A Subtle Indoctrination

Cinema is a powerful force. The motion picture medium has long been utilised by dictatorships to peddle propaganda to the populace as a mass market means of brainwashing. The Nazi commander Joseph Goebbels directly led the propaganda department of the Nazi Regime and used cinema as his primary means of moulding the minds of Germans to accept Nazi ideology. What is striking though is that when one of his Nazi promoting movies is viewed it is not anything like one would expect. The natural thought would be that swastikas would be waving, rousing speeches bellowed out with unearthly gusto, triumphant battle scenes etc etc. Yet Goebbels was far more subtle in his movements than to use such sledgehammer style methods of indoctrination. Instead his movies would seem completely unremarkable in their ideological stance, so little spoke of Nazism that if one was not alert to it's evil subterfuge, it would be alarmingly easy to be

swept up in it's hidden, brainwashing message of fascism.

After the defeat of Germany in WW2, many of those who worked in Goebbels sizeable movie production sphere moved to Hollywood, assumed American sounding names and became scriptwriters for major Hollywood studios. These writers political leanings and personal ideologies still anchored in Nazism found an open avenue through which they were able to continue their God defying work.

However Satan is subtle and slow in his movements so as not to draw attention to his work and so the changes were small but deliberate within western cinema. First came the anti-authority/anti-parent movies of the early 1950's spearheaded by stars such as James Dean and Marlon Brando. In much heralded movies as The Wild One and A Rebel Without A Cause. America was told that it was a legitimate thing to rebel against anyone in positions of authority, whether that be the police or parents. Timed exquisitely with the explosion of rock and roll music, the youth of Western society was given license to defy the commands of God in honouring of the father and mother (Exodus 20) and living in accordance with societal law (as long as this does not contravene the law of God).

The use of cinema to undermine the commands and precepts of God continued with ever increasing pace but all with a similar subtlety that only the spiritually alert could discern it's cancerous spread. Yet now the commands and precepts of God have been so expertly eroded by the attacks of Satan that he does not need to be so subtle in his assaults on the Word of God. He is now making open statements through movie makers, that aggressively challenge the very authority of what God has said to be good and holy.

Take for instance the latest Jurassic World movie, *Jurassic World Dominion*. The title itself makes a clear as day challenge to what God has ordained to be the natural order of the world. This title is making a bold statement that dominion, or control, of this world does not belong to man as ordained by God (Psalm 8:6) but instead to nature. It is

the classic attack of Satan to subvert the clear commands of God by flipping on its head what God has decreed to be good.

The attacks against God continue in this movie. One line spoken by the 'Chaos Theory expert' Dr Ian Malcolm (a character given a sort of seer/guru status amongst the franchise) declares, "In order to instigate revolutionary change, we must transform human consciousness". Most listeners of this declaration will accept and later regurgitate this New Age mantra without thinking as their eyes are feasting on the amazing special affects, action and spectacle on screen. What they have just ingested is a terrifying message that has been promoted for decades by Eastern mystics, New Agers and Occultists. This message being that for man and nature to 'co-exist peacefully' and for man kind to progress we must strive after a higher, deeper level of spirituality that unites all beings into one great mystic force. This is the goal of Hinduism, Buddhism, Taoism and all other eastern mystic religions, all of which share and embrace deeply Occultic practices that celebrate nothing less than Satan himself.



However the defying of God's ordination of who holds dominion over the natural world continues within this movie as the pantheistic character of Dr Ian Malcolm provides another assault against the Word of God. Elsewhere in the movie he states with breathless insight, "We not only lack dominion over nature, we are subordinate to it." Well the scriptwriters clearly have an anti-scriptural message to relay here as this goes completely against what God has to say on the matter. Turn to Genesis 1:26 and you will read God's decree that man will, "have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creepeth upon the

earth." God could be no clearer as to who holds dominion over the natural world, as He sets out His ordained order within the very first chapter of His revealed Word!

Tragically though this movie is far from being an isolated assault on the commands and precepts of God's Word. Hollywood is rife with material that is expertly crafted by those at the whim of Satan, whether they are aware of it or not. Material that is designed to plant ideas in the mind of mankind that makes us question the authority of God's Word. This should not surprise anyone as this has been Satan's primary weapon against humanity since the Garden of Eden when he first lead Eve to doubt what God had said and then to rebel against His authority.

However these deliberate assaults against God and His Word are not confined to Hollywood. Just this past month, the massively popular children's show Peppa Pig welcomed it's first same-sex marriage. This show is aimed at pre-schoolers! This inclusion of a same-sex couple was determined following a petition of just over 20,000 people demanded 'representation' for LGBT people. Now to put that in context the Peppa Pig YouTube channel alone receives 130 million views a week! It is broadcast in 180 countries to hundreds of millions of children and yet a mere 20,000 signatures is apparently enough to force through a sinister agenda such as LGBT rights in a toddlers TV show.

Those who once laughed at alert Christians who cried out against these subtle God defying messages being promoted within film and television are now living in a world where Satan no longer needs to be subtle in his movements. This should be an extremely sobering thought to all believers everywhere that we have been asleep spiritually when we should have been on guard against such subtle attacks. Many have allowed this evil to penetrate daily life simply because they have neglected their Bible or are using a modern translation (which all omit key passages to believers so as to dull their alertness to evil) so that they don't even recognise the enemy even when they are staring it in the face!

Having studied film history in university I am very aware of the subtle techniques filmmakers and script writers use to convey their messages without drawing attention. I can also tell you now that whilst I have been alert to these crafty tactics for some time, the awareness of these evil methods has increased dramatically the more I have studied the Scriptures. By studying the Word of God our hearts are brought ever more in line with God's own and the guiding voice of the Holy Ghost becomes ever clearer so that we are able to discern what is of God and what is not. I implore you to put down the TV remote and pick up your Bibles so that you too might be "stirred up in the faith" (2 Timothy 1:6) and see the wickedness of the world against the goodness of God all the clearer.

The Heavens Declare the Glory of God

Psalm 19:1 contains this marvellous observation by David that the very heavens that we observe each night, are a monument to the power of Almighty God. In our busy towns and cities, this observation made in all awe and reverence of God, does not seem to reflect what we witness in our night sky. Yet if you were to travel out into the countryside one night, far from the light pollution of urban surroundings, you would see a sea of shimmering stars that still illuminate the night

sky as they did in the time of King David (circa 1000B.C).

The unpolluted night sky does give a clearer image as to the awesome power and glory of God and yet what we know today through modern astronomy reveals another level of truth that David would not have known by just the naked eye.

There are over 2 million galaxies in the visible universe. Astronomers believe that the number of galaxies contained within the universe could exceed 100 billion! Now each galaxy contains multitudes of stars so considering that there could easily be 100 billion galaxies in the universe, the number of stars contained within these galaxies could be as many as 200,000 million x 100,000 million. Written as a number this looks like 20,000,000,000,000,000,000,000,000!

If a computer were to observe each star individually at the rate of 3 million stars a second (a staggering thought in itself!), it would take the computer 211 million years to observe them all! That is the scale of the universe and yet God swallows this up in His eternal presence and glory! This is how Almighty the LORD God is!

Now consider how we are told in Psalm 147:4, that He knows all the stars and not only this He knows them each individually by name! When our mortal mind melts down over the sheer scale of numbers put before us regarding the size of the universe and numbers of stars within it, God is able to know each star as a known individual entity! Such a thought should move us to utter humility and reverence before the LORD God and make us tremble before His thrice holv throne. Yet what do we see in many churches and many Christians today, a complete lack of humble reverence of believing in such a powerful God. Instead many are fixated on the gentle, personable aspect of the Lord. This in itself is not wrong but it is dangerous to know God only in this limited capacity. Human nature dictates that familiarity breeds contempt, we have a remarkable ability to take things for granted and so we tarnish and neglect even the most beautiful of gifts given freely unto us. By knowing God solely and exclusively as a gentle and meek God, we

are prone to become dismissive of Him and use Him as a 'cosmic butler' who will come running to us whenever we bid regardless of how we invest ourselves in Him and our urgency of faith in Him. It is a fast track to placing ourselves above God, a sin after the nature of Satan himself.



We are to study all aspects of God and see how Creation reveals the scale and scope of His power and glory. There is much wisdom to be gained therein as the great minds of science such as Newton, Pasteur, Kepler, Faraday etc all began their studies and investigations on this foundation stone. The wisdom of Solomon was revealed to the world when he spoke on matters of God's Creation (2 Kings 4), and this wisdom was established on a fear or reverence of God, the beginning of wisdom.

Next the daily upkeep of needing to clean the rug provided a keen reflection of our need as believers to come to the Lord daily in prayer and study of His Word so that we might keep our hearts and minds clean of the filth of the world and our sinful flesh (2 Corinthians 7:1, Isaiah 1:16).

Then I saw how the dark colouring of the material that I often sighed over that highlighted every fleck of rubbish was an perfect reminder of how the Holy Ghost works within us to highlight our sinful ways so that we might set about to remove ourselves of them so that we are pleasing to Our Lord God (1Corinthians 6:19).

Finally I reflected on those ingrained marks on the rug, the ones that plagued and remained on the revived pattern. It was an excellent example of how though we are redeemed and gifted a new heart from Christ Jesus so that we are born again in the Spirit, our sinful tendencies of the flesh remain throughout our days so that we contend with them daily (Matthew 26:41, Galatians 5:16-17).

When I considered all these observations and reflections I marvelled at how the Lord had used something so innocuous, something I often derided and bemoaned as a clear proof that yes He can move to speak to a heart even through the most mundane of tasks.

So friend as you set about the less than appealing tasks of the day, do not place your God to the side and subscribe to the notion that communion with Him and glorification of His name cannot be achieved at that time, dismiss it immediately. Seek Him out and ask Him to show you how He desires to share each moment with you and how even in the most unremarkable of tasks we can bring glory to His name.

It is a staggering and beautiful thought that we may not be appointed to lead nations, manage great companies, have the ear of powerful persons or enjoy great wealth, we may see how He moves to show us His love for each of His children in even the most basic of daily tasks. Glory to LORD God in the highest and praise His wondrous name forever. Amen.

I may have missed out of so much not being at home with her for those years when she was really little growing up, but from this with me being back in work and Jonathan being at home, came this - Truth to Wonder Ministries! 

'A Blasphemous Fable and a Dangerous Deceit' – Part 1

In the 1980's the final report of the Anglo Roman Catholic International Commission it stated, 'Communion with Christ in the eucharist presupposes his true presence, effectually signified by the bread and wine which, in the mystery, become his body and blood.' This teaching has no basis in the Scriptures or the formularies of the Church of England. It is still the case today that the battle is based on the real presence, of Christ. The great English Divine, Richard Hooker, wrote: 'The Real Presence of Christ's most blessed body and blood is not therefore to be sought for in the sacrament, but in the worthy receiver of the sacraments.'



When we receive the bread and wine we feed on Christ in our heart by FAITH. The mean whereby the Body of Christ is received and eaten in the supper is faith, not a man's mouth, as the ritualists teach. The Lord has never had more than one body. That body in its glorified condition as it now exists is in heaven only. The natural Body and Blood of our Saviour are in heaven, NOT HERE; it being against the truth of Christ's NATURAL BODY to be at one time in more places than one. If then that Body, the only one our Saviour possesses, is 'NOT HERE' how can it be in the Consecrated Bread and Wine as Rome teaches?

The Gospel of Mark Ch16v6 states, 'he is risen'; 'he is not here', that in itself speaks against a localised real presence on the alter. We may recall to mind the Lord's words in Mt24v 23, 24, 'Then of any man shall say

unto you, lo, here is Christ, or there; believe it not'.

There are many ways to answer the so-called 'Eucharistic Sacrifice', which is considered as true, proper, and propitiatory sacrifice, and not a mere commemoration of the sacrifice once for all offered at Calvary. This doctrine as taught by Rome is not only contrary to the teaching of the Bible but is repugnant to reason too there is a vast difference between a sacrament and a sacrifice: In a sacrament God offers something to man, but in a sacrifice man offers something to God.

Further, what is offered in a sacrifice is either wholly or in part destroyed, but what is offered in a sacrament remains. There is a great difference between them. Indeed we can say if it be a sacrament it is not a sacrifice, and if it be a sacrifice it is not a sacrament, it cannot be both. If it were both Christ offered up Himself before He offered up Himself for He offered up Himself in the sacrament before He offered up Himself on the cross; which offering up Himself in the sacrament was either a perfect or imperfect sacrifice or oblation. To say or suggest that Christ should offer up an imperfect sacrifice to the Father is blasphemy but that sacrifice could not have been perfect if it needs repeating.

In the Mass it is taught that the body of Christ is really offered up to God, because the bread is first turned into the body of Christ; but it can be proved the bread is still bread after, as well as before, consecration, and not the very Body of Christ; though the bread be consecrated by man, the very Body of Christ cannot be offered to God in the sacrament; and therefore, if they still call it a sacrifice, they must acknowledge it is such a sacrifice in which there is nothing but bread and wine offered to God, and consequently there is no proprietary sacrifice. The Bible says, without shedding of blood there is no remission, so when the bread is broken and the wine is poured clearly there is no blood shed and therefore no remission of sins.








Faraday – Man of Science and Man of God


