders that are born in the heart of God and will stun you and the world that looks on, all the while bringing glory to His name.


The LORD is good, a strong hold in the day of trouble; and he knoweth them that trust in him.





#### The Amulets of Ketef Hinnom

A young archaeologist named Gabriel Barkay led a small team on an excavation in the tombs of Ketef Hinnom (overlooks the Hinnom Valley in Jersusalem) in 1979. What they found was a staggeringly small but remarkable physical evidence of the ancient existence of Biblical texts within Pre-Babylonian conquest Israel (587 BC – era of Jeremiah and King Josiah).

They discovered tiny amulets with two separate Biblical texts engraved on it's minute form. One text is from Numbers 6:24-26 and reads:

May YHWH bless You and [May he] keep you [May] YHWH make His face shine Upon you and Grant you p[ea]ce

The amulets also contain a small variation of Deuteronomy 7:9. (YHWH is the ancient Hebrew way of writing Yahweh, meaning 'He who is' referring to God). Bear in mind that these words are engraved on the amulet and are so small that a microscope was needed to decipher them! Whoever inscribed these Biblical words managed to get twelve lines of Hebrew on a metal scroll the approximate length of a matchstick.

These incredible finds have been estimated at being from the 7<sup>th</sup> century BC, underlining how the texts of the Pentateuch (first five books of the Bible) were readily available to the people long before the Babylonian conquest noted earlier in the article. This is a key consideration as many opponents of the historical accuracy and traditional dating of the Mosaic authorship of the

Pentateuch, argue that these texts were written by the Israelites whilst in captivity to the Babylonians. These critics of the Mosaic authorship of the Pentateuch contend that the books were written in this later period as a means of providing a morale boost to a beleaguered people by providing them a mythic history. However discoveries such as these amulets dismantle this unscholarly contention by their sheer existence! As always, the Bible doesn't need archaeology to verify it's history, it merely waits for it to catch up.

## The Great Deception-Part Two

We left part one of this series having introduced (among other matters), Westcott and Hort. Many modern scholars feel that Hort's greatest achievement was to 'kill' the 'Byzantine' Text or the Textus Receptus. At the age of 23 he says, 'I had no idea till the last few weeks of the importance of texts, having read so little Greek Testament, and dragged on with the villainous Textus Receptus'....'Think of that vile Textus Receptus'. That one so young should have such a hatred of a God blessed text is very revealing. Let me ask you, do you really believe that God would entrust His pure Word to such a one?

Before we move ahead to the setting-up of the Revision Committee, we need to look further at what is happening in the land. By 1870 the Oxford Movement has very successfully infiltrated the Church of England. This infiltration is to Romanise the National Church but also it provides a great opportunity to play a part in removing the A.V. Bible and replacing it with another 'standard'. Thus it will come about in coming years after Westcott and Hort's labours that all new translations will have an anti-Christian and pro Catholic prejudice against the Greek Text of the Reformation.

As the call came forth from certain quarters for a Revision, the reality was that the people of these Isles were not seeking such. There was no clamour from simple folk for an new Bible.

However, there were forces at work that took the guise of being conservative that were desperate for a revision of the A.V. They were determined to mess with a Text that for over 1500 years had given a witness to God's people. There was a highly motivated group of Ritualists, Puseyites etc who saw the chance of a great victory if they could bring down the Reformation Bible. They could in fact play a part in returning 'Mary's Dowry' (this land), to the Catholic Church.

Of course there were still present scholars who stood solidly behind the A.V Bible, we shall in fact D.V meet one later, the incomparable Dean Burgon, whose arguments against Westcott and

Hort's text still stand solid. There were also great literary men of those times who were not enamoured by the idea of a revision.

It was a time when many attacks were being launched against the faith. Religious views were being affected by the likes of Schleiermacher, an anti-rationalistic theologian whose views revolves around a system of gospel and pantheism. Other names like Coleridge were heavily into German theology and textual criticism. At Cambridge men like Milligan, Thirwall, Moulton, Westcott and Hort were definitely affected by some of the 'new learning'. All these personages would play their part on the Revision Committee. We could also add other names that are still 'praised' today in Colleges of theology but not in heaven. We refer to Lachlan, Tregelles and Tischendorf, he played his part in mutilating the Scriptures. As for Lachmann, he was more than happy to get rid of the Textus Receptus. Tregelles continually ignored the Received Text and a pile of other manuscripts that supported the A.V. Further, we cannot forget another polluter of God's Word. Bishop Ellicott, who was to become chairman of the Revision Committee, he saw the A.V as corrupt. The fact is, it was not God's Word that was corrupt but these men and their handling of it.

It is also highly informative to read some of the correspondence before the setting up of the Revision Committee between Westcott, Hort, Lightfoot, Ellicott and Williams. An example between Hort and Williams from 1858 gives us a look at the kinds of method of approach to allay suspicions on the part of others. Hort writes, 'The errors and prejudices, which we agree in wishing to remove, can surely be more wholesomely and effectually reached by individual efforts of an indirect kind than by combined open assault. At present very many orthodox but rational men are being unawares acted on by influences which will assuredly bear good fruit in due time, if the process is allowed to go on quietly; and I cannot help fearing that a premature crisis would frighten back many into the merest traditionalism'.

Notice the 'indirect' element, this is interesting because at that time and up to it the same approach had been followed in regard to pushing Darwinism amongst the clergy. On February 10<sup>th</sup> 1870, just eleven years after the publication of The Origin of Species, we have the resolution arrived at for a Revision of the A.V New Testament.

For a moment we shall look at the N.T. Committee. W.F Moulton had influence here in choosing candidates. Apart from his views on certain aspects of Greek Grammar, he had a distinctly favourable view on the Vulgate. This he saw as superior to the A.V. That fact is very alarming. He also stated in reference to the Jesuit N.T of 1582, 'The Rhemish Testament agrees with the best critical editions of the present day'. Out of these kind of views then, Moulton is obviously going to view with favour the critical editions of Tregelles, Lachmann and Tischendorf. Look, let's be clear, there is not a Bible-believer amongst this lot. These men and others with them are put forward with great gusto in Bible Colleges and Theological Seminaries today, but the bottom line is they were heretics posing as conservatives.

It can be demonstrated from some of their books that they were apostates, liberals and unbelievers. If we don't understand the part they played in changing from the Textus Receptus to

the new Westcott and Hort type text we shall not grasp how so many others on the committee got it so wrong. Hort swayed the whole scholarly world both in England and America to adopt this new 'Bible'. The likes of Hodge, B.B Warfield and his Presbyterians followed and the Greek scholar A.T Robertson's Southern Baptist Seminary followed him. Today in 2021, the majority of all American theological colleges and Seminaries do likewise. Warfield and A.T Robertson, a famous theologian and a famous Greek scholar were totally misled, thus reminding us that academic credentials do not necessarily bestow spiritual discernment.

Look, the early heretics polluted the Westcott and Hort type text. The reason they took out some things and not others was because they wanted the Bible to agree with them. In the first one hundred years after the Bible was written the heretics did not have every New Testament book in their possession, so they could rip out, change, or forge various verses. They could only corrupt verses in the books they had. But, if you take out anything, it is defective. How many words of God have to be left out of your Bible Pastor before it is no longer one hundred percent God's Word?

Let's now return to the Revision Committee. When the New Testament Committee met, suddenly a ten year rule of silence which had kept the English public in the dark was removed. Then when they began, the line they gave the public was that their guiding purpose was to make 'as few changes as possible', in the A.V. The reality was they made 36,000 changes, nearly 6000 of which were in the New Testament. Their 'Greek Text' was an 'eclectic text' based on a theory without proof that two manuscripts had more weight and authority in deciding textual variants than hundreds of Receptus manuscripts.

From the start Westcott, Hort and Lightfoot dominated the committee, the plan, to bring in the newest higher criticism. Westcott and Hort would redirect the committee from the agreed rules to introduce their own Greek New Testament. Bishop Wilberforce, one of the Committee left, he wrote to a friend, 'what can be done in this most miserable business'? Well,

he could have done a lot. He could have informed the whole of England what was happening. While this disgraceful Committee worked, the simple believers of the land had to watch while a Unitarian who denied the divinity of Christ named Dr G. Vance Smith, had been invited to join the work. Scrivener, a formidable scholar, tried it seems to hold the line against apostasy, sadly he should have resigned. Having said that I understand that he probably felt he should stay to do what he could. Often there are those in Churches who stay when they should go.



The Vaticanus Manuscript

Step by step, the New Greek Text of Westcott and Hort was being passed to the committee. This text was sheer poison and moved away from the Received Text. The committee were now following what in effect was the Vaticanus and Sinaiticus manuscripts. Westcott and Hort convinced enemies of the A.V that on the age of Vaticanus and Sinaiticus ALONE, the entire evidence of the Christian Church, Church Fathers, Greek manuscript evidence, Church History and the witness of the Holy Spirit was to be overthrown. It has been said, 'Westcott and Hort saw these manuscripts as 'infallible'.' Let me say, Vaticanus and Sinaiticus never enable any Bible student to find any light on any verse in either Testament that wasn't already clearly there 200 years before anyone published either manuscript. When Nestles put out his Greek text from Westcott and Hort after the Revised Version had been published, a hundred voices of criticism were raised to the effect that the entire operation had been a fifth column Catholic infiltration of the Church of England.

In the Revision room eventually they had changed approximately 6000 places. All of this was due to the commitee following Hort's fairytale theories.

Think about it Pastor, are you using a 'bible' based on the imagination of Hort? Hort was set on using the Vatican manuscript while admitting, as he had done, that the Received Text had for 1400 years been the received Greek New Testament.

I could quote various authorities at this point to refute the nonsense of Westcott and Hort but perhaps what Dr Scrivener wrote some time later after the Revision is most fitting, 'There is little hope for the stability of their imposing structure, if it's foundations have been laid on the sandy ground of ingenious conjecture: and since barely the smallest vestige of historical evidence has ever been alleged in support of the views of these accomplished editors, their teaching must either be received as intuitively true, or dismissed from our consideration as precarious, and even visionary'. Well, with more 'bibles' available today than you can shake a stick at, we know which way the wind blew.

Let me say at this point, there is no record in over a hundred years of Westcott and Hort even attempting to defend their case. A mass of documented evidence was presented against it. Students are often told 'Hort's knowledge of the manuscripts of the New Testament was ENCYCLOPAEDIC'. Why, he never published a collation on any manuscripts, he was unable to answer Hoskier's collation, he could not locate the manuscripts that Dean Burgon quoted and could not answer Burgon's attacks on his own manuscript position. Encyclopaedic, what a JOKE. Even today though students don't know it, Westcott and Hort's theory is not seriously defensible. Did you hear that all you Pastors with your modern versions? Westcott and Hort majored in theories wrapped in fancy packaging, theories such as 'longer and shorter readings' were false; their theories about a 'Lucian Recession' were false; their theories on intrinsic probability were false; their theories about 'family texts' were nonsense and their theories about 'Western readings' were twaddle.

Westcott and Hort pushed two obviously corrupted manuscripts, they are B and Aleph. B is the Vatican manuscript and Aleph the Sinai. They

saw them as superior, arguing they are the oldest therefore the purest, the problem is that in the field of manuscripts that argument is open to serious rebuttal. These two manuscripts are obviously corrupted. Interestingly the 'big cheese' according to 90% of apostates is the Vatican manuscript.

Let me ask you, do you really believe that God would leave His Word in the Vatican? Do you believe that while Rome has with the most awful cruelty persecuted the Church of Jesus Christ century after century that she would be the God appointed repository of God's Book?

As we sum up for now, we need to be aware that corrupting God's Word still goes on. Apostates on bible committees still reject the authority of God's Book (the A.V), as being full of 'errors', they they 'correct' it in line with their own opinions and then they demand 'respect'. ## **Polystyrene For Bones?**

## The Hatred of Religion Paradox



For all that do these things are an abomination unto the Lord: and because of these abominations the Lord thy God doth drive them out from before thee."

All these things are to be found in one form or another in the Harry Potter series of books. They are an ABOMINATION to the Lord. An abomination to the Lord is not time or situationally dependant. God is constant and doesn't change his mind. What was an abomination then remains so now. This is the end of the conversation. Your opinion, interpretation or translation are irrelevant.

One of our colleagues however seemed to take great offence to us returning the item. In an exchange with my wife, this lady who also has a young son, made the statement that she did not want anything remotely religious around her son, as religion was to blame for more hatred and bloodshed than anything else. This is not a new point of view. Atheists, especially in the last 150-200 years have used this argument ad nauseum. But the question is, how well does this statement hold water?

The 20<sup>th</sup> century was the bloodiest century this world has ever known. Since 1900 there have been 265 wars of note worldwide. But let's take this further, and according to the Encyclopaedia of Wars, out of all 1763 listed / recorded conflicts throughout history, only 123, which equates to 6.98% had religion as the foundational primary cause. If we are to be picky, this is not the actual number as there have been many occasions when wars have been orchestrated by the Roman Catholic Church in order to serve their political ends. However even if we are generous, religion still makes up the smaller percentage.



What about numbers dead? Well the atheists win out by a country mile here, especially if you are a Communist atheist. Mao Zedong, also known as Chairman Mao or MaoTse-tung, the founding father of the Peoples Republic of China and chairman of the Chinese Communist Party from 1949 to his death in 1976, is believed to be directly or indirectly responsible for between 40 and 80 MILLION deaths.
