Let's Try Something New! Sharon's 2023 Challenge

What's this all about? After sewing/quilting for years, things can get routine, so let's learn and experiment with lots of different techniques to see what else we can do. I hope you will join in on the fun!

Rules: None! No monthly reports. No rules for size, shape, colors, number of blocks, quilting, stitching, embellishments, etc. Nothing is off-limits. Just have fun experimenting and exploring new techniques, fabrics, threads, stitches..... Let's all provide everyone encouragement to try various things in our sewing and quilting.

Goal-line: Have a finished quilt top by the Holiday Party in December with many different examples included.

Don't know where to start? Refer to February *Patch Dispatch* for a long list of ideas. Brainstorm with your friends and make your own lists. Maybe work together? Learn from one another? Perhaps different ideas can be combined – for instance, create or piece together an unusual shape, embellish it, and then applique' it using a different technique....

Progress Report: (not required)

I do plan to "eat the elephant in little bites" so even though no monthly report is due, I'm hoping to try something new every week or so. To get started, I've chosen my focus fabric and some fat quarters that coordinate. I'm only using stash fabric! March: try different piecing shapes which include curves and some hand-piecing.

I can't wait to see what you are doing. What have you chosen to experiment with this month? Please join in and see what you can discover and share what you've tried during Show & Tell.

"Fabricadabra: Simple Quilts, Complex Fabrics"

Cynthia's quilts have been honored with many awards, including three Best of Shows at the prestigious International Quilt Association, as well as Viewer's Choice at the American Quilter's Society. Her quilt, Piece and Quiet was distinguished as one of the Hundred Best Quilts of the 20th Century.

your experience sewing for Comforters to be an enjoyable one, not a frustrating one. Also, whatever project you are doing, please be considerate of the next person in the chain. If you are piecing a top, please make sure there are no holes in the seams and try to clean up your loose threads. It's not fair to our quilters to have to clean up or repair the tops before they quilt them. I know everyone does what they can and I appreciate all you do for Comforters.

I enjoyed being in the Comforters booth at our quilt show at the Stafford Centre. Several people dropped by to see what we are about. I had a sign that stated: "FROM OUR HEARTS TO YOURS. COMFORTERS of Quilt Guild of Greater Houston invites you to participate in the sharing of quilts. Take a moment to think of someone you know who would be "comforted" by the gift of a quilt. We invite you to take a quilt and give to that person. Please tell us who you plan to give the quilt to and why." We gave 20 quilts to be shared. Recipients of these quilts included people suffering grief from the loss of a loved one, illness, recovering from surgery, a coworker's loss of everything in the tornadoes in Pearland, and to give cheer to someone moving into a nursing home.

People were so grateful. There were a few tears involved in accepting some of the quilts. Hearts were touched. Mission accomplished.







New exhibitors feature Redwork, Prizewinning Work, and Hand Work!

Beginning on January 5 and running through April 29, are Red Work: The Collection of Rosie deLeon-McCrady (sponsored by the Lucille Gaebler Klein Fund); Places: A Celebration of the Human Hand...Works by Marilyn Henrion; and International Quilt Festival Prizewinners 2022.

Red Work: The Collection of Rosie deLeon-McCrady will feature 41 items including quilts, table runners, towels, and pillows. According to Museum Curator Vicki Mangum, Redwork embroidery became popular in the 1800's when the dyeing process for Turkey Red Thread developed with colorfast techniques.

Rosie deLeon-McCrady fell in love with the technique early on and began collecting antique and modern versions of the Redwork embroidery found in quilts. You will see quilts completed in the last quarter of the 19th century as well as her most recently designed and quilted quilt from 2022. We will also have several of Rosie's Redwork patterns/designs for sale in the TQM store.

The quilts are all outstanding regardless of their size."

Places: A Celebration of the Human Hand...Works by Marilyn

Henrion will feature 37 quilts from the now 90-year-old quilt artist who just relocated to Texas. She has seen many fascinating locations and recorded the sights in photographs which are stitched into works of art. You will be enthralled by what she has seen and what she has stitched. "My aesthetic vision had always been deeply rooted in the urban geometry of my surroundings, from the earlier geometric abstractions to the more recent mixed media works," Henrion offers.

"Whether at home or in my travels, I have been particularly interested in the co-existence of past and present, primarily in architecture and other man-made structures. The presence of the human hand upon the landscape expresses our eternal yearning for immortality, evidence that says 'I was once here."
