Jane Sassaman Title: "Jane's Textile Treasure Garden"





Folk art applique flowers inspired Peppermint Pinwheel quilt is perfect for a spring or summer project. The question one might ask is, is it possible to make a pieced block with curved flower petals without any patterns or templates. The answer is, yes!

This class is designed to focus on cutting multiple curves through layers of fabrics and sew the pieces into Free Form flower blocks. It is easy and fast. Participants will follow instructions from the book, *Cultural Fusion Quilts*, and construct blocks resembling large appliqued flowers with appliqued centers.

Sujata will share many tips on making free-form blocks and offer many suggestions for color combinations and layouts during the class. You may not stop just at just one.



Due to scheduling conflicts, the guild will only have one Charity Quilt Day this year. It is scheduled for Saturday, July 27 from 9 am to 2:30 pm at Trini Mendenhall Sosa Community Center at 1414 Wirt Road.

The quilt pattern I plan to use for the day requires a complete Layer Cake or 20 - 10" squares of coordinating fabric. In 1989 my daughter was a member of the Spring Branch I.S.D. Future Farmers of America. I became the Booster Club President and found that the FFA group was minimally supported by the parents. I wanted to do something to increase interest in the Booster Club (now called the more elite name of the Alumni Association).

THE QUILTING IDEA IS BORN

The idea of making a quilt as a group, sitting around a quilting frame and stitching and talking and becoming friends — that appealed to me. So I measured my bed and figured how many blocks were needed to fill the space. Then I cut the blocks of muslin and marked the top. At the next meeting, I slapped that graph paper plan up on the wall and announced "WE'RE GONNA MAKE A QUILT!!"

Actually, I had never made a quilt! But how hard could that be? Now after 33 years, I know how hard that can be!

We got started. Everyone could design their block with a farm theme. The blocks began coming back to me and we were already becoming friends. We learned that the strips of fabric between the blocks are called sashing. We assembled all the blocks and sashing and added batting and backing and right before our eyes, there was our first quilt from The Quilting Idea.

In the absence of a quilting frame, we made one. Two wooden horses and two 2x4s. Each 2x4 was bolted to the horse. As we stitched and rolled the quilt forward, the bolt didn't always fit the hole. No problem for us - we just drilled another hole. Our handy drill was right there. We stitched and laughed so much and told the most outlandish stories you could ever imagine. There were wood shavings on the floor and quilters came all hours of the day and night.

At the 1989 FFA Auction, The Quitting Idea earned \$4,200 as it was purchased by the CEO of Tenneco Corp. A quilt has been made and auctioned every year since.

SUNSHINE AND SHADOWS

We started The Quilting Idea Scholarship with our earnings from our first quilt - \$4200.00

This year on February 10, 2024 the Quilt was called A Texas Broken Star and my nervous system was nearly broken by the time I got it finished. It auctioned at the Spring Branch ISD Future Farmers of America Sale for an astonishing \$10,000.00.



Thank you to those of you who continue to contribute to Comforters by piecing tops, quilting, binding, and donating supplies. I have no thank you letters to share this month but be assured that our quilts are greatly appreciated, sometimes in ways that we will never know.

One of the places to whom I donate quilts is CCSC (Christian Community Service Center). I recently received a 2023 Impact Report from them. I would like to share some of their info. "CCSC is a community-based nonprofit organization serving central and southwest Houston. The coalition of 39 churches, volunteers, and donors unite in the mission to serve the poor, hungry, disabled, and otherwise needy while respecting their religious, ethnic, or cultural differences. CCSC was created out of faith and founded in the belief that we are called to help all God's children heart to heart and hand in hand." The services provided by CCSC include helping with Basic Needs, Workforce Development, and Youth Services. The Youth Services supports the needs of vulnerable children and their families and includes "Back to School" promoting academic readiness and "Jingle Bell Express" addressing play, literacy, and hunger.

Some of our quilts have found their way into "Back To School" backpacks and under the tree at Jingle Bell Express.

CCSC is always very appreciative of our quilts when I stop by the office to drop them off.

Let me introduce you to Wild Apricot. It is a cloud-based software that will enable us to automate many membership tasks. We will no longer need the unsupported Access software we have been using.

We will no longer need to password-protect our files because with Wild Apricot we get a member-only section on our website! Each member will have a unique password and if you forget it, click on "forgot password" and you will be emailed a link to create a new password.

Wild Apricot will **automatically send reminders** about meetings, workshops, and other events. You will be able to opt out of these emails if so desired.

The member directory is online, on a protected website page. It is searchable. Meaning if you know who you are looking for, you may enter the name in the search box and go right there. **Each member has the ability to control their own privacy level**. You may choose what information others may see in the directory.

To reach this point, there will be a lot of work going on. Switching the website from GoDaddy to Wild Apricot will take a little bit of work. Getting our info off the GoDaddy website will take time.

We want to make sure we have everything we need on Wild Apricot before leaving GoDaddy and GroupWorks. The transition should be seamless for members, but we may be running both systems, till we are sure everything is in place.






