




QGGH at the George Ranch Historical Park


QGGH Quilt Show, The Stafford Centre, January 27-28, 2023

George Ranch Historical Park



Renovations are underway at the 1860s Ryon Prairie Home and QGGH has been asked to make a queen sized quilt with a pinwheel pattern for a bedroom.

THANK YOU to all who took kits to make these pinwheel blocks.





Even though the blocks are simple, there are a couple of places where it is easy to put together backwards. These directions (also available on the QGGH website) and the photo at left will assist you.

This photo will help you arrange your half-square triangle units correctly. PLEASE do NOT trim your blocks, I will take care of that. You may turn in the blocks at either Friday meeting, workshop, etc. in June or July.

PINWHEEL BLOCK SEWING INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Press fabric if needed. Pin 1 light square and 1 dark square, Right Sides Together (RST).
 - 2. Sew ON the drawn pencil lines.
- Cut from corner to corner inside the drawn lines.
 Press to the dark side to create a half square triangle unit (HST).
- REPEAT for each pair of dark and light fabrics.
- Arrange HST to create image at bottom.
- 7. Nest seams and sew together like a 4 Patch block.
- 8. DO NOT TRIM







Endowment Applications

Ruth Manny endowments@qgghouston.org

Each year the QGGH sets aside money for its endowment program.

The endowment provides money (up to \$300) to support projects by its members that "enhance, encourage or advance the art of quilting through continuing education for guild members and others in our community."

These awards are made to members of the QGGH through a competitive application process.

Applications are accepted twice a year: March 1 and September 1, with awards given in May and November.



A Rhapsody, a Menagerie, and some Top Winners! May 12-September 18, 2022 will be Ricky Tims: A Rhapsody of Quilts, Timna Tarr's Noble Menagerie, and Quilt Festival Prizewinners 2021.



Bohemian Rhapsody (90" x 90") by Ricky Tims. Photo by Gregory Case In **Gallery III**, Ricky Tims: A Rhapsody of Quilts presents 11 pieces highly regarded as excellent examples of contemporary quilt art with traditional appeal. Tims is also a renowned musician, and many of his quilts have musical references. As he was working on Bohemian Rhapsody using hand-dyed fabrics, the composition developed with a very Eastern European flare. The rhythmic movement and harmonious shapes in this quilt encouraged the artist to design and make an entire series of Rhapsody Quilts, which resulted in his book of the same title.

Gallery II will showcase 12 works in Timna Tarr's Noble Menagerie. Tarr, who resides in Massachusetts, comes from a long line of quilters if after studying art history in college

but did not begin quilting until after studying art history in college.

Her own work is chiefly about color, in relatively small-format compositions. What keeps her engaged is watching how her projects change and transform with the addition of each color and texture.

Noble Menagerie began as a way for Tarr to explore making quasi-realistic fabric portraits of farm animals. Moving through the series, she realized that the images highlight the dignity and individual personalities in each animal, reflected in her highly original titles. The construction process starts with a blown-up photograph and ends with her piecing together the eye. Tarr explains that she needs to get to know each animal before tackling "the window to the soul."




