


#### **Quilters Needed for Comforters**

I think several members (old and new) are a little confused about "Comforters" and the "Comforters Bee". I will try to explain and if you still have questions, please feel free to ask me to clarify further.

"Comforters" is an official standing committee in the guild and I am the coordinator. I have a budget and my purpose is to "facilitate members' participation in assembling and distribution of quilts to various charitable organizations."

To do this, kits are provided for piecing tops, quilting, and/or binding. Members may also do their own thing and donate tops or completed tops to Comforters. Comforters gives to organizations throughout the year and can use any size quilt from infant to adult sizes.

Some members give quilts directly to an organization and record with me the number of quilts they have donated as well as the organization and the time (volunteer hours) spent making the quilt.

The "Comforter Bee" is a bee or group whose sole purpose is to support the Comforter cause. Anyone can be a member. The group is coordinated by **Sheila Glover** and **Marsha Hennigan** and meets once a month after the morning meeting at Congregation Brith Shalom. Gatherings may include lunch, show & tell, and gathering of materials for their next projects. Please

www.houstonjoyofquilts.com. Registration forms can be submitted at any time up until December 16.

You DO NOT need to wait until the last minute! Quilts do not have to be finished in order to submit an entry form. It does need to be in progress far enough that you know what the final measurements will be and can submit a photo of the quilt (or part of it) so that the finished item can be recognized from the photo.

The November meetings will be the best place to take care of many things on your "to do" list.

#### **Anniversary Fabric Challenge**

If you have made a quilt or other item that you would like to have JUDGED, the process for entering it is the SAME as any other JUDGED item, The entry form is due no later than December 16, and the item must be turned in at Westbury Methodist Church on Monday, January 23. The Curator along with the Show Chair, will make the final decisions as to where these entries will be hung/displayed depending on space available.

If you are participating in the Anniversary Challenge only and making an item just for display (and possible fun awards!), they can be turned in at any time prior to the show. PLEASE be sure that all items are labelled with your name, and we are still asking they be accompanied by an Entry form so we can keep track of them and be sure they are returned properly. If they are not turned in by our December 13 Holiday Party, we will need the form by December 16<sup>th</sup>. At the very latest these items must be turned in at the meeting the evening of January 17<sup>th</sup>.

Yippee! This year we have two County buses for Quilt Festival on Thursday, November 3 and Friday, November 4, 2022.

The buses are scheduled to leave Memorial Drive Presbyterian Church at 9:00 AM and scheduled to leave the George R Brown Convention Center at 7:15 PM both days. Yes, we will park and leave from Memorial Drive Presbyterian Church. Please

park near the brown painted MDPC Scout House near the Memorial Drive (westside), Parking Lot C. LTQ Volunteers – Please remember to get your volunteer badge as soon as you get in the Convention Center. Show your badge and you don't have to wait in the long lines to get into the Show.

If you volunteer any day Wednesday through Sunday at the QGGH Learn-To-Quilt Booth, you get to ride free. If you're not volunteering at the LTQ Booth, then it's only \$3 round trip. You don't have to be a QGGH member to ride the bus, but you do have to be 50 years old or older (Harris County rule). This is a great deal because you don't have to fight the downtown traffic and the bus will drop you off and pick you up across the street at the hotel. Take the elevator, stairs, or escalator up to Convention Center. IF YOU LEAVE EARLY PLEASE TEXT ME (713-885-1887), so we don't worry about you.

Bus sign-up sheets will be available at the September and October morning and night meetings at the LTQ volunteer sign-up table. If you sign up for the bus, then have to cancel, please let me know.

It is time to thank and show our appreciation to our Guild President *Meg Raatz*. Meg has served on the board for four years, volunteering to chair numerous board positions as well as volunteering when a volunteer was needed.

Each year we ask the membership to make a special block, chosen by the President, to present to her at the annual Holiday Party. Meg has chosen a house block from the VILLAGE pattern. The pattern can be found on the Fat Quarter Shop website as a free download. Also, on the website qgghouston.org. The block measures 5 1/2" x 7" unfinished. The only fabric requirement Meg has requested is that we use a true white

solid fabric for the background. Please sign your name on the completed block.

Please go to the workshop table to collect the instructions for creating the block.
