



What is Tulsa Transition Academy?

Tulsa Transition Academy or TTA is a continuation of school for students who receive special education in high school and meet the criteria to participate. Students can attend after they have graduated from high school until they turn 22. In this program students can learn and practice the valuable skills necessary to become a successful adult.

Who may enroll in Tulsa Transition Academy (TTA)?

TTA is for students who:

- Received special education services while enrolled in high school.
- Participated in the alternate assessment program.
- Identified as needing lifelong support in the areas of learning, independent living, employment, and community participation.
- Graduated from high school.

What will students at Tulsa Transition Academy learn?

The goal of Tulsa Transition Academy is to provide a bridge from high school to adulthood for young adults with significant disabilities. Students will be enrolled in classes that teach:

- Independent Living Skills
- Employment Skills
- Community Living Skills

How will attending Tulsa Transition Academy benefit students?

Students are given the opportunity to practice autonomy, decision making, and self-expression in a safe and supportive environment. They learn valuable social skills such as teamwork and community etiquette. They also learn how to be safe and responsible adults in the community and in the workplace. We encourage students to exercise independence to the greatest extent possible.
